CRISIS ALIVE AND WEL A rural hotline used by farmers seeking help for problems such as emotional stress or lender mediation has been shut down. The Rocky Mouncain Farmers Union began the $\$ 31,000$ from Farm Aid, the Farmers Union and other sources. During that time, the hotline took 300 calls from
