consistsis of an advertisement which offers a product at a ridiculously low price equently assuring that there are "no strings attached" or offering a "mone peck guarantee" as evidence of bonesty. When the customer responds to the ac he finds that.the merchandise advertised is of the lowest quality imaginable an the sales man is the first to point out its obyious falls. Once the customer in m to buy a "slighty higher" model which is of better quality. The key word here are "slighthly higher" because the model which the salesman tries to
"switch" the customer to is invariably "slighly highe" hhan the same tem of "switch" the customer to is inyuriably "sl.

Contests are a perennial favorite with the crafty merchandiser. The typica ake contest is one in which everyone enters wins a prize. This prize is usually in merchandise. Such contests usually use such things as telephone quizzes. If you don't get the answer on the first try, you are often given a second chance and maybe even a broad hint even though the question is one of fifth grader shoul know. When the contest is conducted on radio the first 10,25 , or 50 persons to cal redit voucher. Acutally everyone who calls in will receive a prize an nvestigators have discovered that in many cases persons who dellberately sen in "wrong" answers also got the "prize". The reason for this, of course, is tha he price of the article of merchandise, minus the "prize" discount is far above
its honest retail value.

Door-to-door salesmen have always come in for their fair share of abuse om the pubilc, but hey have oten relurned that abuse in kind. of course, the number of years, but the unscrupulous salesman is quife another matter. The can often bespotted through certain standard approaches. Frequently, they pose uota of items to dispose of and they only have one or two left when they reac our hosuse. Others are veterans or representatives of some other group designed to elicit sympathy. Many gain admission to the house by insisting tha they are conducting a survey or some other non-sales function and may at firs
even staunctly insist they they are selling nothing. The thing to remember is that the salesman ios not honestly there is a better than even chance that the product or service he is selling will not measure up to expectations. 1ryou

says Robert 0 . Coppedge, Extension ays Robert O. Coppedge, Extension University.
Farm mechanization and technology have increased farm size and reduced arm populations. This has caused a nurnber of employees' in farm communities.
Due to the economics of size and
cale, specialized operations grow in larger towns, Better roads and vehicles have made rural customers more mobile so they can take advantage of the lower costs and better towns, explains economist.
However, the energy However, the energy crunch' may offset the case of travel, says Coppedge. The increased cost of fuel, vehicles and to larger towns may favor the state's smail towns.

Mineral development of coal, oll, copper and uranium and the retirement centers may help increase the populations of some towns. Small towns concerned with adding business and service firms should

## Protect Your Garden

Frosts will kill your home garden plans and vegetables, but not the disease causing organisms, that must kill them yourself, says Emroy New Mexico State University.
Powdery mildew, rusts and other leaf and stem disease organisms can special overwintering structures. These can survive in plant debris.
If the debris is allowed to remain on the soll's surface, organisms have a good chance to live through the winter and into next season. This can cause encountered this year.
A good clean up of garden refuse helps prevent infection of spring plants.
Plow down or compost the lant Plow down or compost the plant
material. Either practice helps destroy disease-causing organisms.
However, composted material should remain idle for at least two seasons before being returned to the soil, This is
especially true if diseases especially true if diseases have been prevalent in the garden. Burn
discard plant material that is severly discard plant material that is severly
infected with disease organisms. Dor't low or compost them.
Some disease-causing organisms are present in the soil, so destroying plant maspect a soll-borne disease in your garden, consider treating the soil with a camigant, such as Vapam. be avoided by using a
crop rotation or by planting resistant
varieties, Move plants around from one area to another to ayoid build up of sease-causing organisms.
Many vegetable roots are often infested with root knot nematode These microscopic worms cause galis. and knots on the roots. You can reduc this problem by plowing or pulling ou
