## Behind the Headlines

## Why 'Dick and Jane' Still Can't Read

ACalifornia man, stalled on a freeway phioned the pollce or heip. He was ask officer thought he was joking. Then he realized that the man, who began to sound desperate, was really Iost of all the signs on the freeway, the onily one he could read was "One Way"

Jonathan Kozol, author of the much-debated study, $h$. terato America cites the story as a tragicomic example o the difficulty many adults have in reading, much less Arecent study by the Ney do read. Statistics bear this ouk Progresis found that white 95 percent of adults from 21 to 25 year of age can read as well as the averace fourth level. According to Kozol , this means that 1 in every 5 youn adults cannot read a newspaper an income-tax forma standard rental lease, or the warning label on a can of Drano.

This came as no surprise to Dr RudoIf Flesch, the noted authority on reading and writing and author of the years ago. In an artice written for the Amerian Logio magazine shortly before his death, Dr. Flesch said; "Millions of Americans can't read because they've never been taught how, To read a language that's written with letters runung rond them out from left to right It's called phonics"

Dr. Flesch lamented the fact that most public schools don't teach phomics. "Instead, haif a century ago, they swit ched to the whole-word methoa, populariy called look-and say. It trains children to memorize the shapes and meal ed that way" As a result he added, many Americans have lifelong reading trouble variously misdiagnosed as les ning disability, dyslexia, minimal brain damage or socalled "attention deficit disorder"'

Despite its obvious failures, sald $D_{r}$. Flesch, schools have persisted in teaching look-and-say, adding only a the sounts of a fex letters "as a help in -identifying unthe sounds of a few letters as a help in identiying uncontinue using their so-called "basal readers" offering a small stock of carefuily selected words to memorize from kindergarten through eighth grade Iextbooks in other subjects, he added, are all "dumbed down" to contain only these words.

No wonder so many adults of today are illiterate or only marginally, literate when it comes to reading - and understanding. This is borne out by the proliferation of femedial reading courses in colleges and universitiles and what Rudolf Flesch called our "glant anti-education empire" But the good doctorstill found cause for optimism. and our children will again be taught to read"
