ravchers will continue to fece the old price-cost battle, but won't
have to contend with serious have to
drought
"Nobody knows exactly what's going to happen in the next 10 years, but if the rancher know he can outline strategies and seek alternatives to deal with these conditions," हaid Dr. James R Gray, an agricultural economist at NMSU's Agricultural Experiment
Station Gray Gray and fellow agricultural
nomist Dr. John M. Fowler recently outlined the conditions ranchers can expect to face in the 1880's. The researchers based their forecasts on historical trends and agricultural economics studies.

be very favorable through the next 10 years.

According to Gray and Fowler, rancliers could weather the price decine by accumulating some to 1884 boom years to carry them through the bust years of 1885 to 1889:'
"Òne way to increase cash reserves," Gray said, "is to
liquidate some of the 'paper profti' tied up in land investment." Lquidation also would ease cash flow problems created by depressed cattle prices and higher production costs. "Ranchers with getting less than 1 percent profit return," he said.
