A light infestation of range caterpillars have been found in the area west of Ancho. They extend into Socorro County and are found in the Largo Canyon. This is an entirely new area. The worms average about one to every ten square yards and are not damaging the range land now. One rancher reported that they had been there for three years but had not increased much. The Lincoln County Fair is over but there is still the State Fair and the Eastern New Mexico State Fair in Roswell to go. There were several last minute changes and some of them helped the fair participation. All the beef cattle were shown on Friday and the sheep on Saturday. 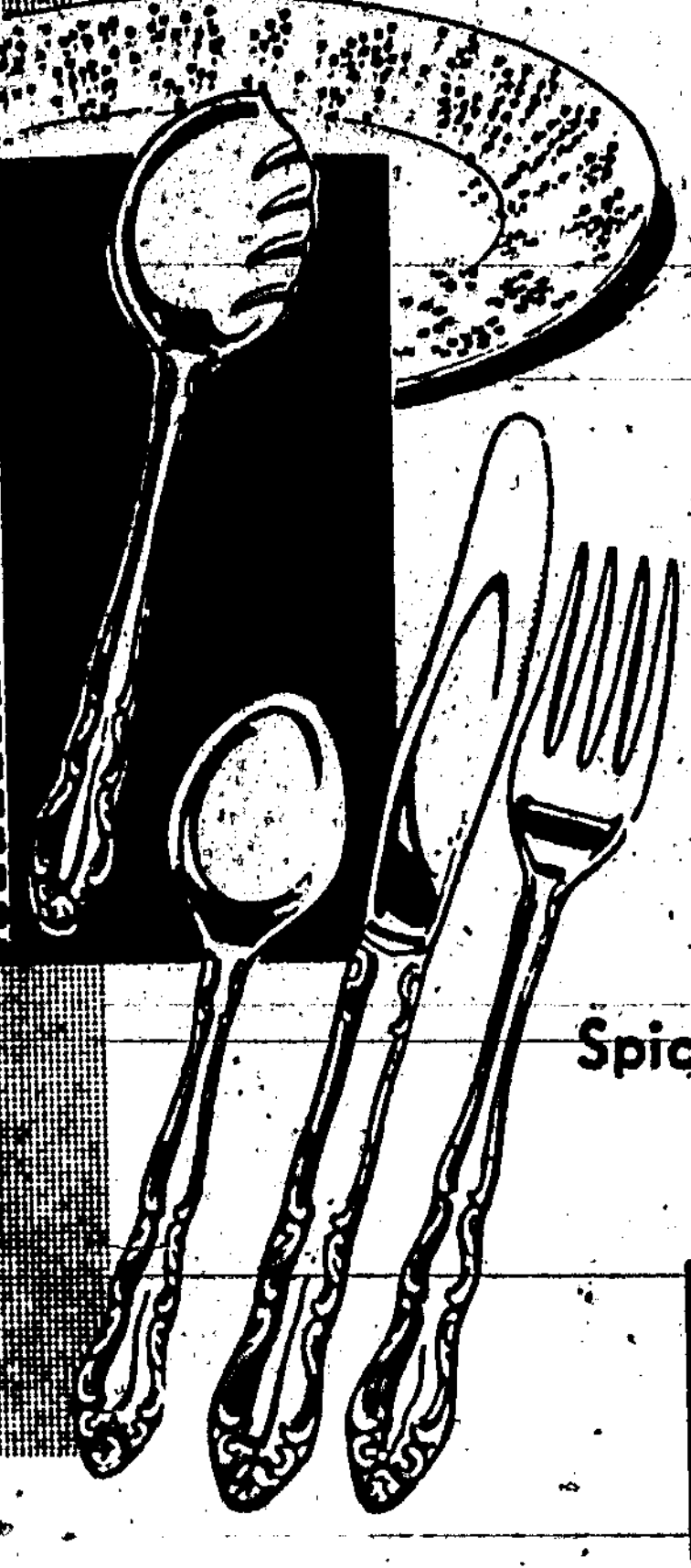

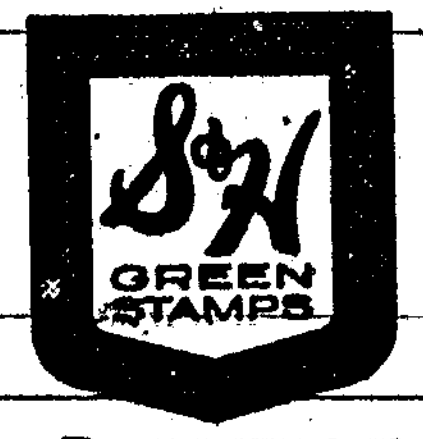

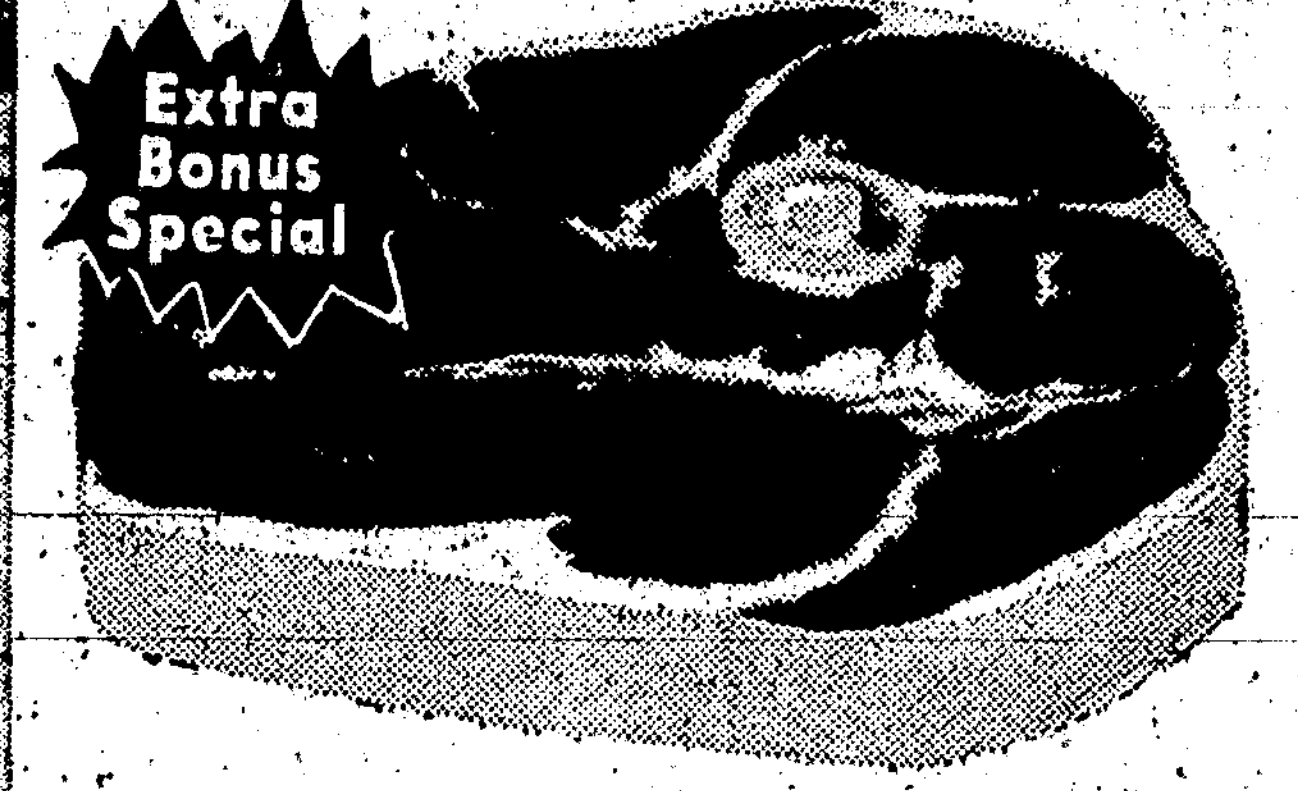
