WASHINGION - In 1982,
the US Postal Service issued 160 million commemorative stamps honoring "Dr. Mary Walker, Army Surgeon, Medal of Honor." Mary Walker is the only
woman in US history to have woman in US history to have been he recipient-at the Medal of
Honor; in 1860 , by President Andrew-Jolansen.
What this commemorative What this commemorative
stamp - and the Postal Service press releases abouit Postmaster General Willam Bolger's ap-
proval of it do not mention is that in 1917, Dr. Walker's medal was revoked. For Congress orwas revoked. For Congress orreview all 2,525 Medals of Honor awarded since July 12, 1862, when Congress instituted it.
