showed Bruce King with a slight edge the difference between the two candidates had dropped steadily since the previous poll. In fact, they are so close together now that, utilizing the
plus or minus four percentage points plus or minus four percentage points
Which are built into the polting process the race is, for all intents and purposes a dead beat.
But there's one trouble with polls of
his kind: most of them are made by
picking up the telephone and calling people. That means you have to be the results, So phone to be counted in can say about such a poll is that "this is the way telephone subscribers in New Mexico are likely to vote on November
What about all the rest of the folk the kind who don't subseribe to Ma Bell, or who khodon't subscribe to Ma Bell,
whe their phone numbers secret? Nobody knows what they're

Statehouse is a super tight ane; it may be long past midnight on November 7.8
before that one is decided. So one or two persons polled or not polled can make a result of that one. One group which may make a big difference are what we may call though not very politely the liars,
