#### Abstract

Within the last six years, New Mexico has become an area of interest to many involved in the search for productive sites of geothermal energy: Geothermal energy, literally "earth heat,' is the heat generated in th he surface. Areas where there is an abormalconcentration of this heat; or "hot spots" are often associated ears) volcanic activity few millio mountain building The western Unite States - including New Mexico-is just just such an area, and for these just such an area, and for these reasonns, several sites near Las Cruces have becom exploration.
