control access on their-private. lands.

The decreasing amount of private land open to hunting hat resulted in more humters utilizing state and federal tands within New Mexico: There are over 31
million acres of state and federal lands, most of which are foperal to hunting, fishing and other recreational uses. These lands are intermingled with privately owned land and this often leads to some confusion. People trying to find new hunting areas often have difficulty in determining to state and federal lands. Some of these lands are completely surrounded by private lands and no public access. exists so they
are unavailable to hunters. are unavailable to hunters.
Alse, in some cases landowners. Alse, in some cases tandowners.
and grazing lessees have illegally posted or denied access on public roads to these lands. All this has resulted in hunter-landowner confrontations each year. What is
e solution to this problem?
First, there must be mutual respect and cooperation between hurters need to ask permission before hunting on private lands, and If granted, they need to respect the wishes of the landowner and make sure they close gates, don't destroy property'and mot leave litter. The landowne hunter to utilize public lands and not deny access. to accom. plish 'this goal, the Depariment of Game and Fish, and county law managemen
agencies will be cooperating to agencies will be cooperating to landowner. Maps showing both land status ind public access outes have been printed and are avgiliable at Bureau of Land Management offices in Carlsbad
and Roswell and at the Game Department office in Roswell. There are five maps covering much of the southeastern part of he state at a cost of $\$ 2.00$ each. Also, contact stations will be set up at Hamilton Station;-Hope and Dunken to answer questions and respond to problems, In addition,
there will be county law enforcement officers, conservation officers and Bureau of Land Management personnel patrolling all areas to try to reduce game violations and

frontations, Anyone who does have a problem during this year's hunting seasons needs to
contact the Game Department Bureau of Land Management or a county sheriff's office. This year, make the seasons run smoothly, respect the land other people and wildife to help insure hunting for future generations.
