It's holiday time in Lincoln County

Spectators attending Smokey Bear Stampede events in Capitan Friday and Saturday will find several improvements in the plant at the Lincoln County Fair Grounds. New holding pens are in evidence at the rodeo arena, and an addition has been made to the large livestock barn on the east side of the main exhibit hall. Other improvements have been made.

Visitors will begin flocking into the mountain country today for a long July Fourth holiday weekend and to attend the various events within the county.

Visitors and residents will have their pick of events to attend and recreational opportunities. The Lincoln National Forest is closed to fireworks and fires—except in certain designated areas—because of extreme dryness and fire danger.

Horse racing at Ruidoso Downs will draw many people. Golf at Carrizozo on its relatively new nine-hole course with water hazards, at Ruidoso and Cloudercroft will draw other July 4 weekend visitors.

Lakes and streams will be crowded with

fishermen.

Restaurants and entertainment places will be jam-packed during the evening and night hours. The Carrizozo municipal swimming pool and the Ruidoso one will be busy.

Lincoln County's population will swell considerably this weekend—one of the major holiday periods during the summer.

State Police will be patrolling extra hours to try and prevent accidents.

Visitors will flock to the Sierra Blanca ski area for gondola rides and to Mon Jeau.

The 16th Annual Smokey Bear Stampede will be presented two big days, July 4 and 5.

In Mescalero, the Mescalero Apache Ceremonial, rodeo and Indian dances will be today through July 6. This event features the Puberty Ritual for young Indian maidens. Five young ladies are involved this year, Ruby Chino, Rena Mendez, Emma Chino, Jacqueline Little and Donna Stern.

Queen contest
In Capitan a contest for Queen of Lincoln

County will be staged July 4 at 1:30 p.m. at the fair grounds, following a colorful parade in downtown Capitan at 11:30 a.m.

A barbecue is set for noon tomorrow.

Friday afternoon, the first Stampede Rodeo is scheduled for 2 p.m. and a night rodeo for 8 p.m. A dance will be held from 9 p.m. to 1 a.m.

July 5, a rodeo is scheduled at 8 p.m. and dance from 9 to 1. Music will be by the Jones Hatband.

The rodeos will feature saddle bronc riding, bareback bronc riding, calf roping, steer wrestling, bull riding, ladies barrel race, ladies pole bending, and old man's breakaway roping for men 60 and over.

Calf scrambles for boys and girls 12 years of age and under are planned.

Rodeo books will close at 5 p.m. today. Some \$5,000 in rodeo prize money is in the till.

On July 5 at 10 a.m. Dalley Team Roping, sponsored by the Capitan Dallymasters, will be in evidence.

County government resources \$1,682,536

Lincoln County expects to have total financial resources of \$1,682,536 from all sources this fiscal year, according to figures provided by Les Olson, county manager.

Representatives of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration will be in Carrizozo, Thursday, at 9:30 a.m. to go over the budget for this fiscal year with county officials, the county commission and administrative personnel.

Total budget for Lincoln County as prepared by the commissioners—Roman Nunez, chairman, Bill Hart and Bud Payne and Olson—will not equal total resources so that an adequate cash balance can be maintained to meet county expenses from July 1, 1976, until ad valorem taxes start rolling in in November and December of 1976.

The \$1,682,536 figure includes all types of revenue, from property taxes to revenue sharing funds and income to the road department.

Anticipated sources of revenue next year and dollars amounts are as follows:

General fund (property taxes and other sources) \$613,320; road fund, \$431,682; fire districts—Nogal, \$16,129; Ft. Stanton, \$16,227; Hondo, \$14,353; Bonito, \$13,320; Lincoln, \$10,093 (all unincorporated villages)—farm and range income, \$58,889; recreation, \$4,277; predatory animal control, \$11,617; Ruidoso Hospital, \$16,955; Carrizozo Medical care (mill levy plus cash balance in hospital fund), \$51,500; interest, \$92,100; general obligation bonds \$162,557; and CETA (manpower training program), \$5,824.

Those items total \$1,518,840. Add \$163,696 in revenue sharing funds and you get the \$1,682,536 total.

Proposed expenditures from the general fund this fiscal year by departments and divisions include:

Maintenance and buildings and grounds, \$36,700; county clerk's office, \$48,839; bureau of elections, \$7,261; assessor's office, \$67,696 plus \$30,180 from revenue sharing for salaries; treasurer, \$40,388; fixed charges, \$78,045; law enforcement, \$105,093 plus \$10,349 in revenue sharing funds for part of one salary and for a police car, \$4,400.

These expenditures, exclusive of the revenue sharing money, come to \$436,914. Add \$163,696 in revenue sharing funds and you get about \$600,000 in the general fund budget.

The road fund budget has been set at \$317,838, but because of a deteriorating position regarding cash balance, actual expenditures (some authorized jobs not filled) will be considerably less than the budgeted figure, Olson indicated.

Estimated general fund cash balance for June 30, 1975 is \$176,406.

Estimated road fund cash balance as of June 30, 1976 is \$113,844 compared to a cash balance presently of over \$200,000.

Estimated revenue sharing income for this fiscal year is \$164,998.

Proposed expenditures of this amount is

divided as follows:

Law enforcement, \$5,949 for salary and \$4,400 for police car; senior citizens, \$16,000; Ruidoso ambulance, \$12,000; Carrizozo ambulance, \$6,000; property assessment (salaries), \$30,180; county municipal hospital, \$25,000; animal control, \$15,000; sanitary landfill, \$5,000; recreation, \$10,000; medical transport, \$18,000; and Ruidoso Public Library, \$2,400. This total \$154,321 with an estimated revenue sharing fund unencumbered balance June 30, 1976, of \$10,677.

To retain cash balances at the end of this fiscal year, proposed expenditures are less than expected income in most areas of county government.

Proposed expenditures for various facets of government where income is derived are as follows for this fiscal year:

General fund, \$436,914 (plus revenue sharing funds); rural fire departments, within a few dollars in most instances of anticipated income (from state and federal sources); farm and range, \$17,000; recreation, \$2,000; animal control, \$10,000; Ruidoso Hospital, \$16,955; Carrizozo medical services, \$58,282; interest \$47,632; general obligation bonds, \$65,000; CETA, \$5,824—for a total of \$1,047,614.

Add revenue sharing funds and you get \$1,211,310 for a general fund budget for the fiscal year.

Add the \$312,000 road fund budget and you approximate the total resources expected this fiscal year—less anticipated cash balances.

Total resources the past fiscal year just ended including a hefty cash balance were \$1,760,440 exclusive of the Lincoln Water project and ICF (intermediate care facility) in Carrizozo which are not factors in this year's budget and are excluded for comparison purposes.

The budget this fiscal year includes salary increases for all county employes in a continuing effort, Olson explains, to get Lincoln county public employes salaries on a par with norms.

State officials are expected to approve the county budget tomorrow as presented.

A Carrizozo municipal budget hearing also will be tomorrow—at 10 a.m. in the town hall

Carrizozo budget reviewed

The New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration representatives will be at Carrizozo Town Hall, Thursday 10 a.m. for a budget hearing for the town of Carrizozo.

Town clerk Johnny Johnson and the town government have prepared a budget showing grand total resources in the general fund for next fiscal year of \$152,356.

Expenditures anticipated include \$2,000 for judicial, \$1,000 for election expense, \$24,550 for administration, \$19,500 for police, \$1,225 for fire protection, \$33,100 for roads and streets, \$50,000 for recreation (partly from special donation), \$12,900 for parks and \$300 for cemetery upkeep.

Total expenditures from the general fund are expected to be \$144,575 with a cash balance at the end of this new fiscal year to be about \$7,700.

Special revenue funds include \$17,992 from revenue sharing and \$24,709 from cash balance and state fire allotment; \$3,143 in recreation fund.

Other income comes from general obligation interest funds, golf fund, airport revenues, fees, gross receipts tax, etc.

Ortiz No. 1 in golf tourney

Kino Ortiz, of Cloudercroft, with a neat 66, won the Carrizozo Open (String) Golf Tournament, Saturday, at the Carrizozo golf course—by winning the first flight.

Mayor of Carrizozo Floyd Siegrist and Paul Salgado tied for first place in the Second Flight with 75s. Mayor Siegrist had been playing golf only a few weeks before entering the tournament.

Phena Otterson of Roswell picked up \$50 by being closest to the pin on Par 3 No. 4 hole—to win for women.

Also picking up \$50 was Al Sanchez, who was only five feet, ten inches from the flag on a water hole—to win for men. Sanchez listed Oakland, Calif., as home.

The most interesting and outstanding accomplishment just recently is an old windmill that Carl has restored. 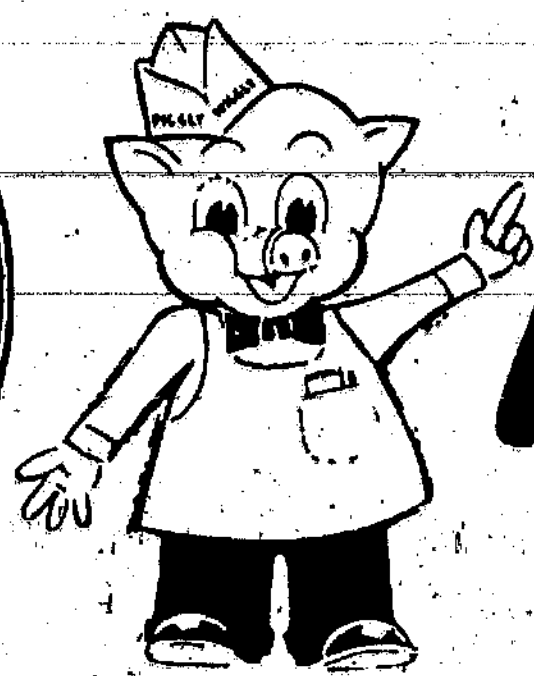



Zozo gets grant U.S. Senator Pete Domenici announced Friday a grant to the City of Carrizozo of \$24,000 from the environmental Protection Agency. The grant will fund a "Step One" project for preparation of facilities, and planning for waste water collection and treatment facilities.

THE WAY OF THE... West

The first of several meetings called by Mayor Floyd Siegrist to determine Carrizozo's most pressing needs was held Monday night. Present for the session at the town hall were Bill Gomez, Community Resources Development Specialist, Extension Service, New Mexico State University, and Mary Ellen Payne, county home extension agent; and a dozen or more citizens. We'll be hearing more about this. Dutch Cox, president of the Chamber of Commerce and the Chamber and the Woman's Club will be involved in the cleanup and have pledged complete support of the effort.

"We either live in the 1890s or progress," the mayor said.

Let's cooperate--everyone of us--in the cleanup drive.

Carrizozo can sparkle--and when it does, it will be much more attractive to outsiders with investment capital and talents the town needs.

Tomorrow is July Fourth--Independence Day--when we celebrate the 199th birthday of the founding of the U.S. of A. We're mighty proud to be a citizen of this country--with all its troubles, still the most progressive, most delightful place to live in this world. July 4 celebrations have been going on a long, long time. This is an item that appeared in the White Oaks Eagle in 1900: "PROGRAM FOR THE FOURTH WILL BE AS FOLLOWS:

"Barbecue dinner for everybody; races and tournament riding for prizes; baseball, drilling contest for miners; sack races; potatoes races; foot racing, bicycle races; speaking and reading the Declaration of Independence; dancing and fireworks at night; Everything free as the water that flows; and everybody is invited. (A committee was responsible for making the plans and raising the money).

Sounds like folks back in 1900 were a lot more athletic than they are today. Maybe that's a part of our problem.

Imagine miners entering a drilling contest on their holiday.

That's like a bus driver taking a bus ride on the Fourth.

If you have a livestock scale on your ranch, it'll be inspected this month by the New Mexico Department of Agriculture.

RUIDOSO DOWNS, N.M.--The Fourth of July racing weekend at Ruidoso Downs kicks off a four-day stand on Thursday and offers a stakes race on each of four days. First post is 1:30 p.m. Thursday's program will be topped by the \$6,000-added Jet Deck Stakes at 440 yards. A full field of 10 will answer the call. The main stand-out is Chicory Moon, one of the finest handicap quarter horses in the nation.

On Friday, it's the \$6,000-added Governor's Handicap at 6 1/2 furlongs. The classic is conditioned for three-year-olds and up. The centerpiece of Saturday's slate is the Consolation of the \$362,890 Rainbow Derby at 440 yards. Gross post of the Consolation is a hefty \$55,830.

On Sunday, it'll be the finale of the Rainbow Derby--the second leg of Ruidoso's Triple Crown for sophomores. A winner's prize of \$119,177 will be on the line.

So far as Thursday's Jet Deck Stakes are concerned, Chicory Moon figures to be picked as the public choice. Last summer, the big gelding

just about knocked off everything in sight as he collected a division of the Top Deck Stakes, the Dale Robertson Stakes, a division of the World's Championship Classic, and, for good measure, the Three Bars Handicap.

So far this season, Chicory Moon is right on schedule. He polished off the Top Deck Stakes by a half-length on May 18. Last time out, he was bet down to 40 cents on the dollar in the Mr. Jet Moore Handicap at 400 yards and came through with a bulging three-quarter-length win.

Chicory Moon, owned by Betty Shebester of Wynnewood, Okla., will go into Thursday's assignment under a sturdy impost of 131 pounds--which surely ranks among the highest loads ever packed at Ruidoso. In recent years, the only horse to tug a heavier burden was the 132 pounds supported by Truckles Feature while getting nipped a head by The Honker in the 550 Championship Handicap on Labor Day of 1973.

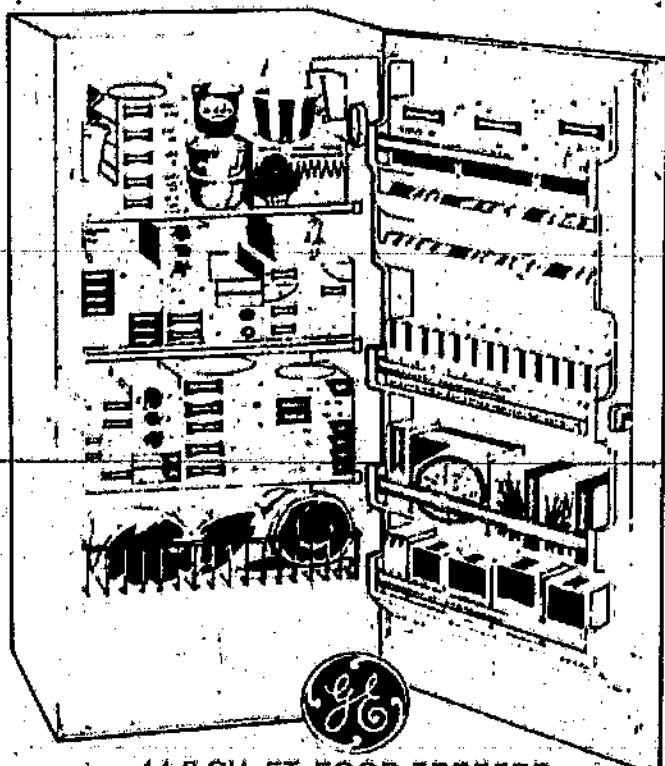



WITHIN THE HEART of Carrizozo there is a fine fishing lake - - at the Carrizozo Golf Course and Tennis Courts with the lake doubling as a real hazard for golfers on No. 1 tee.
The above picture isn't the fishing lake, but is a fishing stream within a few miles of Carrizozo. That's Bonito Creek as it appeared in the spring above Bonito Dam.
Good fishing is available at Nogal Lake out of Carrizozo off NM 37, too - - with camping and picnic facilities available.
Fishing, hunting, hiking, horseback riding - - all of these are part of the recreation picture in Lincoln County of which Carrizozo is a hub and entry point to fabulous mountains and the Lincoln National Forest.
Rainbows and Browns abound in Lincoln County fishing streams. Bonito Lake is a favorite spot. The lake is fed by the stream pictured.

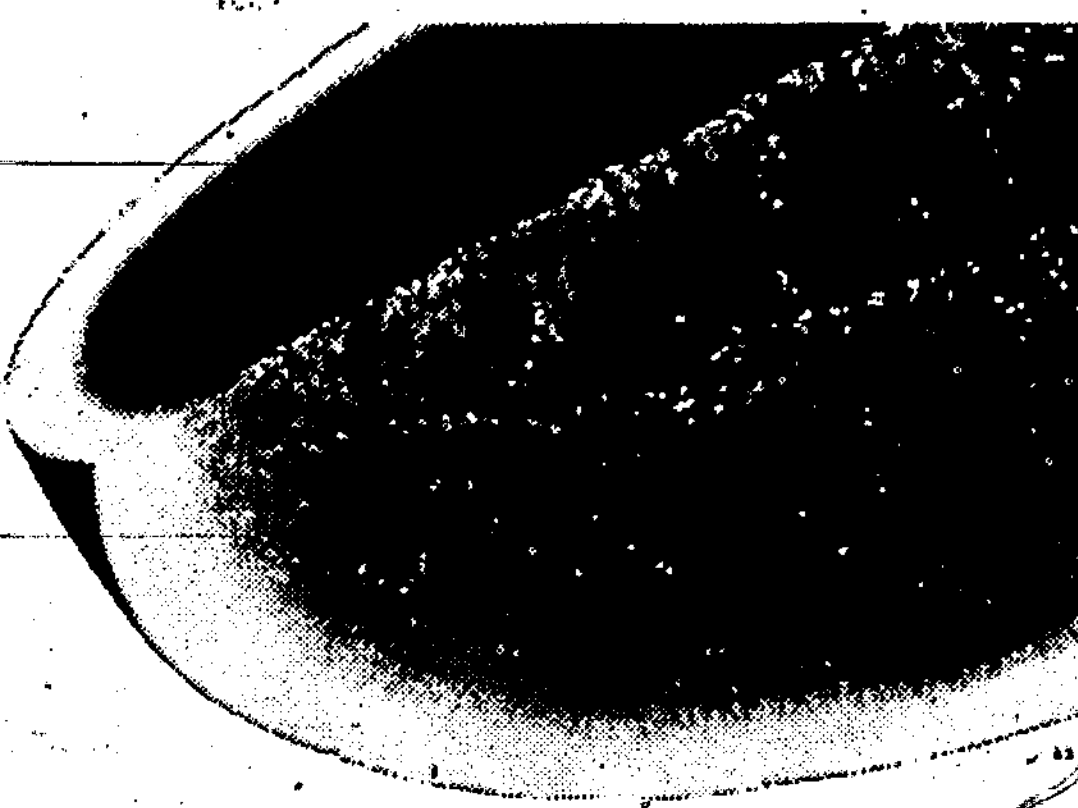
