100 US Marines were killed and others injured when a truck loaded with explosives crashed into the Marine compund in a suledde mission staged by terrorists; persuasion unkinown, perhaps Druze, or Sunni, or Shlite, or Syrian, or PLO or

Developing nations have had rouble making interest payinents on the loans which in ernational banks have given them, and the Internationa Monetary Fund has stepped in to help. If the Fund had not don his, the very banks on which we and other liduss
Recently the Senate approved $\mathbf{5}$,695; which obligates the United States to contribute $\$ 8,4$ dilion more in funding for the IMF, Although I support the IMF's effortis in addressing the short-term, monetary problems
