## Lots of horse action June 29 weekend

The best of New Mexico quarter horses are expected in the Carrizozo area the weekend of June 29-30 for two ACHA approved shows and a Greater New Mexico Cutting Horse contest the same weekend.

A hundred and fifty or more entries are expected at the show, the first to be held in the Joe Sargent arena at Carrizozo on June 29 starting at 8:30 a.m. This show has the normal run of events for quarter horses plus some that are not so common.

There will be a class for amateur western pleasure (all ages) with non-professional riders, this event intended to encourage amateur riders. An event seldom seen in this state is the trail horse class and there will be such a class at the Carrizozo show, for all ages. American Quarter Horse Ass'n. rules apply to all classes. Entries close at 8:00 a.m., judge will be Jack Streun, lunch will be served by Corona Maverick 4-H Club.

A trophy halter will be awarded to 1st place winners, in both halter and performance classes, ribbons awarded through 6th place. In the performance classes money paid will be 40-30-20-10 percent.

On Saturday night, June 29, there will be a cutting horse contest put on by the Greater New Mexico Cutting Horse Ass'n in the Malpais Arena eleven miles north and nine west of Carrizozo. There will be four classes, novice-novice, novice,

open and youth. The entry fee is \$16.00, judge will be Fern Dunn of Nogal. The contest is open to members of the Greater New Mexico Cutting Ass'n. The contest starts at 8:00 p.m. in the indoor arena.

The annual Malpais Live-stock Quarter Horse Show will be held June 30 starting at 8:30 a.m. in the indoor arena at the ranch headquarters northwest of Carrizozo. Bill Cowan of McNeal, Arizona will be the judge. This show is approved by the Ameri-


can Quarter Horse Ass'n and New Mexico Quarter Horse Association.

Entry fees are \$5 for each event. Halters will be awarded to 1st place winner, ribbons through 6th place. The Ancho Junior Rancher 4-H Club will serve lunch.

In the performance classes four places will be paid. Only American Quarter Horse Ass'n. rules will prevail.

## Red Cross helps 4-H swimmers

Three years ago Lincoln County 4-H clubs organized a swimming program under supervision of Red Cross and this year 30 youngsters are taking part in the seven phases of the program: beginner, advanced beginner, intermediate, swimmer, advanced, junior lifesaving and senior lifesaving.

The 4-H'ers have classes and swim Tuesday of each week, one hour of water safety instruction which includes "How to take care of yourself in the water, how to prevent water accidents and how to help in water accidents", and one hour of learning correct swimming strokes.

The Red Cross trains as many as 122,600 authorized volunteer swimming instructors, and 2,710,500 certificates were issued last year. Red Cross instructors taught 204,700 classes of swimming.

Marion Spencer is in charge of the Lincoln County Red Cross program. Nancy Knight and Margaret are assisting with instruction of the 4-H club members.

## Fire Chief Advises "Caution"

Chief of Carrizozo Volunteer Fire Department Ziggy Lessau made a request today that any person wanting to burn a patch of weeds please call the Fire Department (643-2261) before starting the fire.

The entire countryside is dry, ground cover on vacant lots around town are dry as well as covered with highly combustible refuse, and the safest thing to do is have the fire department on hand before any weed burning starts.

The department has made three runs in the past week, one to put out boxcar on fire at the railway, Monday noon fire at Ray Wells home where Mrs. Wells was burning weeds, Tuesday noon grass fire three miles south of town where hotbox on rail car had started fire.

## UNUSUAL GRASS FIRE AT BLACK HILLS RANCH

Two bolts of lightning set separate fires on the Black Hills Ranch about 18 miles northwest of Carrizozo Thursday about noon. Aided by strong gusty winds the fire burned an estimated 340 acres of federal land, part of the ranch operated by the Gallacher family.

The fires were set off on ridge near Taylor Well. One oddity was the way high winds made the fire undercut tall grass on ridges so that by the time the grass toppled over the flames had passed on.

**STAMPEDE NAMED FOR SMOKEY** — In 1950 a tiny bear cub was found after bad fire which destroyed 17,000 acres of timber land north of Capitan Mountains. This bear was naturally named "Smokey" and has become a symbol for fire prevention over much of the world. Smokey Bear Stampede got its name from the tiny cub, and this stampede has become known over the southwest as the finest in rodeo entertainment on July 3-4 in Capitan, New Mexico.



**Queen reigns over celebration**

Lincoln County is preparing for the annual Smokey Bear Stampede to be held July 3-4 at the fair grounds in Capitan, the stampede being a memorable occasion for many people.

We have had some lovely rodeo queens in the past years and again this year, we of the fair board, ask our Lincoln County girls to please enter the rodeo queen contest.

The contest rules specify unwed girls between the ages of 16 and 21 years, and a resident of Lincoln County.

The girls must be sponsored by an organization or club, the entire fee being \$10.00 for each contestant.

Contestants must be dressed in white shirts, black ties, men style Levi jeans, white hats and cowboy boots of their color choice.




