## County wide 'animal control ordinance’

By RUTH HAMMOND Lincoln County has provides the County powers over animala running at large, forcement, siezure and im poundment, redemption, fees, dumping of live animals, and imposing the penalty volations of the ordinance. The Sheriff of Lincoln County is responsible for the forcement of the ordinance and he may designate is parttime or be deputized to confor officer to be deputized to enforce animal
control laws, orders, ordinances and regulations. Duane Vinson is the animal control officer for Lincoln County.
Vinson says, "The purpose of an animal control ordinance is to protect humans and animals from rables and the plague." Another purpose of the ordinance is to protect humans and
livestock from dog bites by livestock from dog bites by
controlling animals running at liarge and by providing for the licensure of dogs, impoundment of animals and confinemen
