## Science Olympiad Offers Competition in Science

The process for assessing property is handled by the Lincoln County Assessor＇s office which is located in the employees have been trained to assess property and report their findings to the assesson，This year，the employees have een workijg extra hard because they were required，as was every county in the state to bring property values up oo the 1980 values．This has not been done for quife some and were at the 1972 level and buildings，etc．were at the 1975 values．

Just changing or bringing the values up eight years n land and five years on buildings，etc，was going to bring change in valuations．This past spring the assessor＇s of these＇Notices of Valuation＇did not contain a bili，they did contain very important information that property owners should have read and considered before filing ayway． Several people have said they didn＇t even＂ook at the notices
simply because they were printed with＂This is Not a Bill．＂

Ignoring this important piece of mall has cost property one prominent person said，＂I just assumed that it would be the same and I didn＇t bother to look at it until after received my tax bill and thenit was too late．＂He found ou that the notice of valuation had very important informa tion on it．One of the things it had was a change of
classification from grazing land to subdivision．It would classu been the same if it had been changed from grazing land to irrigated or miscellaneous，because once classification is changed，the amount of taxes will change but the property owner will not know how much the change is until abo
delivered． Property owners need to be aware thatproperty taxes
are arrived at in a two－step process，The notice of valua tion is sent to property owners sometime in January or
February，and certainly before April 1 ．Property oxyers February，and certainly before April 1．Property oxinery
bave 30 days from the date of the maling in which to pro have 30 days from the date of the mailing in which to pro
test if they disagree with a valuation．This protest should a notice of yaluation does not excuse any property oxym from being resmonstble for making sure his property is valued correctly．A legal is run in the NEWS for three weeks usually in January telling property owners about the valuation process

The notice of valuation has two pages．There are in structions on the back of both pages．These should be read
These notices should be kept from year to year with other important property papers and owners should compare notices of valuation from year to year to make compare ther have been no drastic changes．if there have been an changes，that is the time to questionit，not later when the
tax bill arrives．

Property is classified in several categories：grazing irrigated，subd miscellaneous．The homeside a subdivision that has a residence on ft Miscellaneous covers everything else．Each classification is taxed at a different rate and any time classification of property changes，the taxes due on that property will change lo addition，any properify classified as graving iand swine，horses and goats．If the livestock being shaze belongs to someone other than the property owner that in formation must be inciuded on the back of the notice o
valuation with the name of the livestock owner listed．

The re－valuation of ail property has been a major pro eet reguired to bring the values of propty up to 100 values，they had to include improvements，etc that migh possibly have been omitted or had changed since the lasi valuation．The notice of valuation also includes a mobile
home report for property owners opning a mobile home．

## While the notice of valuation does notincluden dollar amount of taxes due，It does list the valute of the property

## Most Thanksgiving Food is American

Thanksgiving foods are gifts the Americas gave to the world, says Jim Sais, Extension horticulturist for Ne Mexico State University. The turkey is a native of the Americas. Early Spanish feasting on turkeys. Spaniards called turkey pavo because its fanned tail resembled the peacock, or the pavo real. One can easily start an argument at the table when asking which foods originated person might believe there is nothing more American than apples, while another is certain that Irish potatoes could anywhere but Ireland.
However, both are wrong, says Sais. Many of our native foods were taken to Europe, where they became widely accepted, then made the long
journey back to the New journey
World.

Potatoes are a vegetable that did just that. They were introduced to England from South America, where they civilization centered in Peru In Europe potatoes gained in popularity and became a staple. The Irish were so dependent on potatoes that in
1846, a potato blight in Ireland 1846, a potato blight in Ireland caused a famine.

Corn was perhaps the most important food crop used Sais. The exact origin of corn is unknown, but it was grown extensively throughout the Americas. When Coronado
came to New Mexico in 1542, came to New Mexico in 1542,
he found it flourishing along the Rio Grande and carefully attended by Pueblo Indians. During his stay, Coronado relied heavily on the stored granaries in the pueblos to sustain his army.
Squanto, th

Squanto, the famed Indian agriculturist was reported to
have taught the early English colonists how to plant corn. Pumpkins and squash were used throughout the United Statès by native
American tribes. These cucur-
