Lincoln, San Patricio and Ruidoso. I listened to the program with the kindergarten through 4th grade classes. When Brown first began his talk and photo slide program he asked the wide-syed audience: "How many of you have fleas?", three or four hands waved high above the crowd.

Plague is prevalent in New Mexita. Since 1959 plague has
been a steadily increasing problem in the state. It is a bacterlal disease passed to man by wild rodents, rabbits and their fleas. Fleas live on the animals and in their nests and burrows. A dog or cat can bring plague Plague symptoms include high fever, chills and headache. Lymph glands in the groin, armpits and neck may become
swollen and tender. If the bacteria invade the lungs the disease may spread to other people when the patient coughs or sneezes. symptoms usually occur two to six days after the bite of an in-
fected flea You can also get plague if infected animal blood gets into a cut or abrasion on
hands or fingers. hands or fingers.
