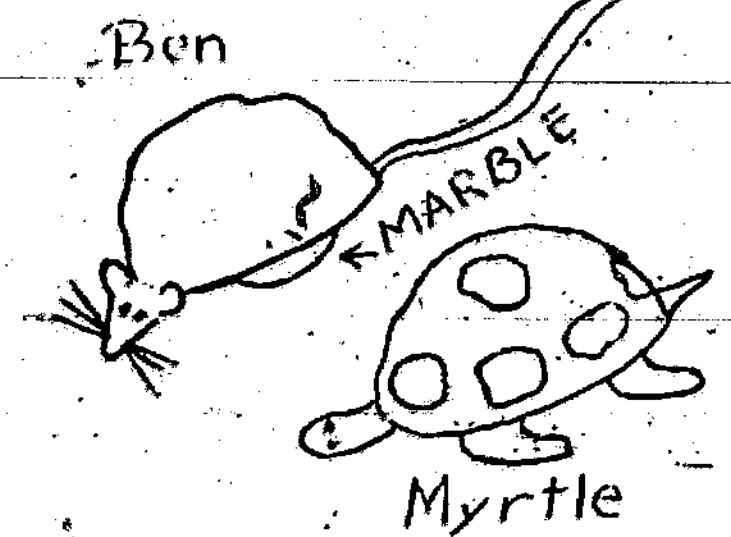

If you want to surprise the children make them some walking walnut animals, as they watch. You will need some walnuts, maybe you still have some from the Christmas stockings. Halves of walnut shells are used for the bodies with bits of felt attached for eyes, head, feet and tail. Beads or sequins can also be used for eyes. The mouse whiskers are threads. Use white glue for attaching all decorations. When the animals are finished, put a marble under each one and watch them scramble down a slanting book or board.



These walnut animals can scamper quickly down a smooth slope. You can omit the marble if the animals are for children under three, in that case you can cut the felt head and tail of the mouse in one piece. The turtles head, tail and legs can also be cut in one piece, then the walnut half is glued into place. The problem now is convincing the kids to let the glue dry because by this time they have already given their animals names, and are anxious to see them in action!

### Earnings record is free

People can get a report on the earnings credited to their social security record free of charge, according to Mrs. Christine Graves, social security field representative.

"You don't need to pay anyone to help you get a statement of your earnings," Mrs. Graves reminded. "Just ask any social security office for a 'Request for Statement of Earnings' post card. Fill in your name, address, date of birth, and social security number. Sign, stamp, and mail the card. Then the Baltimore accounting office will send you a statement of earnings credited to your record, free of charge.

"Since the amount of monthly social security benefits payable in the future is based on your record of earnings, it is a good idea to check up on your record at least every three years. Then if an error is discovered, it can be easily corrected," Mrs. Graves emphasized.

## Court upholds Zimmerman

The New Mexico Supreme Court earlier this month upheld District Court Judge George L. Zimmerman's contention that the Children's Court retains jurisdiction of probation of a child after he reaches the age of 18.

The test case involved a Lincoln county youth. The Supreme Court decision, titled "Children's Court — Jurisdiction," states:

"Where a term of probation was fixed pursuant to proceedings in Children's Court begun while child was under age, Section 13-14-12 (A), NMSA 1953 (Repl. Vol. 3, 1973 Supp.) retains jurisdiction in the Children's Court, even though

John Doe became an adult, until 'disposition' of the case."

Because proceedings were started in (Lincoln county) Children's Court and the Children's Code prohibits using the name of a child, 17 or under, the appeal of Judge Zimmerman's ruling was styled:

"In the matter of "John Doe, IV," a child, appellant No. 1546, Appeal from the Children's Court of Lincoln county, Zimmerman, judge.

The Supreme Court decided, that the Children's Court did have jurisdiction to enter the order under section 13-14-12 (A).

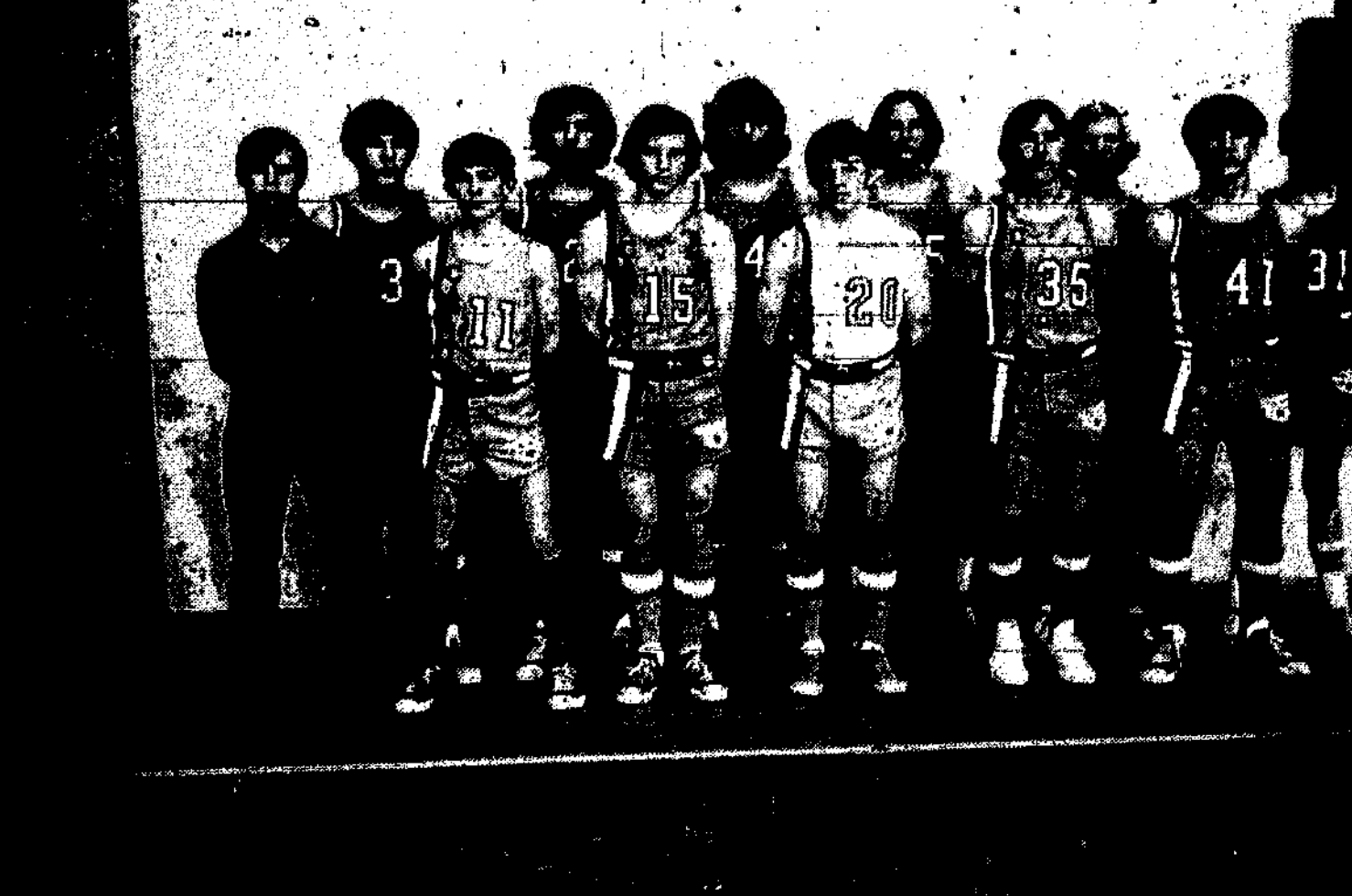
