United States alone, more than 500,000 persons: died of influenza or its complications. Within a few years, however, this. particuilar strain of virus disappeared from humans and was
found only in swine found only in swine - hence the name, swine influenza." Then, last winter,
an outbreak of influenza at Fort Dix was found to be caused by the "swine flu" virus. About 500 cases. were
recorded, one of which resulted death. recorded, one of which resulted death.
Q. Can we be sure there will be an
