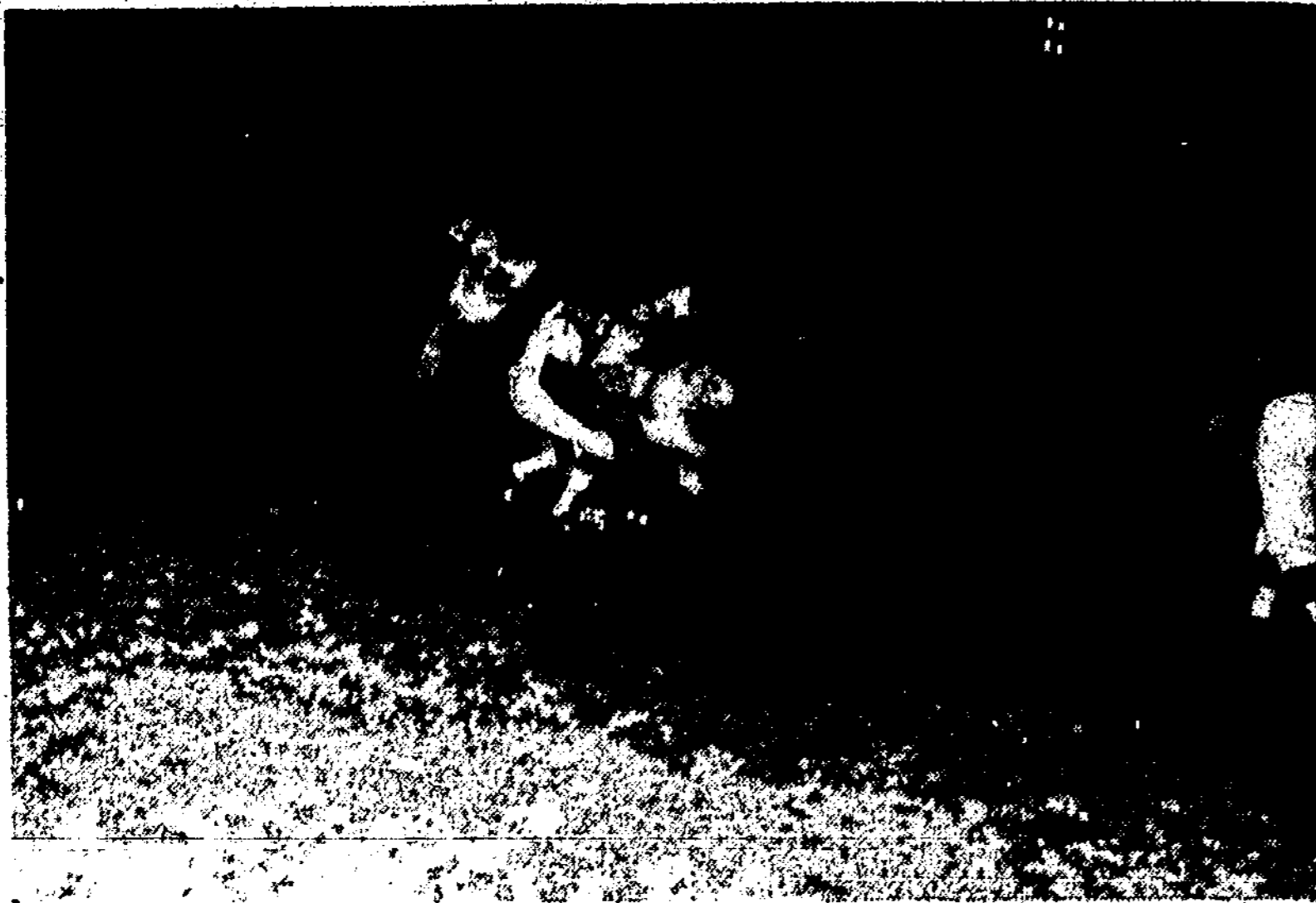

Runnels and Foreman each carried 9 of the 18 counties in huge U. S. House District 2. Runnels counties included: DeBaca, Hidalgo, home county Lea by nearly 3,500 and Valencia. Foreman won Curry by 203, Lincoln, Luna by 117 and Sierra.

Democrats gained a net of 4 seats in the New Mexico House. The new House division in Santa Fe will be 48 Democrats and 22 Republicans. Democrats also won a net of 3 more Senate seats. The new Senate split will be 28 Democrats and 14 Republicans. The State House underwent a major 35 per cent turnover. Senate changes total 26 per cent. Both Houses will experience wide-scale shifts in leadership posts. State Rep. Hoyt Pattison, 41, Curry County agricultural engineer, announced his candidacy for House Republican leader. Pattison won his fifth House term unopposed in the general election.

State Sen. Odie Echols, Clovis Democrat, is a prospect for Democratic majority whip or Senate Finance Committee chairman. Echols is on the powerful committee now. Runnels will vacate the chairman's job to move to the U. S. House.

State Sen. C. B. Trujillo, Taos Democrat, is also a hopeful for Senate Finance Committee chairman. Trujillo is on the SFC now and also on the potent Legislative Finance Committee.

Republicans retained a Senate seat in the Lincoln-Otero district. Attorney John Conway defeated Democrat Tom Hamilton, a pharmacist. Both are Alamogordo residents. Senate Republican Leader Joe Skeen of Píchacho, Lincoln County, yielded the seat to run unsuccessfully for lieutenant governor.

Democrat William J. Upton, ex-state banking commissioner, ousted two-term Republican State Rep. Carter Kirk in the Luna-Hidalgo House district. Upton and Kirk are Deming residents.

Sens. I. M. (Ike) Smalley of Deming and Tibo Chavez of Belen won reelection. Smalley and Chavez rank second in Senate seniority with 14 years of service. Chavez will probably continue as majority leader and Smalley as Judiciary Committee chairman. Both are on the influential Legislative Council which met early this week in Santa Fe.

Runnels' Senate seat may be filled by retiring State Rep. Finis Heckel, Lovington Democrat. The Senate district includes Jal. The Lea County Commission will appoint Runnels' successor to finish his term expiring in 1972. Heckel is finishing 12 years in the House. He lost a close race for the Democratic nomination to a 4-year State Supreme Court term in the June 2 primary.

John L. Morrow, Capulin Democrat and rancher, won the Union-Harding-Coffey Senate seat being vacated by Roy Republican Raymond Pendleton. Senate President Pro Tem R. C. (Ike) Morgan was reelected in the Curry-Roosevelt district. Morgan, a senator 18 years, is ranking member in service. He is set to retain the president pro tem's post.

Rep. David Salman, Buena Vista Democrat, was reelected in the Union-Mora-Harding district.

Rancher John Bigbee of Encino, a Republican, won retiring Rep. Jeff Good's House seat in the Guadalupe-DeBaca-Torrance district. A 1965-66 House member, John was a 1969 constitutional convention delegate.

Lincoln County well represented at NMU

Lincoln County is well represented at the University of New Mexico this fall, with 14 students enrolled in the university's various colleges and departments.
Enrollment at the university has increased 15 per cent over last year's figure to a total of 18,061 students. The enrollment increase more than doubles a 6.9 per cent increase projected for UNM by the State Board of Educational Finance.
The total includes 17,364 students on the main campus at Albuquerque, 276 at the Gallup two-year branch, 55 at the Holloman Continuing Education Center in Alamogordo, and 366 at Los Alamos - 204 in the Graduate Center and 162 in the new Undergraduate Center.

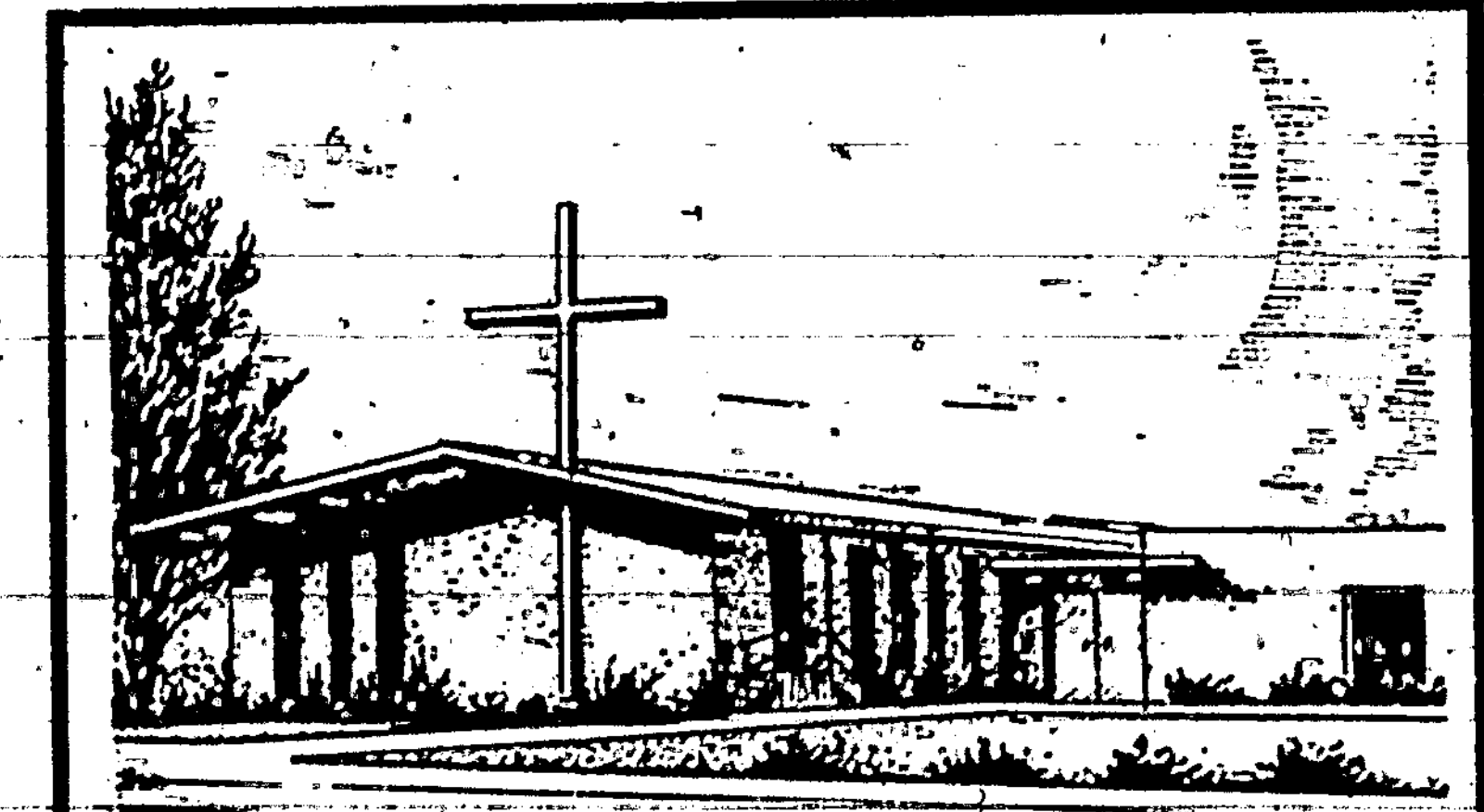

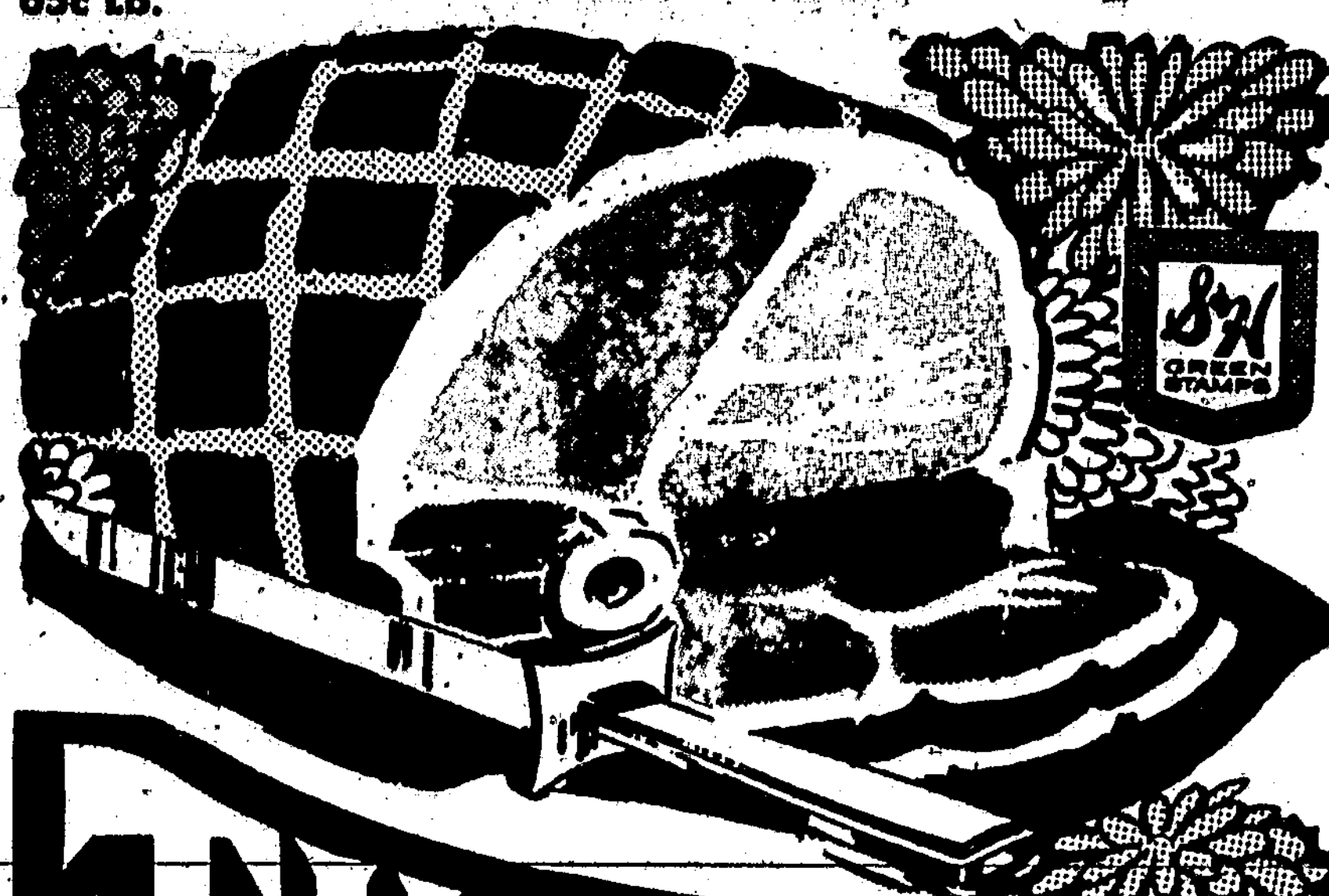
