Another very serious consequence of drought in New Mexico is the increase in shrubby species, such as
mesquite and' creosote. Onice these shrubs become established, they may dominate an area indefinitedly and stop rapid range improyement.
Broom snakeweed has also increased considerably on many
southern New Mexico ranges. The southern New Mexico ranges. The weed
appears to be somewhat cyclic with the reproductive potential to increase rapidly when conditions are favorable. The toxic properties of broom
snakeweed also present additional management hazards for livestock from the many poisonous plants tha are available during drought conditions
when the better forage plants are weakened or not growing.
