Keeping the Mobs on the Run

N
ot since AI Capone was indleted for ncome-tax evasion in 1931 and sent to prison or eight years the Mafia's top leaders convicted on racketeering charges and facing years in federal penitentlaries the nation's crime fimilies are in disarray

John L Hogan, head of the FBI's New Yorls office said the next stage to the these people in the pockelbook, to take businesses away from them, That's the way to really hur them." For years, the Mafia families have usedlegitmate businesses as fronts for their criminal activities and to "Iaunder" their ili-gotten gains, Themost effective weapon against the Mafia has been the Racketeer Influenced and
Corrupt Organizations Act, or RICO which enables pro Corrupt Organizations Act, or Rico, which enables pro itself. "Moday," said Hogan, "we don"t just investigate one person but the enterprise: It would be lilike taking on a com pany and indicting and convicting the chairman of the board, the CEO, a couple of senior vice presidents and a term effect on that company"

Until the RICO act was fully understood and utiliked said Hogan, "law enforcement authorities were 50 year behind the times in attacking the problem of traditional organized crime. They got fortholds throughout this coundo is to identify emerging new sroups and nip them in the bud before they, too, get the foothold that the older established crime groups got?"

Among the criminal newcomers is United Bamboa, an organization that originated in Taiwan and now claims to California and a number of foreign countries. Enleven of its leaders were indicted and convicted of racketeering by a federal jury in New York last September, According to federal prosecutor, Anpe Vitale, United Bamboo "deals
with murder, guns and narcotics."

According to a 1986 report by the President's Commis sion on Organized Crime, United Bamboo is only one of several ethnic oigganized criminal groups to have emerged recently in this country, among them about a dozen gangs of immigrants from the Soviet Union. The New York City police department has assigned five detectives to What's called the "Russian desx" to deal with' he problem division, "There is a parallel to the Mariel boat lift when Castro sent over s ome of his criminals. Not all of the people allowed to leave by the Soviet government were persecuted Jews.'

Law enforcement authorities also have their eye on labor racketeering. Hogan said the FBI will continue its anti-labor but because we want to relurn the unions to the union members and rid the unions of organized crime con trol. We really believe this will have a positive mpact on
the nation's economy?"
