Public input sought

Town to apply for \$350,000 grant

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has \$9 million available for statewide use on the Community Development Block Grant - Small Cities Program (CDBG). Carrizozo will be eligible to apply for a grant of \$350,000 under this program.

Hubert Quintana of Roswell, director of the area's projects, was at Monday's special town hall meeting to discuss changes in this year's CDBG application. He told the council and audience how important it is for public participation at a CDBG hearing.

The eligible activities include the acquisition of real property for community development, conservation, rehabilitation or installation of neighborhood facilities, senior citizens centers and street, flood and drainage improvements. Other eligible activities are the rehabilitation and preservation of residential or commercial structures.

Quintana explained that the program consists of single purpose and comprehensive projects. The single purpose plan is for activity that requires one year to complete. A multitude of activities which require two to three years to complete come under "comprehensive."

Only one hearing is required this year and it's outcome aids the town council in deciding where the new money should be spent and what type of project will be attempted. The application is due Nov. 8, 1982.

Quintana will conduct the Oct. 11 public hearing. He will answer questions and explain the CDBG program. The purpose of the hearing, which starts at 6 p.m., is to let the council know the public's opinions and suggestions on how to use the money and to ensure that the greatest needs are identified for the benefit of the community. The regular scheduled town meeting will

follow the hearing.

At Tuesday's special meeting the council moved to advertise on bids for new space heaters needed at the Recreation Center. Lincoln County Arriba Inc. president Bill Payne was present to request town assistance in paying for the work, estimated to cost \$7,000. Payne explained that the center's solar system, when completed, will not be sufficient to heat the facility.

The agreement between the town and Arriba states that the town will be responsible for maintenance repairs over \$200. The council discussed using its portion of the Lodger's Tax reserved for the town's recreational purposes to help Arriba obtain the needed heaters. The cigarette tax money was also mentioned as a source of revenue.

Doyle Wood, the center's manager, gave the council a progress report. Wood said the facility is doing exceptionally well and soon the venture should prove

profitable.

The snack bar is open from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. and again at 5 p.m. until 10 p.m. The center is open until 12 p.m. each evening. Leagues bowl every evening and the ballroom is used by local groups. The homecoming dance is scheduled to be held there this Friday.

Trustee Jim Payne told the council that the local women's golf association is considering helping the town run the pro shop on weekends. The shop is closed now and no golf carts are rented because of lack of money to pay a town employee. The women will discuss with the town at a later date of their plans to do volunteer work at the golf course.

A town resident has been ordered to remove two hogs which he has penned within the town limits. The man has until Oct. 11 to remove the swine or be subject to penalties listed in the ordinance book. This action was the result of

a complaint by a neighbor who objected to the offensive odor coming from the livestock.

Stearns has held a real estate

broker license for more than 25 years. He and his wife Margaret have three children, all natives of Carrizozo: Bob, Judy Glover and Linda Gibson.

The public is invited to join the WOHA members to hear Stearns' experiences that go back to 1904 when his father, Orsa

Stearns, was employed by the El Paso & Southwestern Railroad as a switchman at Carrizozo, and

later became general yardmaster at Carrizozo with the Southern Pacific.

Johnson graduated from Carrizozo schools in 1936 and went to work for the railroad the same year as a clerk-stenographer. During World War II he transferred to train service as a brakeman and served as terminal trainmaster at the Carrizozo shops. He was transferred back to office work and in 1948, while still

employed at the depot in Carrizozo, began working part time for Citizens State Bank.

In 1952 he accepted fulltime employment with the bank at Vaughn. He resigned in 1957 to become Town Clerk at Carrizozo. In 1961 he went back into the bank on a fulltime basis.

White Oaks was a booming gold mining town in the late 1800's that boasted a population of 2,500 with churches, a bank, opera house, lodges, saloons and retail

stores. When the El Paso and Northern Railroad decided to bypass White Oaks, the town slipped into quiet repose. The settlement is now the site of the annual White Oaks to Lincoln Pony Express Race.

Concession stands and arts and crafts booths will be a part of the festivities.

Master of ceremonies for the event is Jim Firth of KRER radio Ruidoso.

Camping areas will be available with free parking and dumping stations for recreation vehicles.

Cost of the event is \$10 per person for Saturday and Sunday. For Sunday only, the cost is \$7 per person. Most of the proceeds will be donated to the White Oaks Museum for expansion.

Bingaman hears ranchers

Ranchers fighting for return of their land taken by the federal government 40 years ago for the White Sands Missile Range met here with Attorney General Jeff Bingaman last week.

Bingaman promised the 50 ranchers who gathered at the Recreation Center that he would look into the legality of the government taking state lands, but could do nothing about federal land involved.

Among those presenting their cases that the government had not honored its agreement to return their lands or provide adequate compensation for them included Mary McDonald, Dave McDonald, Florence and Frank Martin, Wally Ferguson, Roy Tucker Jr.,

Bob Jones, president of the New Mexico Cattle Growers Assn., and Denny Gentry, the organization's secretary.

The approximate 90 families involved in the controversy, made the points that the 1942 lease agreements with the government state that ranches and mines will be returned to their owners in good condition, with all improvements restored, if not, then full market price for the property is asked, a third option, if the government refuses either, is the right to co-use their property, and that the appraisals allegedly made by the Corps of Engineers as to the value of the various properties was never made, and if made, are fraudulent.

The ranch and mine owners will meet with Cong. Joe Skeen in Roswell, Oct. 13, 9 a.m., at the Federal Building to present their case.

Farmers, ranchers to select ASC committee

Farmers and ranchers have been asked to nominate candidates of their choice to be on the Lincoln County ASC Committee. ASC committees are responsible for managing government farm programs on the local level. To meet the needs of individual producers, ASC committee members must be concerned and responsible individuals. Allen K. Trammell, county executive director, said petitions were mailed to all known farmers and ranchers on Oct. 5.

A few basic considerations should be kept in mind when circulating petitions. Trammell said in order to be valid, petitions must be limited to one nominee each, must include written certification that the nominee is willing to serve if elected and must be signed by at least three eligible farm voters in the county. Petitions must be received in the county office no later than Nov. 1. Farmers may circulate or sign nominating petitions for as many candidates as they choose. Anyone may contact the Lincoln County ASC's office at 648-2887 for more details concerning the election, eligibility to vote and eligibility requirements for office holders.

Robert B. Means of Carrizozo was flown by helicopter to Veterans Hospital in Albuquerque Sunday morning suffering from a mild heart attack.

At last report he is in stable condition, but the hospital will not permit telephone calls (cards and letters, however, can be sent to him in care of the hospital).

Trammell explained that the opportunity to nominate, vote and be elected to office is guaranteed to all farmers regardless of race, religion, sex, age, color or national origin.

A list of the names of all known eligible persons to receive ballots in the upcoming annual ASC committee election is available in the county ASC's office. This year's election will be by mail ballot between Nov. 26 and Dec. 6.

Anyone who meets the following requirements is eligible to vote in these farmer committee elections: any individual of legal voting age with an interest in a farm as owner, tenant, or sharecropper who is eligible to participate in any ASCS program.

Several general provisions relate to ASCS voter eligibility. Any person under legal voting age can vote if he or she runs a farm, and a legal guardian who runs a farm for a child can vote for the child. The spouse of an eligible voter is also eligible to vote.

A person may cast a ballot in any county in which he or she is an eligible ASC voter.

Land bank lowers rate

The Federal Land Bank of Wichita has announced a reduction of one-fourth of one percent in the rate charged on all its new and existing variable interest agricultural loans.

The rate will drop to 12.75 percent from 13 percent effective Nov. 1. The announcement was made by Federal Land Bank President M. K. Mathews Jr.

Since Oct. 1, 1981, all variable rate land bank loans have been billed at 13 percent, the highest rate ever charged in the bank's history. The rate reduction will result in a savings of approximately \$1 million a month to farmer-rancher borrowers in the four-state area served by the Federal Land Bank of Wichita.

"As a part of the nationwide cooperative Farm Credit System, the land bank obtains loan funds through the sale of Farm Credit Banks Systemwide bonds and discount notes to the investing public," Mathews pointed out. "Absolutely no government funds are involved."

The Federal Land Bank of Wichita is a farmer-rancher owned agricultural lending cooperative which specializes in long-term real estate loans. On Sept. 1, the bank had 67,832 loans outstanding for \$5.2 billion in unamortized principal. These loans are made and serviced by 40 federal land bank associations located in Kansas, Oklahoma, Colorado, and New Mexico.

Since July, 1969 all land bank loans have been made on a variable interest rate plan which allows the billing rate to fluctuate up or down during the term of the loan depending on money-market conditions. "Such a policy protects farmers from irregularities in the money supply and ensures the lowest possible cost of borrowing," Mathews said.

During the past 13 years the land bank's billing rate has changed 18 times, moving up on 12 occasions, down on the other six, and ranging from a low of 7.5 percent to a high of 13 percent.

'Don't buy Tylenol at this time'

The State Health Officer has announced that, based on information from the drug manufacturer, he is recommending that extra-strength Tylenol not be used, taken or purchased at this time.

While no cases of cyanide poisoning related to extra-strength Tylenol have occurred outside the Chicago area, the recommendation not to take the drug is a precaution.

Extra-strength Tylenol is a brand name and refers to one type of non-aspirin reliever. There is no evidence that any other non-aspirin pain reliever is involved, according to Lionel L. Richardson, District VI health officer. His office will release further information as it becomes available.



Editorial Comment

Punishing draft offenders

There are a half-million young men who have failed to register for the draft as required by law. Several have already been convicted and sentenced to prison for failure to comply with the draft law.

This is a cumbersome, costly and time-consuming way to punish 500,000 men who have defied the law.

We suggest an alternate punishment. Instead of sending them to prison to be supported by taxpayers, why not deprive all 500,000 of them of their right to vote or hold public office for a term of, say, 15 years? This way they would also lose media publicity, the adulation of their peers, and other trappings of martyrdom.

Revocation of these civil rights is not without precedent. Not long ago the law required that no person living in the District of Columbia could vote. Neither could members of the armed forces. Not only were the military denied the right to vote, but they could not seek public office. And that "penalty" was for men in the service of their country! Too, any person convicted of a crime was deprived of his right to vote.

The US Constitution demands that Congress provide for the common defense of the nation, and Article 1 empowers Congress to make such laws. Congress has done so with this

draft law. Obviously, individuals cannot obey only laws of which they approve, any more than a soldier can be permitted to fight only battles of his choice.

Furthermore, draft evaders do not automatically get drafted into the armed forces simply by registering. If they have legitimate conscientious objection to serving in the armed forces they will be excused from combat duty.

Registration is simply a means of ascertaining the number and names of persons who may later be called to service in case of war or other national emergency. Certainly, a nation cannot be faulted for taking a census of persons available for national defense.

We suggest the ignoble 500,000 are simply making an "anti-war statement" by failing to register, and cashing in on the publicity that furthers their frequent and fervid anti-war demonstrations that delight our enemies.

Stripping them of their right to vote and hold public office for a set number of years is, we believe, fit punishment. It is also one that would allow none to escape the consequences of the crime, for there is no way we can go about imprisoning a half-million men longing to become martyrs to their cause.

Anaya aide replies

EDITOR—I read with interest your editorial in which you use Mr. Erick's distorted information regarding The Toney Anaya Campaign's advertising and printing costs.

Put quite simply, the allegations are not true. The advertising budget for media was all sent back to New Mexico to purchase radio, television and newspaper ads. Because of the nature of relationships between ad agencies and media outlets, Mr. Anaya had to pay the agency which in turn paid New Mexico media outlets. No money at all was spent on out of state media outlets, in direct contrast to Mr. Erick, who spent money on Texas media. Finally, only one brochure out of numerous printing jobs was printed out of state, and only because of the "rush" nature of one particular job that did not permit sending proofs back and forth; Mr. Anaya purchased all other printing, including brochures, stationery, bumper stickers, cards, yard signs, novelty items, etc., in New Mexico.

Mr. Anaya's campaign continues to follow the theme Mr. Anaya established during the Primary, which is, "Keep It Clean." We continue to address the issues in New Mexico, whereas our opponent seems to spend his time attacking Mr. Anaya on baseless allegations.

I would respectfully request that in the future, in the interest of balance and fairness, you seek our side of the story before making statements that are intended to be responsible.

What I said was: "The only organization I know that exists for promoting the interests of white people is the Ku Klux Klan, and you know how the law and society in general regards it!" The implication, far from your interpretation, is that law and society have no use for the Klan, and that includes me. Thanks for writing.)

● A LAWYER, Ambrose Bierce once mused, is a person skilled in the circumvention of the law. He had a point. Members of Carrizozo's Crime Stoppers must have agreed, for at the organization's last meeting they gave Attorney Don Wall a courteous dressing down for being allied with a profession that specializes in stonewalling the law to free a crook. The Crime Stoppers are fed up with the vigorous defense of criminals and are prone to belabor lawyers for doing everything in their power to prove their clients innocent. It isn't Mr. Wall's fault, it's the system. Our legal system requires that an attorney provide the best possible defense for a client, and few should quarrel with that objective. However, it is not uncommon for attorneys' defense tactics to go beyond prudence, to inject irrelevances into their defense, stall and delay, and have been known to introduce testimony they know is baseless and sometimes downright false. The attorney can argue with logic that it is the duty of the trial judge to overrule these excesses. But judges are lawyers first and judges second, and sometimes prone to overlook practices which they themselves once employed.

● NO LAWYER defending a client is without a conflict of interest. First, he is obligated to provide the best defense for his client. On the other hand, he is an "officer of the court" and the court is concerned with law and justice in freeing the innocent and punishing the guilty. Therein lies the conflict. Most lawyers can fall when their clients are guilty, yet he is sworn to prove him innocent. If he provides a defense that frees a guilty person, has he not violated his position as an officer of the court, which requires that an offender be punished?

● THE Crime Stoppers' complaint is the time, talent and money spent to circumvent the law by acquitting a guilty person for such trivialities as faulty indictment, failure to read one's rights, unguarded statements that result in mistrials, the search warrant ritual, "not guilty by reason of insanity" and other foolishness. They are frustrated in that the lawyer is no less committed, legally and morally, to upholding the law as is the judge — yet he often ignores those moral and legal obligations to the law in his zeal to serve his client. He is, in a manner of speaking, serving two masters — his client and the court.

● THE GUILTY is entitled to as vigorous a defense as the innocent. But in doing so, it seems the lawyer is equally obligated to uphold the law which, if fulfilled, would convict his client. The court is dedicated first to ascertaining the truth in a case. Ideally, every lawyer should be interested in the truth whether it injures his client or not. Ideally, then, we would need no prosecutors and fewer lawyers, for there can only be one truth — not one truth for the prosecution and another for the defense.

● PRACTICALLY, however, elimination of the adversary stance of lawyers and prosecutors would destroy the existing legal bureaucracy by reducing the number of lawyers and undermining the fee system. Lawyers are captives of the existing legal system. People should understand that an attorney cannot defend only those persons he knows to be innocent. He would soon be without clients and beset with creditors.

● THE LAND of enchantment played host to a glittering galaxy of pernicious politicians last week. No real damage has been reported. US Senator Ted Kennedy, the "Hero of Chappaquiddick," hove into Albuquerque to boost the campaigns of Democratic candidates for Congress and to give aid and comfort to others who share the tarnished dream of a perpetually unbalanced federal budget, co-existence with communism, unilateral disarmament, the abolition of Big Business, and the notion that government is obliged to support all the people instead of vice versa. He was joined by US Senator Alan Cranston, California's venerable socialist who advocates giving away the national store, who assisted in the political haymaking and rallying of liberal troops. Over in Silver City, Generalissimo Ed Asner of M. Brezhnev's guerrilla army in El Salvador, was weeping in his hankie over the unemployment situation in Grant County. He weeps easily. More so this time, for he has recently been disemployed from the "Lou Grant" television show, a bit of foul luck he took with ill grace. On the academic level, Webster's Collegiate Dictionary has been banned in Carlsbad's secondary schools because it contains obscene words, the employment of which is a characteristic conspicuous among civilized tribes of the world. Students there must now take a giant step backward and learn their obscenities in less desirable climates, such as out behind the barn, in the company of bad companions, and by watching television shows. New Mexico Magazine tells about the well-loved dog citizens of Red River for whose protection speed limit laws are passed. His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, is here to dedicate the new Armand Hammer World College of the American West in Montezuma (whew!) New Mexico. Royalty lovers are groveling and curtsying all over the mesas. In Albuquerque, a man impatient with police for not recovering his stolen car, went out and retrieved it himself. Clovis is studied as a site for the MX missile while Albuquerque sighs with relief at being let off the hook. Clovis is gearing up to protest all the way to Washington. They want it in West Texas. I can settle the controversy. Put the gismo in my back yard — nobody has ever been hurt by a nuclear missile, which is more than can be said for rock and roll music, garter belts and hot air balloons.

● STILL IN New Mexico, Republican gubernatorial candidate John Erick announced his strong support for capital punishment and his Democratic opponent Toney Anaya was as strongly against same. Neither asked for my opinion, which is: if society could not take harsh measures against its malefactor's we would soon fall upon each other and beat each other's brains out until none of us were left standing. We are rapidly approaching this unhappy prospect because we tolerate the killing of innocents and forgiving those who do them in. The official slaughter of a few is not too high a price to pay for preservation of law and order in the human community. I refuse to argue the question of morality of a "vengeful society" or that capital punishment is no deterrent to crime. But I defy my compassionate friends to cite one instance where a murderer, once put to death, ever managed to kill again.

● UP IN Espanola a school board member, Tim Salazar, exercised his Hispanic right to utter racist nonsense which, had it been voiced by an Anglo, would result in hemorrhoidal explosion in the liberal sector. The gentleman informed his fellow board members: "I have nothing against Anglos, but I prefer my people to be teaching our children." Justly, the Rio Grande Sun, a very literate weekly newspaper, has demanded an apology from the racist, along with his resignation.

● A DOCTOR in Nambé has been sued for more than \$8,000 in back rent by his landlord. Doctors sometimes fall on evil times, something that can't be said for that doctor at Ruidoso Hospital who charged our friend \$140 for x-rays he couldn't read, so his victim had to go to Alamogordo and pay another doctor \$120 to tell him what the x-rays indicated. 'Hatchett' job on Episcopal hymnal

Led by a priest named Father Hatchett, if you please, the highest ruling body of the two million-member Episcopal Church has now ravaged its hymnal, hard on the heels of a similarly disastrous revision of its Book of Common Prayer.

The Rev. Marion Hatchett of Sewanee, TN, is chairman of the denomination's hymnal revision committee. He has led the Episcopal General Convention into one of the most massive ecclesiastical alterations since the Puritan troops of Oliver Cromwell went all over England trashing churches.

For Father Hatchett and his friends have taken the church's hymnal and thrown out 250 of the 600 hymns. And for anybody who may have thought that the Episcopal hierarchy has exhausted its capacity for spectacular foolishness, these banished hymns include several of the most beloved and beautiful in American Christendom: "Nearer My God To Thee," "Once To Every Man and Nation," "I Need Thee Every Hour," "Turn Back O Man," "On Our Way Rejoicing,"

"Almighty Father Strong To Save" (the second part of the Navy Hymn), "What A Friend We Have In Jesus" and "The Son Of God Goes Forth To War."

The General Convention — with the bishops voting unanimously — voted overwhelmingly to reject "The Battle Hymn Of The Republic."

They very nearly voted to mutilate the national anthem by eliminating the second verse, written by devout Episcopal layman Francis Scott Key, one of the founders of the now ultra-liberal Virginia Theological Seminary.

The Episcopalians are rewriting the lyrics of such beloved hymns as "Stand Up, Stand Up For Jesus" and "Onward Christian Soldiers" and "Rise Up O Men Of God." Henceforth, these three classics which managed to survive Father Hatchett's hatchet will be properly castrated, in order that "sexists" be eliminated. Henceforth, no Bella Abzug-type Episcopalian will have to endure the trauma of singing, "Brothers we are treading where the saints have trod." From now on it will

be, "Christians we are treading."

During an interview, Father Hatchett described the hymn "Rise Up O Men Of God" as "heretical." But he was not at all receptive to a suggestion that it might be revised to read: "Sit Down O Girls Of God" in order to provide some sexual reparations and at the same time eliminate any taint of Pelagian heresy. (Father Hatchett had noted that several of the excluded hymns were adjudged to be heretical.)

Father Hatchett went on to declare that "The Son Of God Goes Forth To War" is a hymn that "smacks of almost courting martyrdom" because of its tribute to the persecuted Christians of the early church who:

Met the tyrant's brandished steel,

The lions gory mane.

They bowed their necks the death to feel.

Who follows in their train?

Father Hatchett apparently prefers much less realistic and historic fare, such as "Poor Little Jesus Child."

One of the bishops who voted for this hymnodic heresy hunt was Newark, New Jersey's John Spong, a prolific writer who explains the resurrection of Jesus in terms of it being really an hallucination of St. Peter.

Considering the fact that nearly all of the writers of the allegedly heretical and sexist hymns are now deceased, it is clearly easier to disparage their devout expression of faith than it is for any Episcopal prelates to stand up to anyone as clever and powerful as Spong.

As for any people in the pews who happen to love these banished hymns, the bishops are usually held in such awe that Episcopal laity can generally be counted upon, regardless of the outrage, to pray, pay and obey.





includes the cookie recipe of Mrs. Johnnie Thomas of San Patricio. Her Oatmeal Crisps are very easy to "whip up" in time for breakfast. Warm oatmeal cookies and a glass of milk (or cup of coffee) hit the spot on cool October mornings.

Oatmeal Crisps
Ingredients: 1/2 cup shortening, 1/2 tsp. vanilla, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/2 cup granulated sugar, 1 well beaten egg, 1/4 tsp. soda, 1 1/2 cup flour, 1 cup oatmeal.

Combine shortening, vanilla, salt and sugars. Cream well, add egg and mix well. Sift soda and flour into creamed mixture. Add oatmeal. Drop on cookie sheet. Bake in moderate oven (350-375 degree) about 10 minutes.



For it is by giving that one receives,

It is by self-forgetting that one finds,

It is by dying that one awakens to eternal life."


'Sideline Coach of The Week'
