## C'zozo School Board Meeting--

### Bus Route Adjusted

The Carrizozo Board of Education, at their regular meeting last week, discussed graduation requirements and course content. At present a minimum of twenty (20) credits are required for graduation. Language, Arts, Math, Social Studies, Physical Education and Practical Arts make up the 20 required credits.

A special meeting of the Board of Education will be held on Thursday, October 2 at 7:00 p.m. in the District Conference Room. The purpose of the meeting is a Board of Education study session of the curriculum area. This public meeting will involve no action on the part of the board. Instead, the board will be studying such curriculum issues as graduation credits, transfer credit, course offerings, and other items in the curriculum area.

The meeting is open to the public. Interested citizens are encouraged to attend and express their views on this important area of student education.

In other board business, another stop was added to the Nogal bus which turns at the Country Club to pick up students living in this part of town. Three families who reside south of the railroad tracks were on hand at the September 16 board meeting to request the adjustment on this bus route. The people who explained to the board the need for the bus stop at 15th and H were Mr. and Mrs. Ruben Zamora, Mrs. Jesse English and Mr. and Mrs. George Vega.

The Bingham bus route extension as requested by area ranchers at last month's board meeting has not been acted on. This request requires an additional 56 miles of bus service. Approval from Santa Fe is needed for an extension on the established route.

In other transportation business the board tabled an adjustment request by the Gallacher family regarding the northern bus route.

Superintendent Miller gave the

board a report on the Vocational Advisory Committee meeting held this month. Guest speaker at the committee meeting was Mr. Dan Lopez executive director of the State Advisory Council on vocational education.

Miller gave the board a brief account of the local committee's involvement in vocational education. "They want the board to see, first hand, what they're doing," Miller added. Board member Richard Vega was appointed by the board to the Vocational Advisory Committee.

In his Superintendent's report, Miller also informed the board that enrollment is still short by 10 to 14 students. He has put a freeze on all purchases because of this.

Miller, at the September 16 meet recognized the following for assisting the school district in various areas; Scott Shafer, Buckley Zumwalt and Bob Hemphill. Miller expressed appreciation also to Belco Industries for the motor they donated to the Vo-ag department.

Board member Gail Stackpole presented a resolution last November in Roswell at the State Convention. The resolution that Stackpole brought up concerned the extension of the amount of time required for a teacher to give notice for not returning to teach. Stackpole has not been contacted on action taken in regard to her resolution.

The board moved to submit a resolution to the State School Association stating that there should be two kinds of resolutions for State Convention presentation: 1) Position Resolution which would express opinion. 2) Action Resolution to be acted on by the State Association to bring about change.

Math teachers Robert Shantz and Bob Hemphill gave a math program presentation to board members. Shantz outlined three levels of math

for all grades, from Functional (every day math) to Special (for superior students who need advanced math). The math teachers explained the advantages of the micro-computer which will soon be used in the school. They said that today there is more computer usage at all levels and Carrizozo students can now be introduced to this system. They said several merchants in town operate computers to handle business.

The board approved the bids for a micro-computer purchased from C and S Electronic Mart in Milan, Michigan and a tractor from Pecos Valley Equipment Inc. of Artesia.

Future bid opening dates are being planned for next month for the purchase of two trucks for use in maintenance and vo-ag departments.

The school made a donation of kitchen equipment to New Horizons and the board approved the 80-81 school inventory.

### Sub-division Near Capitan

A new sub-division has opened up two miles south of downtown Capitan and off highway 48 to Ruidoso. The sub-division will be named 'Mountain View' No. I and II. Most of these lots will be improved and offered for sale by Atwood Realty of Ruidoso.

Vernon Goodwin, who resides at Elmbrook Village in Ruidoso opened this first sub-division for homesites in Capitan. "The sub-division is primarily for mobile homes, but not restricted, too," Goodwin says.

The living conditions are ideal for the year round, "as well as for second homes," Goodwin added. He said great potential for this part of Lincoln

### Interception Hurts Grizzlies--

### C'zozo Battles Hatch to Tie

What appeared to be a big break in the opening kick-off, when the Grizzlies recovered a Hatch fumble, was quickly turned into six points by a Bear defensive back. The Hatch player returned an errant Grizzly pass back some 80 yards for a touchdown with but thirty-six seconds gone in the first quarter. A pass off a fake kick was good for the two-point conversion, and the Carrizozo squad found itself trailing for the first time this season.

Carrizozo came right back after receiving the ensuing kickoff, but a fumble at the Hatch twenty-seven yard line killed a good looking drive. Later on in the latter part of the first quarter the Grizzlies again drove to the Hatch twenty-eight yard line before the Bears' defense stiffened and forced the Grizzlies to turn possession over.

ball for the Grizzlies' touchdown. Halfback Larry Beltran then blasted into the end zone for the tying two-point conversion.

Second half action saw the Grizzlies take the opening kick-off all the way down to the six yard line on the strength of a twenty yard pass completion from Chris Ventura to Larry Beltran and the running of Aguilar and Ferguson, but the Grizzlies had to give up the ball after being stopped on a fourth-and-two situation.

The Grizzlies gave it another try in the third quarter after Ventura hooked up with tight end Steven Payne on a twenty-five yard gainer. Beltran followed that up with a twelve yarder on a fourth down fake punt, plus an eighteen yard gain on a sweep, taking the ball to the Hatch twenty-one yard line. Gabe Samora gained five yards on first down to the sixteen before the Grizzlies lost two to the eighteen. Larry Beltran then tried a thirty-five yard field goal on fourth down and came within six-inches of kicking it through the uprights.

The last quarter was filled with penalties on both squads with Hatch blowing a golden opportunity after stopping the Grizzlies at the Grizzly twenty-four yard line on a fourth-and-one situation, but a clipping penalty and two incomplete passes from the sixteen yard line failed, turning the ball over back to Carrizozo.

Leading ball carriers for Carrizozo were Jon Aguilar with 88 yards, Matt Ferguson with 44 yards and Larry Beltran with 43 yards. Defensively the Grizzlies were led by

defensive end Joe Curtiss, linebackers Beltran and Aguilar and defensive back Moises Sambrano.

Coch Koller's squad will travel to Mountainair Friday for their first district game of the season to do battle with the Mustangs, who are 1-2 on the season after falling to powerful Tatum 21-0 last Friday. Game time is 7:30 p.m.



County as a homelife for the retired, young and middle income is foreseen.

Goodwin said that water is the number one problem for the southwest part of the United States, but with cooperation among all segments this problem can be reduced to a minimum. 
