Award of the bid was made he Carrizozo Board of Trustees. Carrizozo Mayor Bob lemphil had hand-carried the o speed up the start of the paving.project. Tentative approval was recelved from the DFA for the construction phase of the project.
Funds for phase I of the project will be $\$ 231,000$ from Block Grant (CDBG) and 325,000 from the town infrastructure tax. Funds for phase II will be $\$ 250,000$ from he State of New Mexico and \$58,000 from the state highway epartment.

A letter recelved by the department stated that the project of paving three miles of dirt streets in Carrizozo must be completed this year to avoid he loss of any funds.

Hubert Quintana of the Southeastern New Mexico
Economic District (SENMFDDD), administrators for the paving project, presented bills in the amount of $\$ 13,146$ for 70 percent of the design phase and 33 perwork was completed by Pajo Technicl Services, engineers for both phases of the project. Quintana received the necessary signatures to request a draw to pay the bills.
