Set for 1981---

School Board, Mill Levy and Bond Issue Elections

The Carrizozo Board of Education at their December 16 meeting adopted three resolutions that would clarify and supersede the resolutions passed at their November 18 regular board meeting. Paul Cassidy, representing Quinn & Company, was present at last week's meeting. Cassidy was appointed as the Board's financial advisor last month.

The three resolutions are: (1.) school board election; (2.) public school capital improvement tax election (2 mill levy) and (3.) school bond election. These are to be on the ballot on Tuesday, February 3, 1981.

The bond issue and mill levy money, if obtained, will be used primarily to remodel the existing high school building. Superintendent Miller and the Board discussed remodeling priorities and agreed on the following: (1.) Re-wiring the forty-year-old high school building. (2.) Replacing inside and outside doors, frames and locks. (3.) Window replacement. (4.) Remodeling boys and girls restrooms in the hallway. (5.) Handicapped accessibility. (6.) Remodeling the Science Lab. (7.) Remodeling the office area. (8.) Passive solar heating system. (9.) New hallway floor. (10.) Roofing. (11.) Fire alarm system. (12.) Remodeling dressing rooms. (13.) Replacing vocational equipment. (14.) Face uplift on high school entrance.

Candidates for membership on the board of education should file a declaration of candidacy in the office of the superintendent after the first publication of the resolution and

before 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 30, 1980. The superintendent and the board will determine whether a candidate is a qualified elector of the state residing within the school district. Deadline for withdrawal of candidacy is 5:00 p.m. Friday, January 9, 1981.

In other school business, Miller expressed public appreciation to

Phillip Ortiz, proprietor of the 'Little Store' (Mal Pais Grocery) and the Gallacher Ranch for storing frozen foods from the school cafeteria when the freezer broke down. Miller extended thanks to Jerry Peckinpaugh for his work on the recent Junior Varsity basketball tournament, to Wesley Lindsay for repairing the TV studio burglar alarm system and to

principal Steve Stuart for the efficient way he handled a small electrical fire that occurred recently in the high school building.

The board approved the employment of two: a head cafeteria cook, Charlotte Archuleta and an occupational therapist, Geraldine Larrington. Larrington is already serving Ruidoso schools and the New

Mexico School for the visually handicapped.

Dr. Miller recommended that the district join the Research and Study Committee, a conglomerate that bids school and custodial supplies for schools. Motion carried unanimously.

Recreation Area . . . will remain open

The State Board of Finance approved a \$41,000 interest-free loan to the Town of Carrizozo to continue operation of the Carrizozo Recreation Area, one mile west of town. The facility which included the golf course will remain open at least until the next fiscal year, July, 1981.

Carrizozo's mayor Manuel Hernandez, Town attorney Bill Payne and Henry Vega, Recreation Area superintendent appeared before the State Board of Finance on December 19. They requested an emergency grant to keep the complex open and maintained while alternate funding is sought.

Although the grant was not approved, the board agreed to a \$41,000 loan. Hernandez told the NEWS that arrangements have not been made

concerning repayment. Hernandez said, "we bought ourselves some time. Meanwhile he and other town officials will look into grants for future funding."

Hernandez expressed "special thanks" to Al Romero, head of the local government division of the Department of Finance and Administration for his help in seeking funds for the Recreation Area. Romero accompanied the Town officials to the State Board meeting last Friday.

In other Town business Hernandez has appointed Carol Schlarb to the Town Clerk position vacated by Christine Chavez. Hernandez said his decision was based on the fact that Schlarb has been working under Chavez for some time now and already knows the bookwork.

Hernandez said that there would be no hiring to replace the position once held by Schlarb. Police Clerk, Rosemary Gallegos and Town Foreman Emilio Beltran would help out with Town Hall business until after the next fiscal year.

The Board agreed to hold the Superintendent's evaluation session during a closed session, January 20, 1981 with a 6:00 p.m. dinner meeting to be held at the Four Winds Restaurant.

Last week, the Zia Senior Citizens hosted a Christmas party for the first and second graders. The afternoon party at the center featured refreshments.

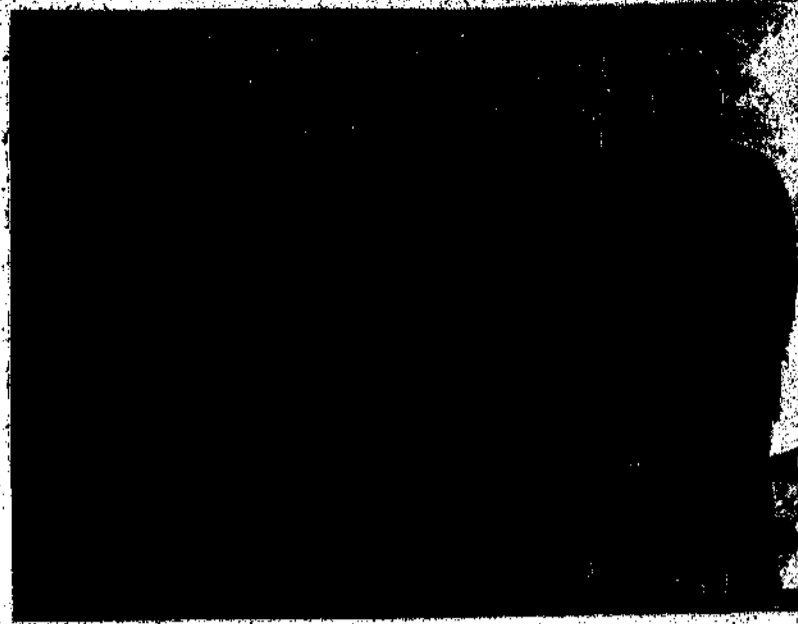

Army Offers Loans

The Army is now offering a college loan forgiveness plan which went into effect on Dec. 1, 1980, along with the new, free version of the Veteran's Educational Assistance Program.

According to Lieutenant Colonel Thomas Schatzman, commander of Army recruiting activities in New Mexico and West Texas, the Department of Defense will pay \$1500 or one-third (whichever is greater) of outstanding federal student loans for each year of active military service.

Shortage specialties are in fields involving high technology requirements such as electronic intelligence, radar applications, critical equipment repair, and the vital combat arms skills. These critical job areas, except for direct combat roles, said Schatzman, are open to women.

A member of an Army Reserve unit can have \$300 of student loans forgiven for each year of service. "since reservists serve only 38 days a year, a combination of one weekend a month and two weeks each summer, this program improves an already very attractive compensation package," said Mayor David Ansell, Reserve operations officer for New Mexico and West Texas.

Loans that will be forgiven are the Guaranteed Student Loan, Part B of the Higher Education Act of 1963 and the National Direct Loan, Part E of the Higher Education Act of 1965. The loan must have been made before the military service is performed and after Oct. 1, 1975.

Those who enlist after Dec. 1, 1980, and before Oct. 1, 1981, who score in the top 50 percent of the Armed Forces Qualifications Test, and who sign up for shortage specialties will be eligible for the educational loan repayment program.

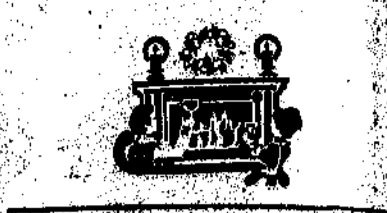

County Clerks Commended

New Mexico Secretary of State Shirley Hooper stated: "I wish to commend all of our county clerks for the good job they have done in their counties in administering the 1980 general election, the most complicated election in New Mexico for many years."

The 108,000 plus write-in votes cast in this election, the different placement of political parties on the ballot, and the six Constitutional Amendments required voters to spend more time casting their ballots. This, and the large increase in voting population in some precincts since the 1978 general election, caused long lines in several precincts throughout the state.

The large number of write-in votes to be canvassed, the several court orders for impoundment of ballots and the necessity of recounting absentee ballots in several counties increased the responsibilities of the county clerks and all election workers in administering the general election. Because of the responsible attitude and diligent efforts of the county clerks, their staffs and election workers, all the election results were ready for the State Canvassing Board when it met on Tuesday, November 25, 1980, the date set by law for the state canvass.

"This was an extremely difficult election for which to prepare, and I also commend my Bureau of Elections staff for the exemplary job they did under great pressure. We only have five employees in the Bureau office, with two additional part-time employees hired for approximately thirty days for the election.

"The biggest bouquet goes to the voters of New Mexico, who turned out in record numbers to cast their vote on election day and had the patience to stand in line. There was an overall 71 percent registered voter turnout, which is higher than the national average of approximately 64 percent. We had complaints, and some were justified, but overall, under the extremely difficult circumstances, the election went well. The voting system of New Mexico, with all of the checks and balances by law, performed exceptionally well in a very difficult election. And it certainly wasn't deadily dull!"

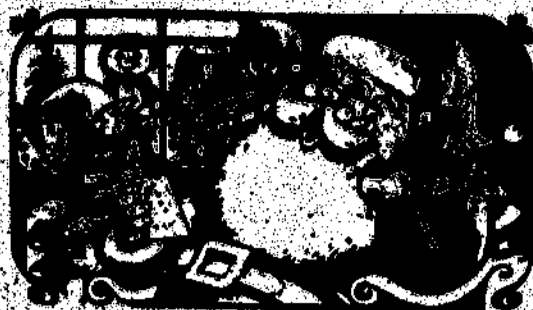

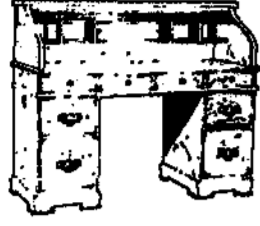

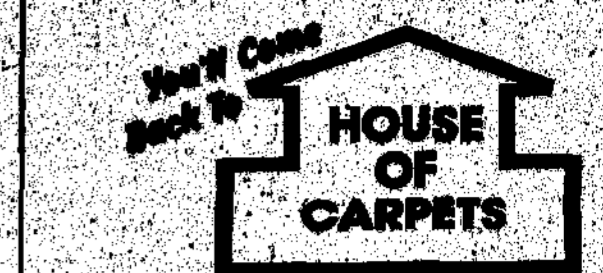
