Ruidoso was especially hard
hit. Saturday Ruidoso Downs Race Track was closed for the first time in 12 years. Deputies have been called out and have been on standby for the flood. Flood waters have subsided but not before washing out culverts and bridges in the county.
Gov, Toney Anaya declared Lincoln County a disaster area Saturday. This makes the area eligible for state aid and allowed the National Guard to bring sapdbags from Albuquerque to the Ruidose area.

Paradise Canyon Road is
closed. The bridge is out. visitors to the area are advised to stay on main roads. It will take weeks and possibly months to clean up the debris and damage from the flood.
