clubs in Carrizozo, Capitan, Hondo and Corona. There is a right way and a wrong way to submit news to this newspaper or any weekly small town paper. A newspaper is a business, our system of free enterprise it is operated to produce a profit The people who work on newspaper are no different from those who staff any other business but newspaper people are more pressed for time in the press by Thursday An editor of a weekly relies on volunteers such as
yourself for news of club and association activities; school and church news. If poorly written, your news will be held up from
going to the typesetter if it needs to be reworded according to newspaper style.

Address the material to the editor by name - Mr. Peter Aguilar. Don't come rushing in with a routine story a few minutes before his deadline material.

NAMES MAKES NEWS
The secret of writing a news story about your organization is to tell who, why, what, when,
where and how. The NEWS wants full names, place of residence of persons involved and any identifying titles they may have. Be accurate and impartial. The editor may want to send NEWS representative to some special meeting or event. Your news release will make him
aware of your organization's activities of your organization's take place, it is your responsibility to notify the editor immediately.
Some stories written in long hand invite errors. If if's impossibie for you to type your
story, print all names. In the upper left hand corner place your name, address and phone number. This will identify you as the news release source. The editor will then be able to reach you if he has any questions about your story.
ouble space if your story is lyped. Use one side on $812 /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$
paper. Avoid glowing tribute. Opinion or personnal comment do not belong in a news story. Phrases like "We would like..." or "You are urged to attend"

how to submit news. Don't try to disguise advertising as news. Keep in mind that the NEWS NEWS has many business people and individuals paying for advertising, which includes thank you' messages. The NEWS does not think it is fair for anyone to get this service free. There are
exeeptions. Plans for proceeds of raffes
and sales can be mentioned in a news story, but details of prices. times and places should be in our classified advertising section. Prices are not news.
ADDITIONAL TIPS
When an organization does not have a publicity chairman. the president, secretary or even a member often performs the
worthwhille service of preparing a news release. Here are a few more hints:

Taxpayers who reseived sick
pay benefits from their employer in 1983 must include the payments as income on their
federal tax return, the Internal Revenue Service says.
The payments are taxable whether they were made directly by the employer or from a welfare fund, a state sickness or disability fund, or an insurance
company, provided the plan was paid for by the employer
Benefits received under
accident or health insurance policy for which the employee paid the premiums are nol Mored taxable by the IRS. More information on sick pay
menefits is contained in the free IRS Publication 525, "Taxable and Nontaxable Income," which can be ordered on the handy order form in the tax package or
by calling IRS.
