

# Everything just right for Dedication of Recreation Area

\$500,000.00 Recreation Area went off without a hitch on Saturday and Sunday, June 29-30, 1974. Only thing that could have improved the weather would have been some rain, which came later in the day. Would have been hard to improve on the crowd, which included a lot of local golfers plus many people from all around the area.

Television people were here early and got a tour of the golf course before the program started. The fine Alamogordo band arrived early and played for the crowd ahead of actual dedication. Have heard several comments that this band's rendition of Star Spangled Banner was best ever. Johnson Stearns did good job at microphone, dispensing lots of prizes then took over as master of ceremonies for the official dedication.

Mrs. Bruce King, representing the governor of New Mexico, made fine talk and said this surely shows what cooperation in a small community can do. Governor candidate Joe Skeen was complimentary of the fine new facilities and said that he was strong for giving small communities

the help they need to grow and progress. Special guests introduced during the ceremonies were Jackie and A. N. Spencer, whose help made the Recreation Area possible; Mae Shafer, Mrs. Sabino Vidauri, and Bill Gallacher as charter members of the original Country Club; Tom Mann, the project engineer; golfer Nancy Lopez, and several political dignitaries.

Rev. E. DeBaest gave dedication prayer. Alton Whittaker led pledge of allegiance. Official ribbon cutting took place at the close of dedication ceremony. Three ribbons were cut by Jackie and A. N. Spencer, and Henry Vega.

Four holes of golf were played by a special team before the noon barbecue. This team was hand-picked by J. Stearns and included Nancy Lopez, Joe Skeen, Kino Ortiz and James Silva. A big part of the crowd followed them down the course.

Sky divers came and did their thing, Unk Cospes' barbecue was choice food and around 475 people were fed. Pairings were made for the

afternoon of golf, other people scattered to enjoy the fishing lake, baseball game (won by the Carrizozo Merchants team 10-5 over Roswell), and to enjoy other parts of the new Recreation Area.

Some clouds and wind blew up along towards five and light rain fell but by then most of the golf had been played and folks were enjoying the 19th hole with Bob and Sue Stearns as hosts. Real big crowd at the dance that night, lots of alumni powwowing and everyone having a fine time.

Nice thing about the dedication golf tournament was that local golfers were "in the money" when it was all over on Sunday. First place was won by Chevo Baca and Buck Morrison with score of 94. Chevo was playing real steady golf and didn't really have a bad hole, a 7 on the 6th in his first 9 Sunday was as bad as he got - and that is good when you see the 9s and 10s of other golfers.

Sally Ortiz and John Gonzales won second place trophy and this pair was steady. Sally had one 8, again on the 5th hole for his one bad go.

This pair scored a 96. There was a four-way tie for 3rd in the tournament. Charlie Hodgins and Ruben Chavez, Bob Shafer and Bob Hamilton, George Zimmerman and Gail Russell, Malcolm Petree and Mark Jones all scored 97. Petree did no worse than 7 and his partner the same. George Zimmerman shot three 8s, and then settled down for some good golf, his partner was hot.

Charlie Hodgins must have got over missing the cow chips that used to dot this course because he came through with some fine golf, no hole worse than 6 and Ruben matching him stroke for stroke. Bob Shafer had his ups and downs to put together his winning total, a couple of 3s and one 9 was the way it went while his partner was steady with 5-6-7s.

\$151,000 eases the strain

## Zozo school building program can go all the way now

Last week Supt. Jim Steingreis, and school board members Nat Palomarez and Ray Wells went to Santa Fe to meet with the public school capital outlay advisory council and came back with the good news that Carrizozo school had been granted the full amount of its request and was the only school to receive the full amount. Carrizozo had made a similar request in December of 1973 but was denied at that time because all requirements were not met, 1) having a cash balance of \$9,000 and 2) not having reappraisal certification. These requirements were met prior to the June meeting of the council.

School districts are rated as to need for capital outlay purposes, high-middle-low. Carrizozo was in the high group. A total amount of \$2.3 millions will be allocated.

Carrizozo school district voted bonds in the amount of \$325,000 on October 2, 1973. The actual assessed valuation of the district allowed for sale of \$250,000 in bonds whereas the total building project was estimated to cost \$400,000 leaving the school in need of additional money, which was the way the project was planned. The bonding capacity is \$314,267 now down to zero with sale of the \$250,000 bond issue.

Of the four projects planned, rehabilitation of high school including light fixtures in all rooms and offices, lowering ceilings, was let to Central Welding Service & Supply in early June. Bid was \$11,000, which was \$3,000 under the estimated cost of \$14,000.

Other projects that can now go ahead will be the gym, school board will prepare request for bid next meeting. Vocational complex is tied in with the gym but bid will not be called until the capital outlay money is approved by the state board of education in August. Also in August the

school district can call bids on the central supply and administration building.

A land swap between school district and hospital is being discussed. The Lincoln County Municipal Hospital owns strip of land fronting "D" Avenue and the school has land next to alley on "E" Avenue. Hospital people feel they could make better future use of the school's land and the school would build the central supply and administration building on the hospital land which would keep school buildings gathered up better.

The vocational complex has estimated cost of \$73,000, central supply and administration building \$60,000, gym and contingencies \$273,000. These costs will leave the district needing about \$19,000 but such items as bleachers, backboards and score clocks can be bought from cash balance.

Both gym and vocational complex could move at the same time but they may not. Looks now like it would be December 1975 before any new construction is complete.

## Smokey Bear Stampede in Capitan Three Days, July 3-4-5

The biggest celebration of its kind in Lincoln County takes place each year in Capitan around the 4th of July. This year the festivities start the night of the 3rd, when five pretty girls will vie for the title of "Queen of Lincoln County." The queen candidates are Kandice Huey, Patricia Ann Tully, Nancy Hunter, Elizabeth Jenkins and Debbie Lee McDaniels. This contest starts at 7:00 p.m. in the arena at the fair grounds. The personality contest is at 2:00 p.m.

Right after the queen contest the first showing of the Smokey Bear Stampede gets under way. A couple of extra added events let both old and young in the action. An old-man's breakaway roping for men 60 and over and a calf scramble for boys and girls 12 and under will be each rodeo session.

Some real good added money has been put in the pot, \$100 for the saddle bronc event, \$50 for bareback bronc riding, calf roping, steer wrestling and bull riding. Ladies barrel race and

ladies pole bending events carry \$25 in added money.

Capitan's tree-lined mainstreet, one of the real pretty streets in the southwest, is the route for the colorful parade which starts at 11:30 from the school grounds and heads down the street ending at the fair grounds. Barbecue right after the parade. The afternoon rodeo starts at 2:00 p.m. and the night rodeo at 8:00 on July 4.

The new exhibit building on the fair grounds is the dance location. Good music and good place to meet all you friends -- at the Stampede dance. The Aggie Ramblers are returning to play again this year.

The 15th annual Smokey Bear Stampede goes on through Friday this year. A team roping event has been schedule starting at 1:30 p.m. sponsored by the Capitan Dallymasters. It's a two-head progressive steer roping, roper-may-enter twice.

Prize money totals \$5,000 for this stampede. Halliday Rodeo Co. is producing the rodeos.

Chatting with Ernest Key we heard about the time Rousey and McDonald found a pocket of gold in their mine and sent Rousey's boy and companion off to El Paso to market the gold. Instead the two boys decided to see Juarez and wound up in jail. When this information got back to Lincoln County, McDonald and (Frank?) Vega went on rescue mission and by making proper payment they arranged for the boys to be freed. The boys were taken from jail and put in cattle car -- bellowing just like steers -- with destination Walnut, a whistle stop on the rail line once running between Carrizozo and Capitan, about nine miles out of Zozo. The boys were really lucky, they did get home, but not very happy about it.

When Ernie was a lot younger he was working for painting contractor on school at Capitan. One day the contractor took off apron and said he was going to Juarass, would be back about Wednesday. His name was Cummins, no kin to Hollis. He may have got back on a Wednesday but it was four months later when Cummins made it back to Capitan in ragged clothes, unmatched shoes, and looking like a real tramp. He had been in jail in Juarez all this time and was lucky to get out.

Four Lincoln County schools are about to receive a small piece of federal money -- next time around such money may have more strings attached. The Department of Health, Education and Welfare (we think, a disastrous combination of bureaus) has put together official regulations to govern the enforcement of sex-discrimination, to be known as Title Nine. Your boys and girls will have separate showers and dressing rooms but other things change. Physical education classes must now be coeducation, home ec and industrial arts courses open to both sexes, no single sex clubs allowed (such as "C" club), lights out hours same for both boys and girls in college. The regulations demand that institutions not discriminate on expenditures for necessary equipment, and also forbid sex discrimination in recruiting students and awarding scholarships. The local sports competitive scene has been dull enough that more accent on sports for girls would surely liven up things in Zozo.

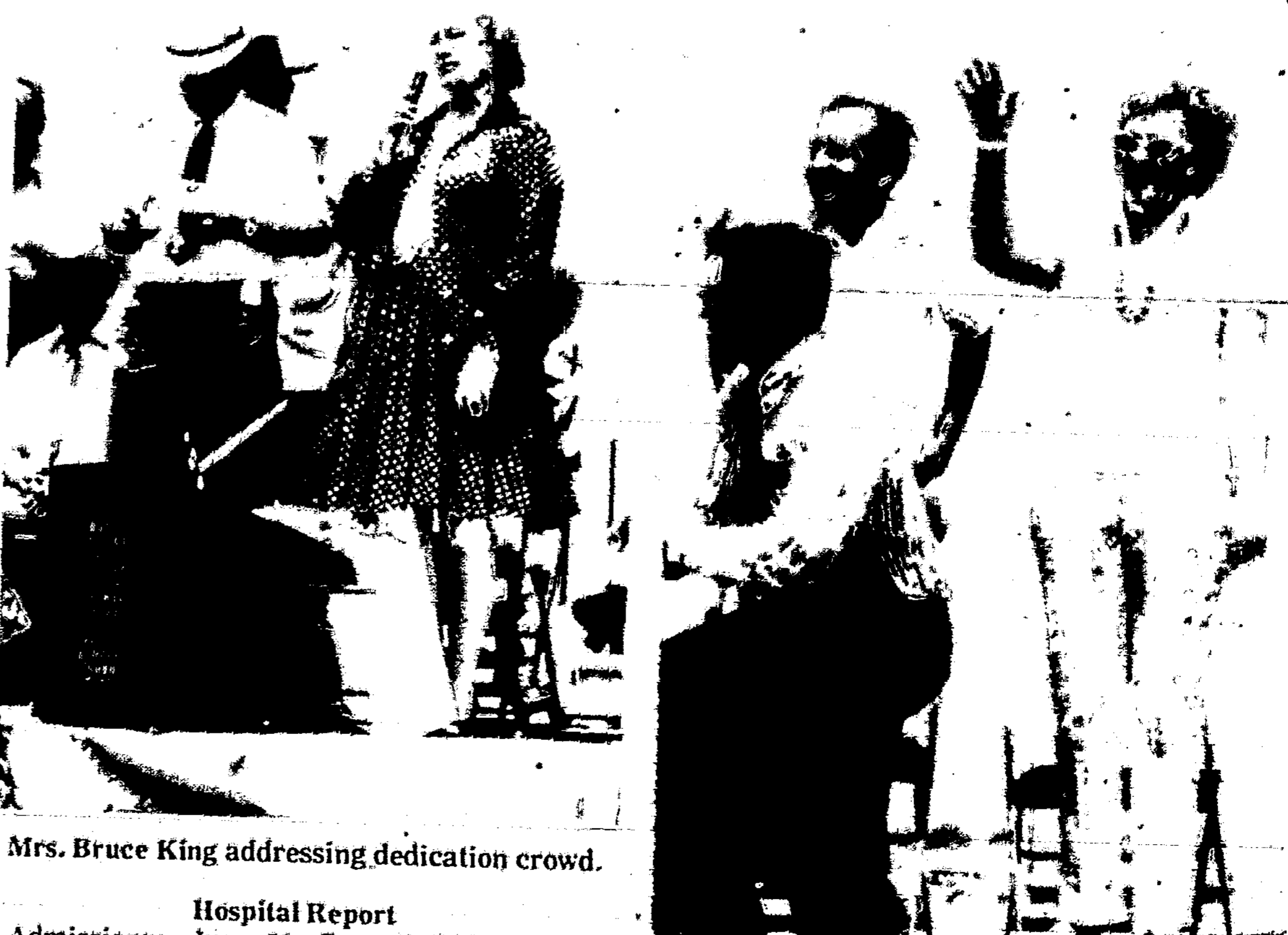
