The discussion came Tuesday night when

Cope, president of the Tularosa cable TV company, requesting the opportunity to discuss a Cable TV franchise for Carrizozo.

operates on a regular business occupancy license and has no franchise.
Attorney Bill Payne said that there should be a franchise, not necessarily exclusive. for any
Cable Company who used the streets and alleys of the town. He.explained that the town, under a franchise, had somie say as to rates charged and service, and should receive some revenue from the operation.

offer more channels and better service than the elfisting one., then the trustees should probably not consider granting a franchise.
