Wreck totals Agullar car

Peter Agullar had just dropped David LaFave off for lunch Tuesday about 12:00 noon, was heading south on 14th Street (still in low gear) coming back to town when Mrs. Mabel Vallescos came driving out of an intersection. The Agullar car hit the Vallescos pickup broadside, denting the left side.

The truck traveled a good 300 feet after being hit, over fence into field. The Agullar car was totaled. No injuries to either party.

The Steering Committee met at 1:00 p.m. in Carrizozo, New Mexico with D. H. Dean presiding.

The program of the afternoon was presented by Kenneth Evans and Vance Gist of the U. S. Forest Service. They discussed the four ranger districts in Southeastern New Mexico and the activities of the Forest Service in the past year in range improvements, such as construction of storage tanks, watering facilities, timber sales, and thinning of timber. Mr. Evans exhibited the new type of reflective markers and directional signs now being used and Mr. Gist outlined road construction and improvement proposed for the next few years. Progress on project measures was reported as follows:

PM-56 Warning Light at Carrizozo is installed and working. This measure is completed.

PM-60 Alamogordo School Outdoor Education: Nature trails have been constructed and are being used.

PM-67 Lincoln Domestic Water & Sewage: Designs are to be revised for reduction in costs. FHA may go a grant and a loan; other sources are being explored.

PM-68 Otero County designated GPCP: Otero County is now in the Great Plains Conservation Program, and this measure is complete.

PM-71 Caution Light - Highway 70 - 54, La Luz: Turn outs are now being constructed by the Highway Dept.

PM-72 Lincoln Cemetery Protection: Fencing materials have been obtained and a work day for local people will be set up.

PM-87 Dry Canyon Flood Control: The project is considered feasible by the SCS and this agency has suggested that the City of Alamogordo again contact the Corps of Engineers.

PM-90 Capitan Community Park: The SCS and State Forestry have started mapping the area and consideration is being given to possibly include the museum in Capitan.

Four new project proposals were taken into consideration by the Steering Committee as follows:

1. Assistance was requested by Charles Wetzel, a local woodcutter and dealer, in obtaining a permit from the U. S. Forest Service to cut and haul pinon and juniper wood. D. H. Dean moved that South Central Mountain Resource Area adopt a project measure to assist woodcutters and dealers in obtaining access to and utilization and marketing of U. S. Forest wood products. Fred Thompson seconded the motion and this was approved as PM-92.

2. A letter from southwestern New Mexico Resource Development District was received asking assistance of the SCMRA in preventing bans on use of chemicals, materials, and herbicides for agricultural purposes without documentary data and research. D. H. Dean moved that this be approved as a project measure; second was made by Bill Gage and it was adopted as PM-93.

3. The Village of Lincoln asked the SCMRA for assistance with investigating and establishing a picnic and rest area in or near Lincoln for the benefit of tourists and travelers. The committee adopted this request as PM-94.

The next meeting date was set for January 18, 1972 in Ruidoso. Mr. Leo Griego of the State Planning Office briefly explained the six divisions of operation within the organization.

The meeting adjourned at 2:50 p.m. Attending the meeting were:



## Four major tax increase bills get the axe

Santa Fe - The Legislative Tax Study Committee axed four major tax increase bills after three days of public hearings.

Rejected were: A boost from 2 to 4 per cent in the motor vehicle excise tax; an increase from 2 to 4 per cent in the gross receipts tax on agricultural implements, farm tractors, non-highway vehicles and airplanes; removal of the 100 per cent gross receipts tax exemption on fungicides, weedicides and herbicides and removal of a similar exemption on chemical agents and reagents.

A 14-member Curry County delegation headed by Rep. Hoyt Pattison, R-Curry County, successfully fought the proposed farm-ranch industry tax hikes. In the group were former State Rep. Albert Matlock, Preston Martin, Buford Qualls, Hubert Qualls, Richard Miller, Paul Hudson, Troy Lovett, Don Welch, Theron Jones, Bill Hart, John Ricci and Calvin Jordan.

State Sen. Finis Heidel, D-Lovington, is Legislative Tax Study Committee vice chairman. Heidel's district includes Jal and Eunice. Rep. Robert Johnson, R-Clovis, is on the panel.

The rejected bills could still be introduced by other legislators in the coming 30-day lawmaking session opening Jan. 18. The committee will act on other bills in a 45-bill package Dec. 20-22 in Santa Fe. Changes are slim for tax increases in the 1972 Legislature because the state

enjoys an expected \$19 million state general fund balance.

Rep. George Blocker, D-Jal, summed up the apparent reaction to the Professional Tax Study Committee's package: "There's nothing in there that won't keep for a year is there?" Blocker, senior House member in seniority with 15 years of service, attended the tax study committee hearings. Before the committee acted Blocker predicted defeat of the bills the panel rejected. Blocker said possibly 4 or 5 bills in the series will become law next year.

Blocker will not seek reelection in 1972. Dan C. Berry of Eunice, longtime Lea County rancher, said he will seek Blocker's seat in House District 4. Berry, 49, is a Democrat. Berry is Eunice Board of Education president.

Union recognition as agent for the 88 nonprofessional, non-supervisory employees at Fort Stanton State Hospital in Lincoln County was expected to be sought this week from the State Hospitals-Institutions Department.

New Mexico District Council of Carpenters and Joiners of America was set to give Fort Stanton State Hospital employee membership cards to the big DHI for a certification check. If at least 26 employees or 30 per cent of eligibles are validated, an election will be scheduled.

Eligible employees will decide in the election whether they want

the union to represent them as bargaining agent. An issue previously in dispute between the Carpenters Union and the DHI was resolved late last week when the union withdrew its protest.

The DHI held five Fort Stanton Hospital ward attendants with supervisory duties should not be in the bargaining unit. The unit objected to the stand but later dropped the issue.

Plans and specifications for new Percha Dam State Park south of Truth or Consequences will be sent in two to three weeks by the State Park and Recreation Department to State Purchasing Agent Caesar Sebastian so invitations for contract bids can be sought.

State Park Director James Dillard said facilities of the \$100,000 park are set to include 8 combined picnicking-camping shelters, charcoal grills, tables, waste containers, parking areas, roadways and modern washrooms. Federal U. S. Bureau of Outdoor Recreation money will pay half the cost. Funds already on hand from a state severance tax bond issue will finance the balance. Percha Dam State Park will be five miles south of Caballo Lake State Park.

The state proposed at a settlement conference in Washington a price of 44 cents per 1,000 cubic feet for "new" natural gas at the wellhead in southeastern New Mexico's Permian Basin. Jal and Eunice

areas are included.

For compromise New Mexico also proposed 28 to 30 cents per 1,000 cubic feet for 'old' gas. The current price for southeastern New Mexico gas is only 16 cents per 1,000 cubic feet.

"New" gas is gas contracted for since Oct. 1, 1968. "Old" gas was contracted for from flowing wells prior to that date.

No agreement was reached at the settlement conference. It will be resumed Dec. 17 in Washington. Ex-Atty. Gen. Earl Hartley, New Mexico's chief counsel, says: "New Mexico has been subsidizing industry on the West Coast and in the St. Louis and Chicago areas for years with its low price."

## Everyone sees red

Everyone starts seeing red, this time of year! And green and gold too. And one of your favorite red things is in plentiful supply, this month for Christmas eating! Cranberries have been designated among the monthly plentiful foods, by the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Consumer and Marketing Service. You can do fantastic, great things with cranberries for your holiday menus. If you are expecting company—and you no doubt are—this Cranberry Fruit Nut Bread is sure to be a crowd-pleaser!

2 cups all purpose sifted flour  
1 cup sugar  
1 1/2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon soda  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/4 cup shortening  
3/4 cup orange juice  
1 tablespoon grated orange rind  
1 egg, well beaten  
1/2 cup chopped nuts  
1 1/2 cups fresh or fresh-frozen cranberries, coarsely chopped

Sift flour, sugar, baking powder, soda and salt together. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse cornmeal. Combine orange juice and grated rind with well-beaten egg. Pour all at once into dry ingredients, mixing just enough to dampen. Carefully fold in chopped nuts and cranberries. Spoon into greased loaf pan (9x5x3 inches). Spread corners and sides slightly higher than center. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F) about 1 hour. . . until crust is golden brown and toothpick inserted comes out clean. Remove from pan. Cool. Store overnight for easy slicing.

Note: If quick-frozen fresh cranberries are used, do not thaw. Give them a quick rinse in cold water and chop well frozen. You also know of course, that Christmas dinner would not be complete without old-fashioned cranberry sauce of some sort. . . Sparkling cranberry relishes and sauces are enticing entree accompaniments. And whether you use a recipe that has been in the family for years, or try something new each time, you will find that fresh cranberries hit the spot! Here is a Basic Cranberry Relish that is easy to make.

2 cups fresh cranberries, chopped  
1 cup sugar  
1 orange, seeded and quartered, chopped  
Stir cranberries, orange and sugar together. Chill in refrigerator until serving time, or cover and freeze for later use. Makes about 1 pint relish. For variation: Substitute a cored, quartered apple and a quartered lemon for the orange. Chill and serve. (Good also with chicken.)  
Chop 1/2 cup raisins with the cranberries and orange. Reduce sugar to 5 tablespoons; mix in 1/4 cup honey and 1/4 teaspoon ginger. Marinate in refrigerator. Especially good with baked ham.  
Chop 1 cup pitted cooked prunes with the cranberries and orange. Add 1 tablespoon lemon juice with the sugar. Try this relish with turkey, or other meat dishes.

# Twin Butte sweeps the wool show

Lincoln County had many top fleeces in the more than 160 fleeces from throughout New Mexico competing in the 33rd Annual New Mexico Wool Show recently in Roswell. This was the most competitive and highest quality state show in the nation, according to James M. Sachse, extension sheep specialist at New Mexico State University.

The champion sweepstakes award and reserve grand champion fleece was won by Twin Butte Sheep Company owned by Goodrum and Treat of Picacho. Other champion awards were as follows: champion 1/2 blood, Treat Ranch, Picacho; champion 3/4 blood, Treat Ranch, Picacho; and reserve champion junior fleece, Carol Cooper, Tinnie. Joe Skeen had the first place half-blood ram fleece.

R-R-D

R-R-D  
It's time to treat your horses for botflies. There are two new chemicals which are available, dichlorvos and trichlorfon alone or in combination with other worming chemicals which broaden the spectrum of internal parasite control. They are both available as powders or granules that can be added to the horse's favorite food.

Many horse wormers or equine anthelmintics are on the market, but only those containing dichlorvos or trichlorfon will effectively get rid of bots. Most horses will take the feed additive with no problems. However, it is best to withhold feed for 12 to 18 hours before giving the medicine with feed. If palatability is a problem, a package of strawberry jello, some honey or molasses will often help. Bots are the larvae or maggots of three flies that lay their eggs on the nose, lips, throat, chest and legs of horses from June until November. The eggs hatch by themselves or when the horse licks a spot where the eggs are attached to the hairs. The

maggots first invade tissues in the mouth and throat but eventually move to the stomach and intestines where they attach themselves for several weeks.

Horses heavily infested with bots present a run-down condition, caused by digestive disturbances and have rough coats. In the stomach bots interfere with glandular activity, causing an inflamed ulcerous condition. They absorb food which can progressively starve the horse. Severe infestations can cause complete obstruction to the passage of food from the stomach to the intestine. For more complete information on bots and external parasites of horses and their control, get a copy of "External Parasites of Horses and Their Control" from the County Extension Office in Carrizozo.

R-R-D  
Does your blue grass lawn look like it has been sprinkled with flour? If so, it may have a fungus disease called powdery mildew. The disease is appearing in many localities in New Mexico. The disease first appears as a fine

gray to white growth mainly on the upper surface of the leaf blade. The growth becomes more dense and often covers most of the leaf. Infected leaves usually turn yellow and wither. Mildew is caused by a fungus which grows on the surface of the leaf. Sucker-like structures grow into the outer leaf cells from which the fungus obtains nourishment. Mildew is most severe in shaded areas or where air circulation is poor and humidity is high. Keep the lawn vigorously growing by fertilizing and maintaining adequate moisture in the soil. Spraying with wettable sulfur, Actidione PM, Karathane will give you good control. Dusting with a fine sulfur is also helpful. A newly registered compound called Benlate has given excellent control of mildew as well as other plant diseases.


