



The following recipe by Lorraine Daugherty of Capitan found it's way into my recipe box. Potato-Cabbage casserole, a onedish meal, is easy to prepare on a busy summer day, I tried it and the family liked it:

Saute 2 tablespoons margarine and one-third cup minced onion. Add and heat until cheese is melted - 1 can cream of mushroom soup or cream of chicken soup; three-fourths cup milk and 1/2 cup grated cheese.

Pour soup-cheese mixture over 1 cup shredded cabbage, 1 teaspoon salt, dash of garlic powder, 1/4 teaspoon pepper and 2 large boiled potatoes (sliced). Mix well. Pour into greased casserole dish. Bake at 350 degree oven for 30-40 minutes. Serves 6 to 8.

A mile east of Capitan, on a curve in the road along the Bonito, Ortiz and Gutierrez came up on the men walking along the highway. They surrendered without a fight. One of them was in possession of a butcher knife."



SANTA FE-Whatever the average daily balance in your checking account was last month, the state of New Mexico did better.

On any day of that same period of time it was putting into short-term investments-mostly what the bankers call "overnights," money that goes in late today and out early tomorrow morning-the resounding sum of \$72,148,617,86.

Those are big bucks, friends. The State Treasurer's office actually massages that moneyto use current money-market language for what happens to it. But the group which has ultimate responsibility is a not-too-wellknown operation called the Investment Council.

That particular commission manages investments of various kinds which now total up to \$1,907,970,747—just on the verge of becoming two billion bucks.

Expected yield from all that money is something over \$186 million this year, up from \$165 million last year.

THE MARKET: If you're a big plunger in the stock market, you might like to know what the managers of that fund have been doing in this area lately.

Well, they bought 40,000

shares of Anheuser-Busch, with a these investments. book value of \$2,524,000 last month-which may be more than your margin account can handle. Just the commission on that purchase, made through Eppler

Guerin & Turner, came to \$4,000. And they bought 100,000 worth \$4,281,491.40, as well as over \$2 million worth of Raytheon, a million of Perkin-Elmer and \$1.5 million of Martin

I went to the sheriff's department early Sunday morning and gave them the information needed for them to teletype a death message to my husband.

Through the efficient and courteous service provided. my husband received the message and called me an hour and fifteen minutes later. This speedy method of relaying messages made it possible for us to attend the funeral and be with our loved ones at a time when we needed to be together.

The policeman that gave my husband the message said, "It is times like this when I wish I was not a policeman."

We need to realize that law enforcement officers have their share of duties they would rather not perform. The important thing is that we do have them and they do a great job.

Sheriff Tom Sullivan is to be commended for his department and the kindness they show during a time of family stress. I wish I had not had to use their services, but I did. Thank goodness they were there and helped. I especially want to thank Chief Deputy Charles Cox and Joan Means.

We need to think of law enforcement not in negative terms but in the positive terms that will make us glad they are there to serve 24 hours a day. Usually they have a thankless job: I for one want to say 'Thank you for a job well done.'

Once it was "Law east of the Pecos"

Though small family bands had camped and hunted within sight of the river for 6,000 years between late Paleo-Indian times and A.D. 800, settled village life came late to the valley of the Pecos.

Mere traces of the first farming settlements built between Alamogordo Reservoir and Roswell have been discovered. stiffer sentencing for habitual Nearly 30 years ago the earliest of these were found south of Fort Summer on terraces overlooking legislators who voted against a the River's "18 Mile Bend". Gray, unpainted Anasazi pottery from northwestern New Mexico and scattered fragments of stone dart points mark these sites.

By A.D. 1000, late "18 Mile" sites were well-established and more numerous. A few shallow, dugout "bithouses" and remnants of small mud-and-cobble walled surface rooms have been excavated. Though everyday brown pottery was made locally. striking "red Mesa Black-onwhite" bowls, first made in the Red Mesa Valley near Gallup were traded to the Pecos district from west of the Rio Grande.

Just a century ago lands WEST of the Pecos were considered untamed. Ironically, at A.D. 1000 the situation was reversed—then the Pecus Valley Rio Grande. held New Mexico's EASTERN-MOST outposts of civilized village life. As Anasazi and

Mogollon population exploded in western New Mexico, classic Chaco and Mimbres societies were formed and resources stretched to their limits. So pioneers were forced to seek new farmlands on the raw eastern frontier across the Rio Grande.

These early settlers moved into territory that nomadic Indian plainsmen had always dominated. The Villager's economic and cultural ties were with western New Mexico, but life was hard and often isolated.

For a time, about A.D. 1050, Pecos villages were larger, more densely populated and trade was far-flung. Known as the "Mesita Negra" Period more farming hamlets were created in a century than in all other periods combined.

"Mesita Negra" villages obtained Mimbres pottery from Grant, Sierra, and Luna Countles in southwestern New Mexico. "Reserve Black-on-white" pitchers were carried nearly 300 miles from Catron County, while "Cebolieta Black-on-white" pottery came from Cibola and Valencia Counties south of Acoma Pueblo. "Socorro Blackon-white" bowls and ladles also found their way east across the





"DO I NEED A WILL?"

As an attorney practicing "people law", I am frequently asked that question. My usual answer is a definite yes

Do you have children under the age of eighteen? If so, you have a say in who their guardiasn Do you have choldren under the age of eighteen? If so, you have a say in who their guardian will be should they

become orphaned. A bitter and expensive custody battle may be prevented by a short clause in a will. Did you own property before you were married, or have you acquired any by gift or through inheritance since? This is basically what is known as separate property, and if

you die without a will, one-quarter of it will pass to yourspouse and three quarters of it to your children. If you have a will, you can decide who gets what. If you are married and have community property (all property acquired in this state which isn't separate property), your spouse will inherit all of it if you do not have

a will. Through a will, you can decide what will happen to your half of any community property. Do you want to leave your property to your children, but in such a way that they can spend a portion of it when they are eighteen, a portion of it when they are twenty-five, and the remainder when they are thirty? A simple trust can

be included in your will.

If you have a ring from your great-grandmother that you specifically wish to go to your eldest daughter and a necklace from Aunt Mary that you want to go to your youngest, you can now include in your will a reference to a list of specific items of personal possession that you wish to go to specific people. You can then change the list without writing a

Do you have friends or relatives from another state who will be hunting or fishing in New Mexico this year? Do them a favor by making sure they buy a. non-resident license if they do not meet New Mexico residency

criteria. A resident license is less expensive than a non-resident license — as much as several hundred dollars less for some big game licenses. So why shouldn't non-residents try to obtain the cheaper license?

The wildlife of New Mexico belongs to the people of this state. The Department of Game and Fish is responsible for managing that wildlife for the citizens of this state. One benefit that we receive as residents of New Mexico is a reduced price for hunting and fishing licenses.

New Mexico loses several hundred "thousand dollars annually due to non-residents illegally buying resident licenses. The Game Department is working to stop this drain by conducting investigations of fraudulent purchase of resident licenses. The fine for fraud to secure a resident license is set by state law at \$400.00.

Just what is the law concerning residency? A person is a resident for New Mexico if he is a citizen - or a non-US-citizen legally in this country - who has lived here for at least 90 days immediately preceeding the license purchase or application AND who does not claim
