LAS CRUCES - Although new statewide funding package
here is national concern about the possible cutbacks in federal financial aid to college students. the picture in the state may not be as bleak as some parents and tudents are led to believe.
In a recent letter to high
chool counselors. Neu Mexico State University President (ierald W. Thomas said that he was worried that recent publicity on proposed financial aid cutbacks would distort the true precture for he coming academic year.

The cutbacks in financial and re for the $1983-84$ academuc year, not the $1982-83$ year as believed by many. Thonlas said that it is unfortunate that the total lunding of federal progranis for the coming acadennc year is about 7
percent less than last year, bua a
for higher education should take up part of the slack.

At the past session of the New Mexico Legislature a new work study program for higher education was approved and into consideration, Thonas said the overall funding wall remain
near the level of last year. President Thomas was also concerned that this negative impression would cause even a further decline in participation in higher education. He noted that in
New Mexico only 40 percent of ihe students in a given graduating class pursue some form of posisecondary education.
