Harman quits, blames News

Capitan, was chosen as the site for this. historical park because it was here twenty-five vears ago a badly-burned bear cub was found clinging to a smouldering tree and rescued by fire fighters: The black bear cub was taken to Santa Fe, where his burns were treated by a local veterinarian. By the time his injuries had healed, he had become the first living symbol of the forest fire prevention campaign supported by the U.S. Forest Service. In June of 1950, he was flown to Wasghinton, D.C. and officially named Smokey Bear. Since that time, Smokey Bear has become a world renowned symbol of fire prevention and conservation.

By dedicating Smokey Bear Historical State Park here in Capitan, it is hoped that the ideals of wildlife, conservation and the preservation, of our natural resources will be fostered for decades to come through the development of the Smokey-Bear-Museum, Interpretive-Trails and the Visitor's Information Center."

Alamogordo K Mart to open

The 54,500 square-foot K mart discount department store on N. White Sands Blvd. in Alamogordo will open to the public at 8:00 a.m. May 6, according to the manager, Glenn E.

The Alamogordo K mart will bring the number of K marts in New Mexico to eight as the Kresge Company, operator of K marts, continues its expansion of its K mart chain in the state. On May 6, K marts will also make their debuts in Yazoo City, Miss.; Homewood, Ill.; Enola, Pa.; Salem and Redford, Va., and Warsaw, Frankfort, Lebanon and Elwood, Ind., for a total of 1,002 K marts in the United States, Puerto Rico, Canada and Australia. Kresge expects to open approximately 160 K marts in 1976.

Alamogordo officials and top executives of the Kresge Company will take part in a brief ribboncutting ceremony at the main doors of the department store immediately before opening.

Because record crowds of all ages are expected to participate in the grand opening, police have been asked to give special attention to the traffic on the streets surrounding the store during the first few hours of opening. This is for the safety of the motorists driving by. Once a car is in K mart's adequate and convenient parking tor there should be no congestion.

The new K mart, selling nationally advertised products and backing all sales with a 'satisfaction always" policy, will be a discount department store in its pricing policies. Following are highlights of the merchandise the department store will carry appliances; building tools; floor coverings; draperies, yard goods and sewing materials; women's fashions; men's, boys', girls' and infants' clothing; bedding; iewelry; camera supplies; books and records; pet supplies, and health and beauty aids. The K mart will have a automotive center with an auto music section featuring stereo tape players and tapes. The store will also feature a sporting goods department.

More than 25 Alamogordo area residents will be given full employment when the new K mart opens. Additional personnel will be hired parttime during holiday seasons. A staff made up of entirely local people will assure that K mart is alert to all the needs of its new customers.

The first K mart opened in a suburb of Detroit in 1962. Kresge conceived K mart as a store selling top-quality merchandise at a small profit to induce high volume. This concept brought immediate and overwhelming acceptance resulting in the world's fastest growing mass merchandising chain.

Ladron area planning set

A citizen workshop to identify important planning issues, problems and public concerns on National Resource (public domain) Lands in the Ladron Mountain-Mesa Del Oro area will be sponsored by the Bureau of Land Management

The workshop will be in the Belen Junior High School Cafeteria (corner of Bernard and Fourth Streets) beginning at 7:00 p.m., and will focus on ... the Ladron planning unit of the Socorro BLM. District. This unit (see attached map) contains approximately 241,000 acres of National Resource Land Extending from the Acoma and Laguna-Indian reservations on the north to the Cibola National Forest on the south, and from the Rio Puerco River on the east to approximately five miles west of the Socorro Catron County line on the west.

Information obtained during the workshop will be used in developing a multiple use plan which will serve as a guide for future management and use of National Resource Land in the Ladron unit. Additional workshops and public meetings will be held later this year to discuss specific land use alternatives and conflicts which arise during development of the multiple use (Management Framework) plan.

Anyone who has information concerning or is interested in future management and use of National Resource Lands in the Ladron unit is encouraged to attend the worshop. "In order to develop a comprehensive plan on the Ladron unit, it is essential that we obtain public involvement and have interested individuals, groups and organizations involved in this planning process," states Arlen P. Kennedy, Socorro BLM District Manager.

A pinch of planting!

Quickly plant your beets now. They do not grow well in hot weather. Sow seeds 1/2 inch deep, in-soil that will not crust. If you have a light soil that dries out rapidly, soak the seeds before planting. It's best to plant a 10 ft. row every week or two through out the growing season.

Also your carrots-they can be planted in a week or so, the seeds must be fresh always sow a few more than you will need. It will help to soak the seeds also. Your recipe this week: Rainbow Pie

1-3 oz. pkg. orange jello.

- 1-3 oz. pkg. black rasberry 1-3 oz. pkg. lime jello
- 3 cups boiling water
- 1/2-3 cup melted butter 2 cups cold water
- 1 cup pineapple jice
- 1/4 cup sugar : 1-3 oz. pkg. lemon jello
- 1/4 '/2 cups grahm cracker crumbs
- 3 pkg. dream whip

Prepare the orange, black rasberry, and lime flavors of jello, separately using 1 cup boiling. water and ½ cup cold water for each. Rour each flavor in to an 8" square pan and chil until firm. Combine pineapple juice and sugar and heat until sugar is desolved. Remove from heat. Add lemon jello and stir until desolved, add remaining ½ cold water chill until slightly thickened. Mix crumbs and butter press on to bottom of 9" springform pan and bake at 350 for 5 min. cool. Cut firm jello into 1/2" cubes, prepare dream whip and fold into slightly thickened lemon jello. Fold in jello cubes and pour mixture into springform pan. Chill until firm, at least 5 hr. or over night. To serve, remove sides of pan and cut desert into wedges-serves 16.



News from the **County Agent**

Dr. Arlo Richardson, Metorologist at Utah State University last Friday reviewed the Bloom Delay Demonstration at the A. T. Pfingsten orchard. He felt that the blooms on the demonstration plot had been delayed a full two weeks. The red delicious apple trees have already bloomed where they were not sprinkled. whereas the sprinkled trees were in the green leaf spray. Incidently the blooms on the unsprinkled red delicous trees have already lost their-fruit-in-the-freeze-on-Easter-weekend:-

Dr. Richardson noted that many of the trees were slow leafing out and blooming. This is because the apple trees did not have enough cold weather to complete their normal dormant requirement. He also related the growing degree hours needed before the tree will break dormancy and how sprinkling at this time is most beneficial if the grower wants to delay blooms. This same principle will work with any fruit tree.







Mr. Wright served as county treasurer in Lincoln County, N.M., for eight years. He worked as an electrical engineer for gold mining industries.


