## A Day in Old Lincoln Town will be fun for everyone

Sunday, August 4 in Old Lincoln Town, New Mexico, will be a relaxing and fun sort of day that people of all ages, from all sections of the country, should enjoy. There is really only one time schedule for the day and that is the starting time, 10:00 a.m. when contestants for the Old Fiddlers Contest start to register. The contest will start shortly after drawing for positions in the contest. Winners will receive engraved plaques.

Each fiddler will be introduced and play one fast number (breakdown or hoedown), and one slow number (waltz or whatever). No amplifiers will be used for this contest, only for announcements. The fiddlers' contest is expected to fill most of the morning, what with introductions of old timers in the audience from time to time. Mr. W. G. Shrecengost will MC the morning program.

The parade at Old Lincoln is scheduled to start at 1:30 p.m. The parade committee invites any person or persons who want to enter this parade to come to Lincoln and enjoy the fun. The afternoon pageant performance starts at 3:00 p.m. There will be dancing and music at the pageant grounds before the evening performance of "The Last Escape of Billy the Kid."

## Old West revives for Billy's famous Escape

Lincoln, New Mexico in the heart of New Mexico's cattle country will re-create the Old West this weekend when the historical pageant "The Last Escape of Billy the Kid" is staged Saturday and Sunday, August 3-4. Lincoln County first won fame through infamy. It was the scene of one of the nation's bloodiest local wars. The folk pageant centers around the life of the legendary outlaw, Billy the Kid, and presents scenes based on facts of the Lincoln War. From the killing of John Tunstall which precipitated Billy's wrathful vengeance, to the Battle of Blazer's Mill where Buckshot Roberts stood off Billy and twelve cohorts, to the siege of the McSween House, to Billy's famous last escape this pageant portrays Lincoln County history the way it happened. Starting at the pageant grounds, Lincoln is very much a mile-long museum of architecture and history. On US 380

between Capitan and Hondo the one main street is lined with business establishments or private residences of 1870 vintage in their original state or restored. Most of the historic sites have markers giving their history. Artist Walter Henn of Old Lincoln Town has compiled a "Walking Tour of Old Lincoln Town" which consists of a series of nineteen sketches of the most important historic buildings with a few notes about each. When you are in Lincoln this week end you will enjoy taking this tour. Start with the courthouse where Billy made his escape, the community church also known as the Convento, Zamora House built by James Dolan in 1888, Iglesia De San Juan El Bautista for years the largest church in Lincoln County, Priest's House probably erected by "Squire" Wilson in 1860's, Montano Store which once housed

## Officials to look at new PO site



Four buildings, none being used, will come down if new post office site is selected.

A document recorded April 15, 1952 in the Lincoln County courthouse which covers the area of Carrizozo between 5th and 6th Streets on East Avenue, first chosen as location for new post office in Carrizozo has paragraph which reads as follows:

(a) Land use and building type -- No lot shall be used except for residential purposes. On discovery of this clause the real estate department of the post office agency asked Johnson Stearns, mayor of Carrizozo, if the site available in April could be made available again.

Mr. Stearns, acting as free agent, has taken options on parcels of land in Block 21 between 12th Street and Railroad Avenue and W. W. Churchill, national real estate officer for the PO department, and Lawrence T. Abraham, contractor, will be in Carrizozo Monday to look over the new site.

This site will occupy Lots 10-17 and 17-22 owned by Petty, Reil, Sifton, Zamora and Fulmer. Several old buildings on the grounds would be torn down and a clear piece of land under one owner would be offered to the PO department.

A contract for construction has been awarded to Lawrence T. Abraham Construction Co. of Santa Fe to build the new post office and lease it to the post office department for ten years with renewal options running through 20 years at an annual rental of \$11,847 for the basic term.

The new one story building will be air conditioned and will have an interior space of 5,566 square feet, compared with a total of 2,295 square feet for the present building. The area for parking and movement of vehicles totals 25,617. The post office is expected to be completed March 1, 1969.

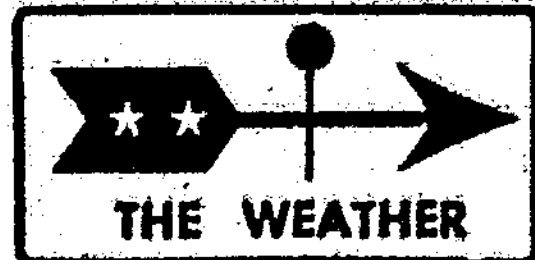

Ike Stockton's saloon, Ellis Store one of the first dwellings in the area, Luna House an early Spanish type.

Then you come to Mrs. Wrights part of which was built for Col. Fountain, the Torreon possibly the best known of all, the Caravajal House on site of red light district of Old Lincoln, Tunstall Store a gathering place for Tunstall-McSween forces, Fresquez House built in 1800's, Watson House also drug store and office for Dr. Watson, Dr. Wood's Annex rumored to have housed newspaper office operated by Guy Kibbee's father, Blanchard House which has recessed porch and unusual roof, Wortley Hotel where Bob Olinger was eating when he walked to his death in the street in front of courthouse, and last the Las Paloma Bar used as dance hall, bar, post-office and early billiard hall.

Billy the Kid, who real name

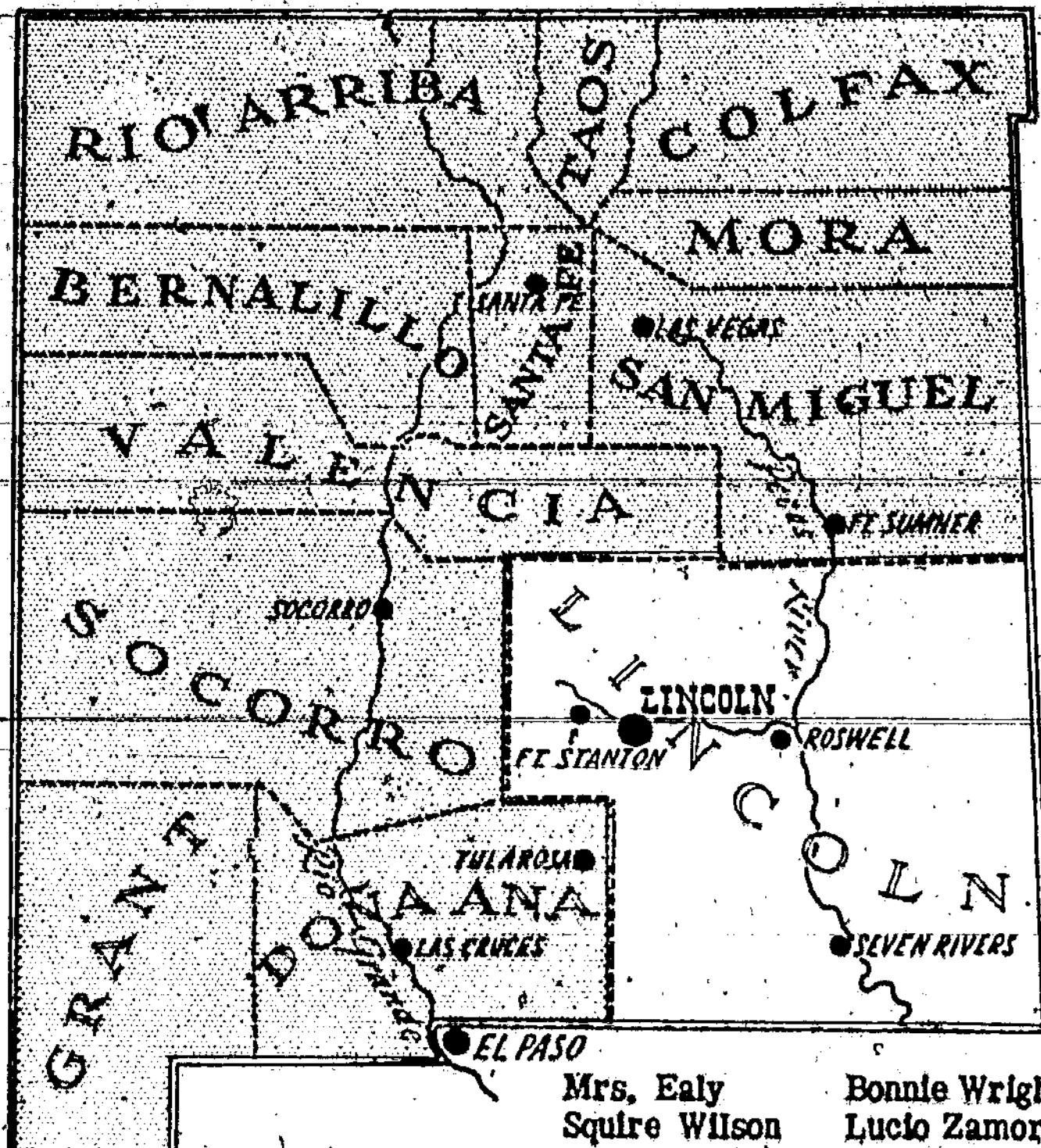
was William H. Bonney, represented one faction in the Lincoln County War. He was born Saturday, 3:00 and 8:30 p.m. Sunday, The Day In Old Lincoln Town event is Sunday starting at in New York and killed his first man at the age of 12 in the mining camp around Silver City, New Mexico. He arrived in Lincoln at 18 with a long list of murder victims behind him -- so the story goes.

During the Lincoln War a sheriff was killed and Bonney was blamed. He eluded capture for a while, and when he was caught feeling ran so high that he was taken to Mesilla, near the Mexican border, for trial.

Convicted and sentenced to hang, he was returned to Lincoln to await execution. On April 28, 1881 while shackled and heavily guarded, he killed the jailer and Bob Olinger the guard he hated and escaped on horseback down the Bonito Valley.

Less than three months later Billy the Kid was shot and killed by Sheriff Pat Garret, the shooting taking place at Fort Sumner where Billy is buried.

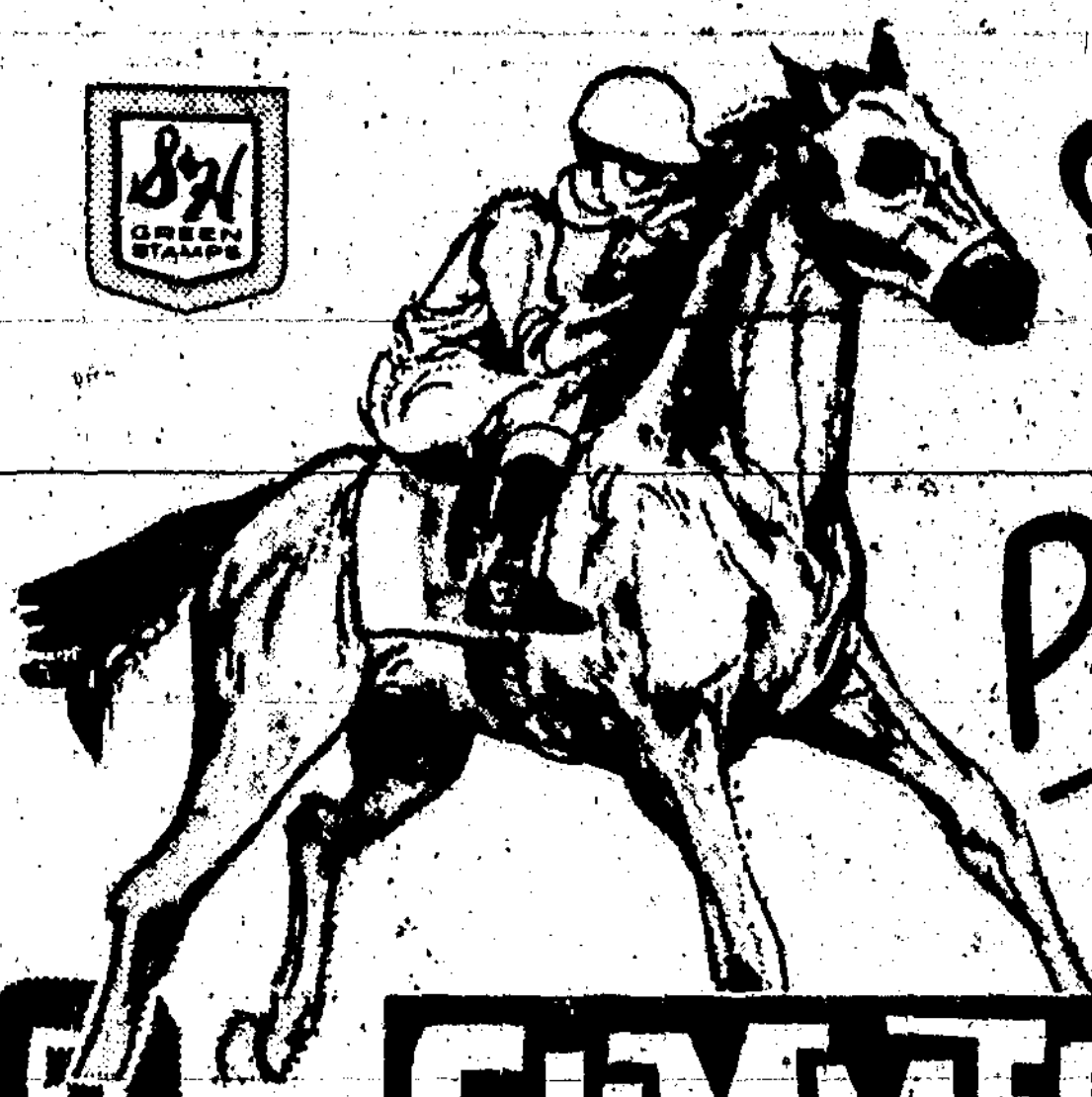

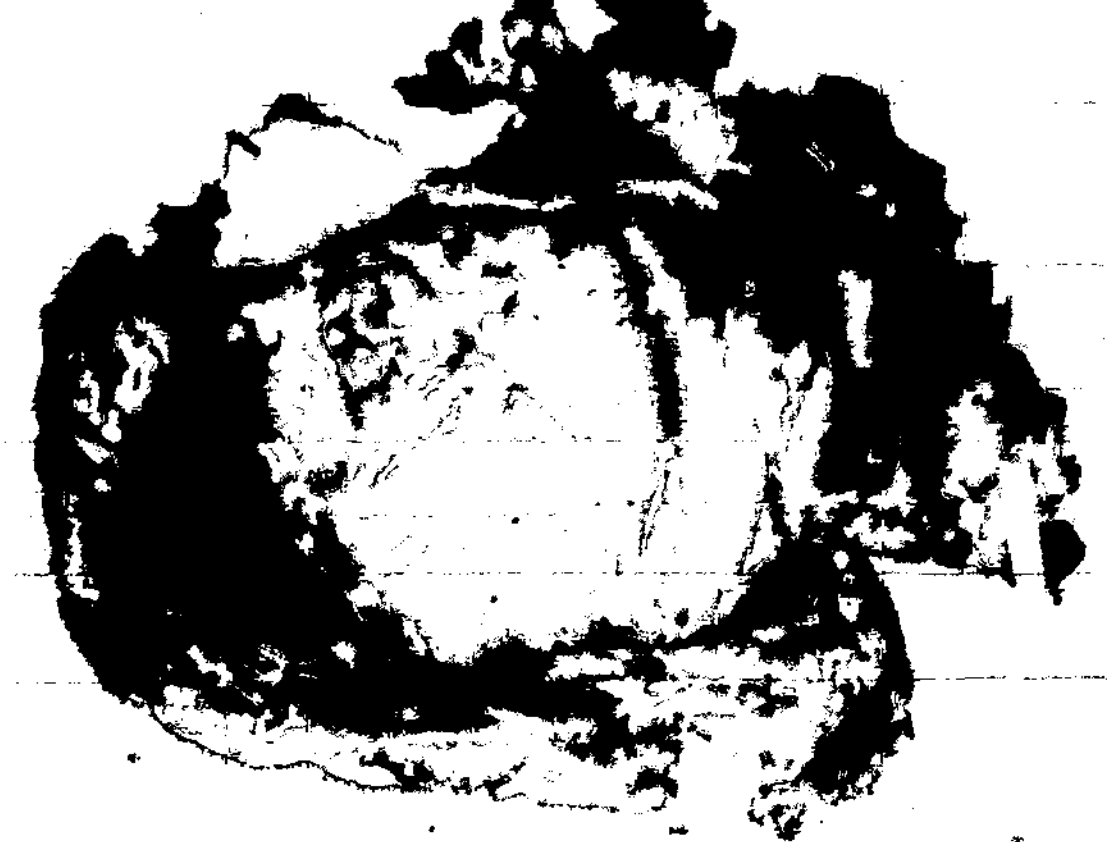

### Babers appointed to FHA committee

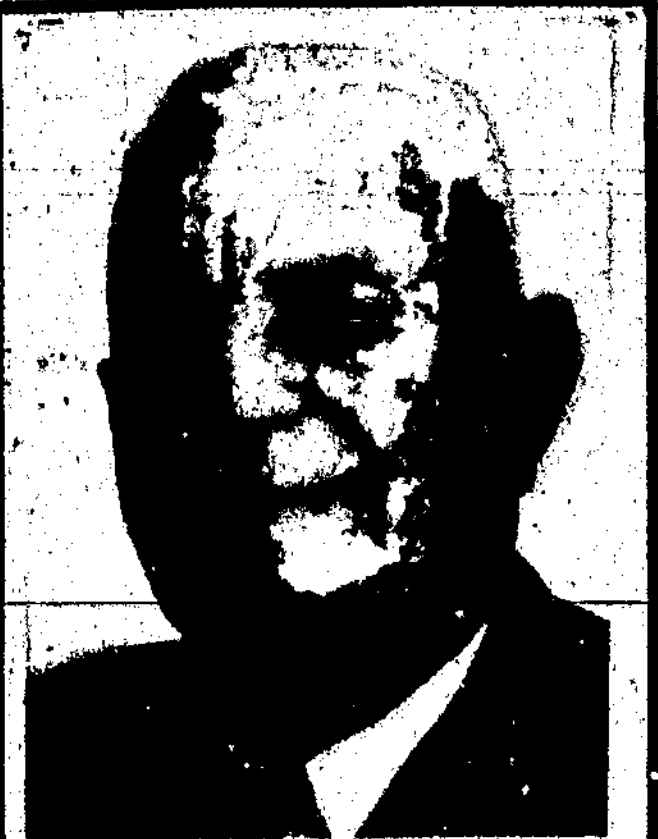

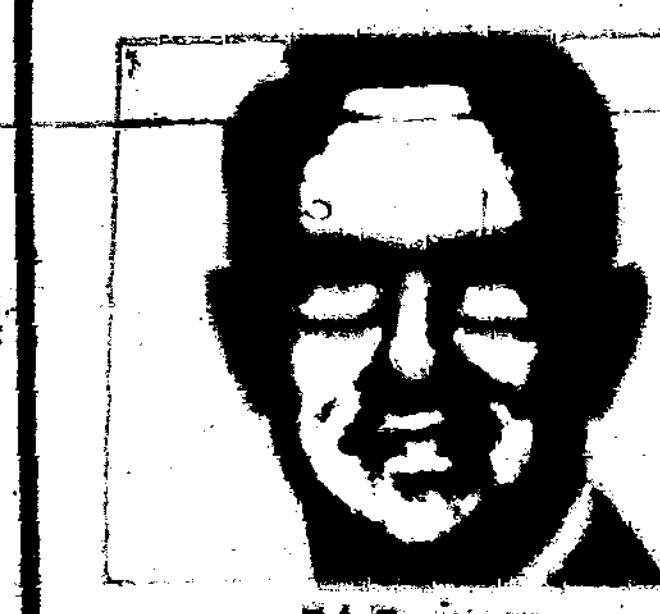
