





Over 1000 people receive social security benefits

There are over 1,000 people in Lincoln County who received monthly Social Security benefits according to Bob Noble, Jr., Social Security Field Representative from Lincoln County.

Many of these people are already past 65 years of age but have never enrolled in the insurance program under Medicare. "However, a newgeneral enrollment period for this insurance will begin on January 1, 1969," Noble said. This enrollment period will last until March 31, 1969, and is especially for those people' who did not enroll before

To supplement it's Academic Program, the Hondo School offers essential student Personnel Service, including Mental Health Services, academic advising and Program Planning, testing, counseling and guidance, and consultation in many areas. 


