－if the turkey needs to be thawed，leave it in its original bag and place it on a tray in the refrigerator．It will take about 24 hours for each five three days for a 15 －pound
turkey．If the turkey was not taken out of the freezer in time to use this method，or if there there is another safe way as ong as the bag surrounding the turkey is intact and unbroken．
Cover it with cold water， and change the water fre－ quently．This method takes
about half an hour per pound of turkey，or almost eight hours for a 15 －pound turkey． －Refrigerate or cook the turkey as soon as it is thawed． －When cooking dressing for the turkey，it is much safer to cook it in a separate con－ the turkey．
