



Early Tuesday morning the first aircraft of the 8th Tac Fighter Squadron will launch and head for Ramstein AB Germany. On Wednesday the 9th Tac Fighter Squadron will leave for Hahn and on Thursday the 7th will round out the deployment of the 49th, 96th, F4 Aircraft.

Crested Cap III is designed to carry out U.S. committments made to NATO and committments made in the 1967 tri-lateral agreement with the Federal Republic of German and the United Kingdon, agreeing that the dual base forces will return to Europe for annual training.

This exercise marks the 3rd time that NATO committed, dual based, 49th has returned to Europe for training since it left Germany in 1968.

A total of 2,000 men will be deployed.
