
Ordinance 84-2, known as the Lincoln County Live Music Security Ordinance was adopted. It requires organizers of dances, rodeos, parties, festivals, night club entertainment, or like endeavors in which alcoholic beverages are served and which is conducted for profit within Lincoln County, utilizing a live music band, provide adequate security for the area and duration of the event. Adequate security shall be no less than one uniformed, licensed and bonded security person for each one hundred people in attendance.

Ordinance no 84-3 was adopted. It regulates excavation requiring persons to give notice of intent to excavate, providing for emergency excavation, and providing penalties for violations. The ordinance was approved with the stipulation that Paul Crown be appointed as enforcement officer. Crown is enforcement officer for the utility council. The ordinance covers anarea within five miles outside the corporate limits of the village of Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs. Any person planning to dig in the area is required to notify the Utility Council at least 48 hours prior to excavation.



Benoit still works at White Sands as an electronics engineer He jumped into Carrizozo at the golf course on July 4, 1981 He hopes to get his 1,000th jump by September. When asked if he did not like landing in an airplane, he said, "I avoid it if at all possible."

Fellow jumper Doug Gallow is with the weather service at Holloman. Gallow and Benoit left Carrizozo before noon and planned to jump back into Alamogordo.

Maurice Morgan from Holloman AFB brought two miniature aircraft that were radio controlled. He said they prefer to not be called model airplanes. A transmitter is used to control the aircraft.

Morgan builds his own miniature aircraft from balsa wood. He had a yellow cub quarter scale and a smaller red aircraft. They are various sizes and use various sized engines. Fuel for the small planes is called glow fuel. It is a mixture of .aicohol, a lubricant such as castor oil or synthetic oil, and a very small quantity of nitro.

Morgan has been active with miniature aircraft for 18 or 19 years. He belongs to a club and said club members have one million dollars worth of liability insurance. He said it is not often that claims are made against the insurance. He is a member of the Americal Modelers Association. A demonstration of the radio

## Geo. W. Coe homestead to celebrate founding

George Washington Coe and his bride, Phoebe Brown Coe, homesteaded in the Ruidoso Valley. By 1884 Coe had already for ten years before he settled on Lincoln County as the place Before his marriage he was inwhere he wanted to put down roots.

George went in with two of his cousins, Frank and Jasper Mexico's history. Coe, and formed one large homestead. Eventually, when the government surveyors got there, they found more than enough land to split into three homesteads. The three Coes built the first schoolhouse which' did double duty as a school and church. They also ordered fruit trees from a nursery in Missouri and George made the 200 mile journey to Socorro, New Mexico to pick them up. Those seedlings were planted in orchards.

Eight children were born to George and Phoebe and he outlived all but one of them. This, daughter, Mayme, married Elzy Perry in 1912. The Perrys' had settled on the Bonita River in 1900, bringing 1800 head of fine haired goats with them from Texas. After Elzy and Mayme married, they eventually managed the ranch for George. Lizy also went into the water well drilling-business, and drilled-thefirst irrigation wells in the Ruidoso Valley. After his death in 1957. Mayme, known to her friends as "Aunt Mayme," kept the place together, raising apples and cattle. She was concerned about the breakup of family ranchs, so in 1974 she formed a family corporation, the Perry owned by her children, operates the ranch today. A greatgrandchild of George Coe, Lowell-Nosker, is the ranch manager.

Other things have changed through the years. George Coe called the place the Golden Glow Ranch. It then became the Perry Fruit Farm and Ranch and today it is The Perry Ranch, Inc. The houses on it have changed as well. Fires destroyed three, .a lot of the blank ammunition. along with many of the family pictures and furnishings. The current ranch house, built in the 1930s, was added onto extensively by Mayme Coe Perry. It is a

autobiography, Frontier Fighter, relates his memories of those times.

The family George and Phoebe Coe started when they put down roots on the Ruidoso in 1884 numbers over 250 today. Many of the family will gather at the ranch in Glencoe the weekend of June 30 to celebrate the centennial of the founding of the homestead and pay homage to their pioneer ancestors.






