- WHAT ,HPPENED 45 years Ago won't interest many of the young to-middleage croyd, except that what happened then was NYAing and WPAing us put of the Great Depression. Clyde Tingley was Governor of New Mexico. I was starving to death in Lovington and desirous of attending the University of New Mexico as a means of lessenimg hunger pains. New Mexico operated under the "spoils system"; That means some local and all state government jons went to members of whatever political party relgned in mission, He sent me to see Gov. Tingley, a gruff and gravelly voiced import from Ohio who came West to die and lived a long and eventutlife, much to the embarrassmerit of his physicians. I told Tingley Indeded a job at the university to pay my way through He called UNMI President Zimimerman on the phone and told him I had to have a job at Fi5 a month. Zimmeran responded that the highest paid job was $\$ 30$ a month, and none existed for $\$ 75$. "Then, by God,", That's how I became the first postmaster at the University of New Mexico at a salary of $\$ 75$ a month. It was also the beginining of my political education.
- IN THOSE days a person yearned for a state job because he was assured of a regular paycheck for at least four years, if he a state job one had to receive the endorsement of his county Damocratic chairman. It then went to the state chairman whoevaluated the application-meaning, was this a good Democrat and how many votes can he control.
- IT WAS a gaod system. The work got done. Nobody stole ny more then than they do now. A state worker lived a good life. If his party was lurned ont after four years, there-was a streant of old workers crowding highways out of Santa Fe and a stream of new workers coming in. It looked hike a refugee column. The prevailing philosophy at that.time was that a person working for thestate had
four years to establish connections in the private sector and be rewarded with a job in some business or industry. It a person didn't have the guts and gumption to latch onto an honest job in four years, he moved out and made room for somebody who could. Fair enough.
- 1 THRUST myself into this rarified political climate by becoming president of the Young Democrats on University Hill. In the 1938 elections my job to justify my party membership was to ride "sholgun" on a truck full of men whose job it was to visit sevenoling places, bail out of the truck, go in and vate the names of after which $I$ would give each a few one-dollar bills from an orange crate full of them. The going price of a vole was two bucks a head. If the eiection got close the price went up to five dollars. I never earned exactly who furnished the money to buy these voles. The rate of bills came with the truck
- aFter an exhausting day of herding these people to the polls, I had time to drive back to the university polling place and cast my own ballot. I gave the clerk my name. "Sorry." he said tames, some dirty rate gave me the same treatment. My respec for the system was increasing.
- NEW MEXICO must have had the greatest percentage of oter turnout in the nation in those days. The Albuquerque paper voles cast in the state election exceeded the number of registered voters by an astounding number! There was a rumor that ranchers on the Democratic east side of the state had registered their catt 0 vote. To couler this. Repubilican sheep ranchers north of sant
- I was in the office of the sheriff of Bernaliflo County on lection night when the sheriff got a telephone call that a Albucuerque school polling place. The sheriff got into his car an bunch of us followed in another. We "impounded" the ballot boxes and took them back to the High Sherff's office. I don't know what happened to the ballots, but I do know the Democratic candidate won. I was majoring in political science at the university. but from what I learned of "practical politics" I could have laught the course myself
- ALTHOLGB 1 was enjoying the fruits of political corruption. it finally dawned on me that what I was learning in college about our republican form of government wasn's compatible with the realities of New Mexico politics.
- ALL OF which ts why I don't trust career pollitictans today and why I think government, a necessary evil at best, is a monste nent is to protect its citizens from foreign and domestic enemies, and to provide a climate which will allow every person to achieve his potentlal - if he wants to. Government has no obligation to rob its citizens so that it may feed, clothe, house. educate, and amuse other people. It is not the duty of government to pay our doctor bills and subsidize our abortions. It is the duty of government to leave it -
- DURING THE adiministrationin of President Cleveland there was a severe drouth in West Texas. Cleveland was petitioned op provide $\$ 10,000$ in federal funds to aid stricken farmers. He
refused. saying: "It is the duty of the people to support the overnment, not the duty of the government to support the people." A rational mouthful.
- in succeeding issues of the Lincoln Cointy News you will detect the influence of my early days in New Mexico, and how came to suspect polities and politicians. And when I am called to
refer to one of them asa "lowdown, thieving, bloodsugking leech on the body politic." or some other term of endearment, you will know arrived at the correct appeliation from 45 yeais of watching them closely.

## Farmers, ranehers facing tough decisions in 1982

"Although 1981 was a disaster for many farmers and ranchers, ond aearyy a disaster for the whote problem right now is how to make the best of the situation in 1882,' said James Libbin, Extension agricultural economist at New Mexico State University.
"The factors that burt both crop and investock sectors of 1982," Libbin satid. "And the outlook f6r 1982 indicates another year of very low comoodity prices and farm and ranch income." Interest rates have dropped silghtly from 1981 highs, but they are still high enough to cause increasing as fast as in the past, and fertilizer prices haven'l gone up as sharply in the past two years.

With skyrocketing tuition costs and tightening restrictions on loan
eligibility, many seniors may find eligibinity, many seniors may find battle at the coilege finance office. The Army College Fund may be the solution.
According to Lu. Col Robert C. Karlgeng, commander of Army

"Even with these moderating worth the time to work through a cost increases, the low crop and series of crop or livestock budgets
livestock prices are squeezing all to find the profit potential of every the proitit out of a farm or ranch,", Libbln, sald. "The overriding theme for agriculture in 1882 will be - find a way to get by."

With fincome low and costs still high, Libbin recominends that armers and ranchers think long
and hard about major purchases in and har
${ }^{1882}$ " 1 If
"If a farmer or rancher can postpone a major land, equipment or building purchase for another year, It's going to improve his cash "And if major credit purchases can be avoided, the. high interest costs can be avoided until farm and ranch income has a chance to rebound."
"The best returns a farmer or ancher can get this year will be rom pencil pushing," he said. stocking decisions, it's going to be possible choice," he said.
"But be careful," Libbin said. "Budgeting is just forecasting an uncertain future - yields and prices never.turn out, exactly the:
way they were budgeted way they were budgeted .. so
consider a range of possible price and yield combinations." To get the best prices and livestock in 1982, farmers and ranchers will have to constder every marketing aiternative they can find. Forward contracting and hedging are only two possibilities
of many that might be considered. "Farmers and ranchers can"t afford to just sell, rather than market, thelr commodities this year," Libbin said.
The most important thing farmers and ranchers can do in the coming year is avoid waste in al
its forms.
