

New trail through black rocks

Work has started on the first official foot trail through the malpais at the Valley of Fire State Park west of Carrizozo.

Preliminary work on the project started this summer, but laying the trail through the black lava really got under way last week, according to state parks area supervisor Carlos Tipps.

The trail starts at the shelter on the bluff in the camping area and is to extend in a loop for some 3,000 feet through the unique rock formations and desert plant growth. About 450 feet of the trail has been completed to date.

Tipps said it is hoped that the entire trail can be completed by the start of the tourist season this

spring. He said the schedule has the support of state parks director James L. Dillard.

"He (Dillard) is anxious to get the trail going and completed," Tipps said yesterday.

The parks department has already employed two Carrizozo men to work on the difficult construction project and expects

to hire two more right after the first of the year.

The project, almost all of which must be accomplished by hand and with hand tools, entails constructing a base of rocks, then packing a surface with a gravel-type material.

There is already an "unofficial" trail through the malpais.

However, for park visitors to walk this trail, much climbing, among the rocks is required. The new trail will, basically, be an easy walk throughout the entire 3,000 foot distance.

The project is funded by the state park and recreation department, with matching fund support from the federal government, Tipps explained.

Topographic mapping under way

Engineering field parties of the Topographic Division, U.S. Geological Survey, are now engaged in surveying operations for the (preparation of accurate topographic map) between Carrizozo and Vaughn and between Carrizozo and Mountainair covering 1240 sq. miles. This mapping is part of a continuing nationwide program, that has been under way for many years, the objective of which is to complete and maintain a series of standard topographic maps covering the United States and its possessions.

The finished topographic maps are published in rectangular sheets, called quadrangles. The maps show roads, trails, houses, political boundaries, and other man-made features, as well as lakes, ponds, the courses of streams, and other water features. In addition, these maps depict the shape and slope of the land surface, and give the altitude above sea level. Quadrangle maps of adjacent areas can be joined to show any desired area, such as a city, a county, or a school district. Topographic maps serve as a

basis for the study and solution of many problems relating to activities that are affected by the character and relief of the earth's surface. The problems may involve mineral or water resources, prospecting and mining, engineering construction of all types, location of industrial sites, urban planning, military requirements, and recreation. Good maps facilitate the development of all projects that deal with the land. Although any one mapping project may be partially related to a particular development program or a

specific need, the topographic mapping of the Geological Survey is done essentially because these maps have a general-purpose value, and because it is sound economy to have them on hand for any specific planning that future developments or investigations might require.

In the preparation of these maps, the most modern engineering methods are employed. Aerial photography and precise photogrammetric instruments are part of the basic mapping process but field surveys are still required at two stages. The first of these is to establish control points—that is, elevations above sea level and geographic positions. The second is to check the accuracy of the map as drawn from the aerial photographs, and to complete the identification and classification of buildings, roads, streams, political boundaries, and other features. The field surveys are now in progress in this area. The cooperation of local residents and landowners in assisting the field parties engaged on these surveys will be greatly appreciated.

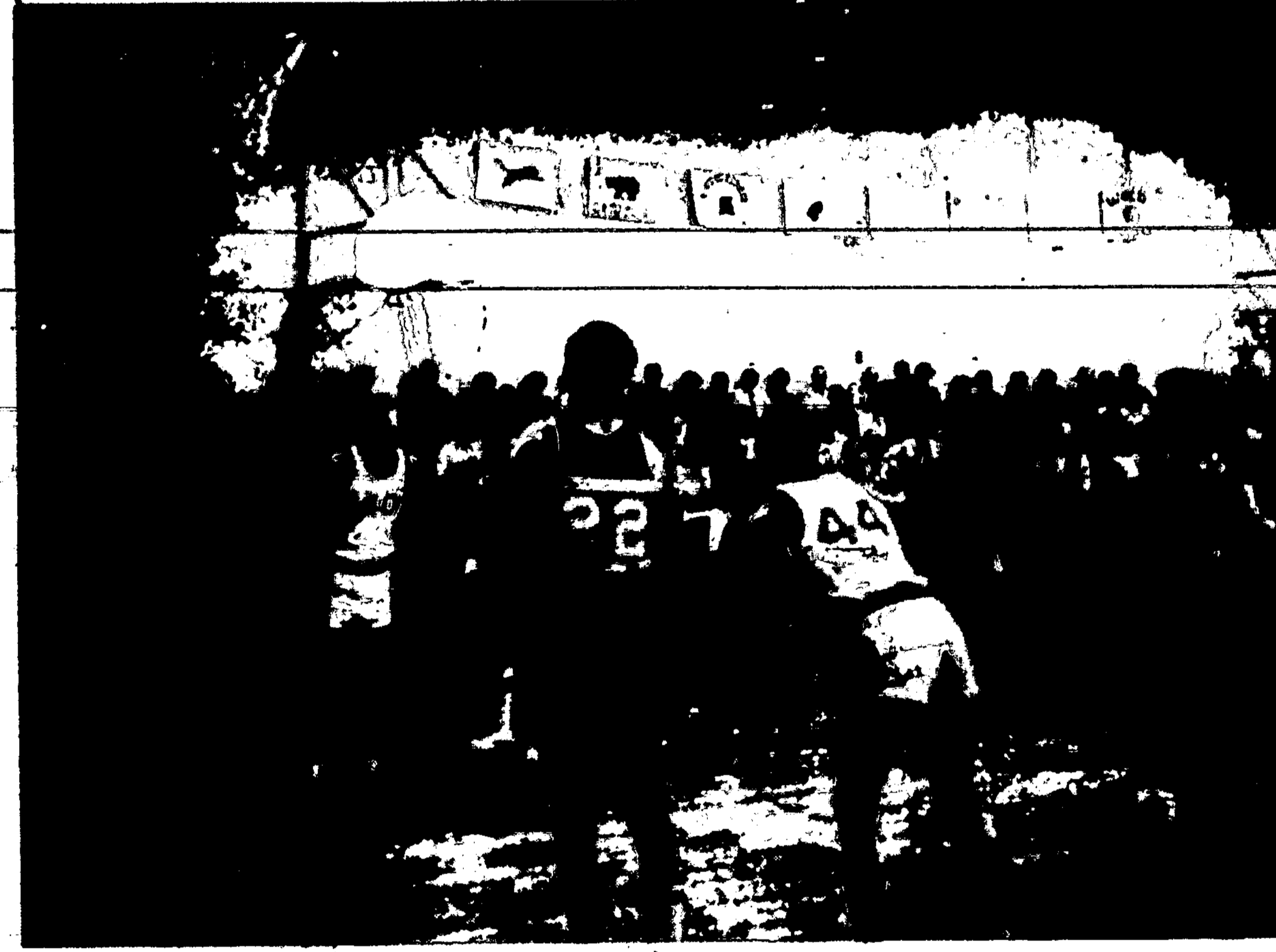
Over 30,000 maps have been published by the Geological Survey and more than 7½ million copies are distributed annually. Available without charge are State indexes showing areas covered by published maps, a folder describing topographic maps, and a brochure entitled "The Geological Survey." Most of the topographic quadrangle maps are sold for fifty cents a copy and may be ordered from the (Geological Survey, Washington, D. C., 20242) (Geological Survey, Federal Center, Denver, Colorado, 80225).

Corona wins Estancia tourney

Corona High School's basketball team, led by towering Dave Brunson, swept to the championship in the Estancia holiday invitational tournament early this week.

Corona's Cardinals downed the host team in the tourney finals Tuesday night, 75-65. The Cardinals had advanced to the finals by downing Weed, 81-57, in the opening round and edging Carrizozo, 55-53, in the semi-finals.

The Grizzlies topped highly touted Rehoboth, 86-70, in the opening round boosted by a 31-point performance by David Lee. After losing to Corona in the semi-finals, the Grizzlies, "outmanned and dead-tired" according to coach Gerald Lee, lost to Animas, 75-65.

Five Grizzlie cagers scored in the double-figures as Carrizozo easily ran past Rehoboth in the tournament's opening round. Rehoboth had been considered by some as the tourney favorite.

Gaby Chavez and Chris Monrreal. High for Rehoboth was Stan Kurley with 18 points.

Other first round scores were Corona 81, Weed 57; Animas 80, Laguna-Acoma 68; and Estancia 106, Hondo 37.

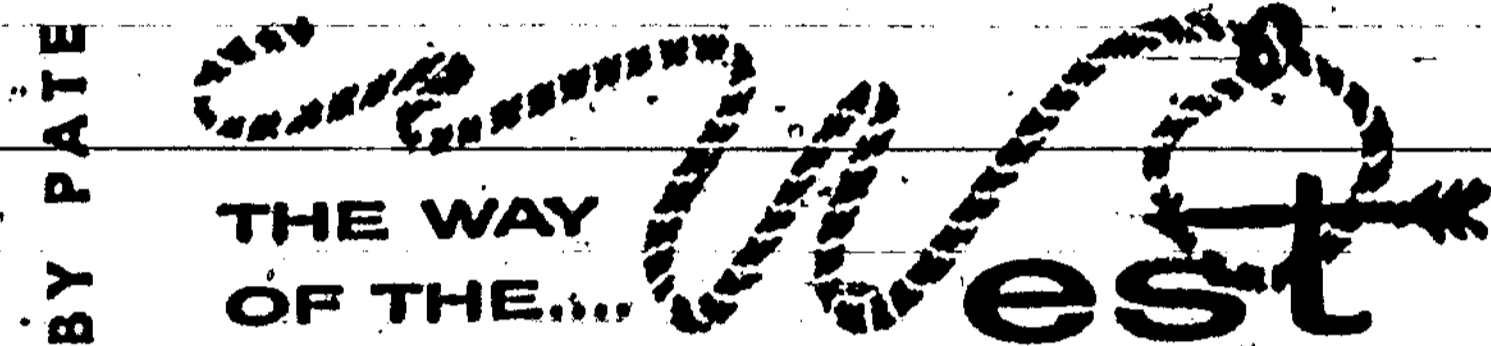

The Fortress comes complete with anti-theft device hood ornament, F radar, loud-speakers to warn off passing motorists and marine prop, among others.

The price tag, according to N-

M, was \$845,300. However, their consultant bank suggested a 10 percent down payment of \$84,530, with the remaining balance in '36 easy payments of \$24,192.49 per month."

One, of course, wonders who got it for Christmas.

Or, they'll throw a mystical masquerade for 100 in Houston, complete with a tour of the NASA Space Center, a dinner of pure, vegetarian, organic and completely non-alcoholic foods, along with a visit with astrologist Carol Righter, who will read your stars. The price is given on request, simply because your guests must obtain full security clearances.

The jewelry listings in their catalog started with an unmounted diamond of 12 carats. Certified by the Gemological Institute of America, it was priced at only \$150,000.

Oh, there were other things in the catalog, like a trip to Las Palmas complete with handsome tour guide, antiques from ninth century Japan, a season ski pass that covers virtually every slope in the Rockies, prime prime beef at \$7 a pound, etc.

One can wonder all he wants about the validity of things really being bigger in Texas. The availability of sizeable Christmas gift selections, however, should not be questioned.

Skeen won't participate in vote test
