## Flu hits Capitan school

With 30 students out of school Monday in the upper six grades and more absent in the lower grades, activities during the holiday period depend much on how many students are available. The Capitan band is scheduled to go to Fort Stanton Thursday to entertain the students, if enough band members are available at that time. A Christmas program is scheduled for Friday at 1:15 for the entire school but the exact programming may have to be changed some -- because of the flu.

Capitan basketball team is entered in the holiday tournament at Cloudcroft December 20, but four of the team were sick Monday, so this participation is not certain. Coach Neal Borgman's wrestlers have a match with Carlsbad 9th-10th wrestlers on December 2 -- probably seven matches if that many wrestlers are available. There will be some exhibition matches also. Capitan school will turn out for holidays following the Friday program.

## Early school board lineup

All Lincoln County schools will have elections of board members on February 4, 1969, and the final date for candidates to file is January 6 in Carrizozo and Capitan, Corona candidates have until January 3 to file.

At Corona the terms of John D. Holleyman, John Nalda and A. W. Gnatkowski expire. George McBride is the only holdover member at Capitan.

In Carrizozo the terms of Ray Wells, Randall Greer and Bob Shafer have expired. Shafer will not be a candidate for reelection. Both Wells and Greer have stated they will run for reelection. Two early candidates for the third position are Johnny Johnson and Ziggy Lessau.

## BLM refuses to sell land

State Parks and Recreation Commissioner James Dillard said Saturday he had received a second rejection of a New Mexico request to purchase 640 acres of land for a park at Fort Stanton.

Dillard said the application was turned down formally by the BLM Dec. 3, but word of the decision did not reach the commission office in Santa Fe until Saturday.

Dillard said the BLM's reason for the latest rejection was that it plans to start construction in 1970 of its own recreation area developing the Fort Stanton caves.

"What bothers me," Dillard said, "is how BLM, a division of the (Department of the) Interior, can afford to do this. The Interior Department doesn't even have money to keep Carlsbad and the 10 national monuments in New Mexico open seven days a week."

"We wouldn't think of shutting down since we have over four million visitors a year visiting our state parks," he said.

## Robbers enjoy hotdogs

Some time after 9:10 p.m. on Sunday two or more robbers knocked out a window glass in the Capitan School cafeteria, made entrance and searched the place good for money. Not finding any money they decided to do the next best thing -- cook up some hot dogs, open a can of tuna, and make out a meal, the pan was left on the stove for the cooks the next day.

Either before or after this excursion the same crew broke glass in south door of main building and entered, by breaking glass in Principal Jack

Mayfield's office then opened this door and searched the place good for money.

Capitan school people do not keep money at school, so none was found. In their search they pried open a filing cabinet, opened others with keys found in the open vault-storage room.

Mayfield said no school records were messed up. The lock on garage door was broken but nothing lost in that area. Officers Darrel Austin and Warren Hanson made the investigation, getting good sets of fingerprints.



J. P. Aguilar got the kind of lesson that makes people take keys out of their car for a long, long time. His vehicle was stolen Thursday afternoon at Tucuman, the police located it Sunday in Ashland, Kentucky, apparently in running condition -- keys still in it.

A Capitan landmark, the old Peters building, is coming down but not easy. This building on Capitan main street was constructed of adobe many years ago, after the Tinsworth store burned down. P. G. (named Proctor after Proctor & Gamble) Peters first put in a store at Nogal, later owned a store and considerable land at Angus, then built the store in Capitan that bears his name. The big cistern near the store used to furnish water for the town, now the adobes will be pushed in the cistern as they come down. It was told that Peters said he inherited \$100,000 three times in his life from the Gould estate. The store served many purposes during its lifetime, more recently a storehouse for Dean Hardware, the present owner.

"Camote" (Spanish for sweet potato) is a cute little brown dog who spends much of his time in front of Corona village hall -- it wasn't his home at start. Gertrude Allen, village clerk, let the dog into her pickup one cold day a year ago, and Camote adopted her. Every once in a while he'd be gone a few days but would come wagging back. 

This is not meant as a letter to the editor. I simply want to share my excitement with you, over the picture (the smallest one) in the front page of last week's Lincoln County News. Before reading the names of persons in newspaper pictures, I try to identify them. I did the same with the picture mention

above. I thought I know this man, especially after seeing the picture with my magnifying glass. Of course, I could be wrong.

Mrs. Payton, I don't remember of there being an Adams Hotel in Carrizozo, but I do remember that a Joe Adams in Carrizozo was a gambler and good friend of a Mr. Carnahan that used to spend a lot of time at a boot-legger's home. The boot-legger and Mr. Carnahan, Mr. Adams, and other gambled there and drank a lot, especially Mr. Carnahan. His friends must have liked him, cause they lied to reveal his whereabouts, sometimes because he was in a drunken stupor and at other times, I don't know why. Once when the sheriff went to ask for him, the bootlegger's wife told him that she didn't know where he'd gone or if he'd ever come back. She did know that her husband and Mr. Carnahan had left the house with Mr. Adams and another man that had come after them.

In taking a look through the last edition of the NEWS (which I always enjoy very much) I note that in the tearing down of the old Adams Hotel there was found a very old rifle shell. May I make comment on this?

The marking .25-35 W.C.F. W.R.A. break down to the following: .25 is the number of thousands of an inch of the bore diameter across the grooves. The 35 is the capacity of the old case in grains of powder. W.C.F. alludes to Winchester Repeating Arms Company.

The old shell was chambered to fit the model 1894 carbine or saddle gun so common about forty years ago. It was used later in the long barrel (octagon shaped) rifle model and still later in the model 64 deer rifle sold up to very recently. The shell is still very much with us, though losing favor to the higher power calibres. You can buy it at your local stores as the .25-35 calibre and then stamped to identify the manufacturer say, Rem-Union or Western etc.
