deaths of Thomas P. "Cotton" McKnight and his wife Judy last Thursday.
The brutal slayings occurred in the McKnight home about 20
miles south of Picacho. The bodies were found Thursday morning by a friend and a neigh-
McKnight, 32, had been Lincoln County Commission Chairman from 1878 to 1882.

-Passed a resolution allowing $\$ 200.00$ of water meter emergency capital im. provements.
-The proposed water rate
increase looks like this residential minimum would go to 4,000 gallons. The minimum rate
would go to $\$ 12.50$. There would be a charge of $\$ 1.75$ per thousand gallons in excess of the 4,000 minimum up to 25,000 gallons.

WASHINGTON - Front pages all over the world an-
nounced the award of the Nobel Peace Prize to Anglican Bishop Desmond Tutu of South Africa. The announcement of the award, in Oslo, cited this prelate's "role
as a unifying leader figure in the as a unifying leader figure in the
campaign to resolve the problem of apratheid in South Africa. The means by which this vital campaign is conducted is of vital importance to

So if there is any bloodbath in southern Africa, it will almost certainly be as it has been almost all over the continent during the

liberal Big Media as the
deliberate policy of starvation by which the Federal Army of Nigeria starved so many lbos to death in Blafra.
From Lagos, where he could conduct a memorial service fo all these black victims of a black army, the /biahop could fly to vestigate to see if that country under Dictator-Sergeant Doe, has ever eliminated the racial segregation in its constitulion, which denies the right to vote or hold property to any individual who is not black (with the only
exception being such cor porations as Firestone.)

 street riots in Suweto And finally, Bishop Tutu could plead with the Congressional Black Caucus to stop their tacit support of African dictators on the questionableassumption that it is somehow less oppressive to be ruled, tortured or executed by a black dictator than in a white republic. Bibhop Tutu's filghls to all these places would cost only a fraction of the $\$ 190,000$ sitipend
that goes with the Nobel Prize. that goes with the Nobel Prize.
