Students will campus no earlier than 8.15 a.m. on that day. Classes will start at 8:30 a.m. each morning. Classes will be dismissed at $3: 05$ p.m. (elementary), 3:10 (mid-school)
and 3:15 (high school). and 3:15 (high school)
promptly after dismissal of high school students. Bus routes will rum at the same times as last year with exception of the Ancho-White Oaks route, which Mr. Roper will
