Taxpayer's who choose not to do the own Federal income tax returns should be careful when choosing a tax return preparer, the Internal Revenue Service
says While most tax return preparers responsibility involyed in completing a -The-TRS-cautions-taxpayers-to-b particularly suspicious of preparers relationship with the IRS or knowledge of ways to beat the system. Othe preparers who shoild be avoided in clude ones who guarantee refunds or who claim they know methods.

The IRS cites certain basic precautions taxpayers should take when dealing with any tax preparèr. For example, a blank tax return or on prepared in pencil should not be signed
