Wy Leskinso crrent question in our nation's capital, as to. whether the taxpayer subsiditized National Public Radio is pro-Marxist, mighi appear extreme - except for
what NPR broadcast in March of what NPR broadc For NPR celebrated the centennial of the death of Karl Marx with a speeial hall-hour broadcast. And while Marx has had a considerable effect upon world history, this program, Review magazine included tributes to him by "various Marxist scholars, political pundits and historians" who delivered "unreserved praise for the man and his philosophy." But there were "no opponents of
Marxist doctrine," In his article, ournalism at NPR, "Hart mentions columnist Joseph Sobran's charge that this network utilizes the technique of using purportedly unrehearsed countered people:- all or most of whom just seem to have the same editorial outlook as NPR.

As examples, Hart notes:
human rights violations by American allies, while down the Kremlin...When Meskito Indian leader Stedman Fagoth Muller held a press conference in Washington to catalogue human rights abuses committed against his people by the Sandinista, who burned Meskito villages and put
thousands in forced labor camps to starve or die of disease, every to starve or die of disease, every Fagoth's revetatoins - except NPR." States for blamed the United "because of our failure to back the island's Marxist dictator Maurice Bishop." And NPR American public disapproved of the Grepada invasion by a $3-2$ margin - which claim conflicted with almost every other pol
