

According to Lieutenant Colonel Thomas Schalzman, commander of combat roles, said Schalzman, 'are Army recruiting activities in New Mexico and West Texas, the Department of Defense will pay \$1500 or one-third(whichever is greater) of outstanding federal student loans for each year of active military service.

A member of an Army Reserve unit can have \$500 of student loans forgiven for each year of service. 'binco reservists serve only 38 days a year, a combination of one weekend a month and two weeks each summer, this program improves an aiready very attractive compensation package,' said blayor David Ansell, Reserve operations officer for New Mexico and West Texas.

Loans that will be foreign are the Guaranteed Student Loan, Part B of the Higher Education Act of 1963 and the National Direct Loan, Part E of the Higher Education Act of 1965. The loan must have been made before the military service is performed and after Oct. 1, 1975.

Those who enlist after Dec. 1, 1960, and before Oct. 1, 1961, who score in the top 50 percent of the Armed Forces Qualifications Test, and who sign up for shortage specialties will be eligible for the educational loan repayment program.



The large number of write-in votes to be canyassed, the several court orders for impoundment of ballots and the necessity of recounting absentee ballots in several counties increased the responsibilities of the county clerks and all election workers to administering the general election. Because of the responsible attitude and diligent efforts of the county clerks, their staffs and election workers, all the election results were ready for the State Canyassing Board when it met on Tuesday, November 25, 1980, the date set by law for the state canvass.

"This was an extremely difficult election for which to prepare, and I also commend my Bureau of Elections staff for the exemplary job they did under great pressure. We only have five employees in the Bureau office, with two additional part-time employees hired for approximately thirty days for the election.

'The biggest bouquet goes to the voters of New Mexico, who turned out in record numbers to cast their vote on election day and had the patience to stand in line. There was an overall 71 percept registered voter turnout, which is higher than the national average of approximately 54 percnt. We had complaints, and some were justified, but overall, under the extremely difficult circumstances, the election went well. The voting system of New Mexico, with all of the checks and balances by law, performed exceptionally well in a very difficult election. And it certainly wasn't deadly dulil'

NMSA 1978 (AS AMENDED AND IN COMPLIANCE THEREOF, RE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF **EDUCATION OF THE CARRIZOZO** MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 7. LINCOLN AND SOCORRO COUNTIES, NEW MEXICO, IN A REGULAR OPEN MEETING ASSEMBLED THIS 10th DAY OF DECEMBER, 1980, as follows:

Section 1. Regular meetings of the Board of Education of the Carrizozo Municipal School District No. 7, Carrigoso, shall hereafter be held on the third Tuesday of each and every month at the hour of 7:30 p.m., in the Conference Room of the School Administration Building, 800 D. Avenue in Carrisoco, New Mexico; in the event the third Tuesday of any month shall be an established national or state holiday, such meeting shall be held on the following night at the same hour and place.

Section 2. Special meetings of said Board of Education may be held by giving at least seventy-two (72) hours prior notice thereof of the date, time and place of such meeting.

Section 4. A copy of this Resolution shall be published once in the Lincoln County News and copies hersof shall be posted by the Superintendent at his office in Carrizozo, New Mexico and in the local Post Office, which shall con-

stitute notice of regular meetings of said Board of Education.

Section 5. Notice of special and emergency meetings of the Board of Education of said District shall be given by notice thereof whenever possible through kenouncement vis the Lincoln County News of Carrizozo,

New Mexico, as follows:

A. At least seventy-two (72) hours prior to the holding of a special mosting by including in such annomicement the purpose or purposes called, and the hour and place where each special meeting will be held; and

B. Of emergency meetings by means of amouncement thereof via the Lincoln County News of Carrizozo. New Mexico, as soon as possible after the need of calling such emergency meeting arises; and stating the purpose for which said emergency meeting is called. Section 6. As an alternative to the
