Lincoln County election results

Heavy voting gives Bush/Quayle 2-1 lead

The 1988 election is history. A total of 5,385 Lincoln County voters went to the polls for a showing of 77.7 percent of the registered voters.

County returns began coming into the clerk's office shortly after poll closing time at 7 p.m. with the absentee precinct being the first precinct to report. There were 628 absentee ballots.

Precinct workers from throughout the county phoned the clerk's office with results and these figures were entered into the computer. Totals of the reporting precincts were made available to the public through computer printouts.

A group of more than 100 people were in the courthouse waiting for results. Many of these people left about 9:30 p.m. after waiting for an hour for the last precinct totals to be entered into the computer. Before the last reporting precinct's totals were fed into the computer, clerk Fran Siddens read the tally from each precinct.

One group received the totals from Hondo precinct 17 by phoning Hondo for the results. The totals were hand written in the empty column on the computer printouts. The final computer printout was distributed at 9:45 p.m.

Lincoln County results will not be official until after the canvass by county commissioners on Nov. 14.

Zoning ordinance slashed; public hearing Nov. 22

The controversial zoning ordinance for Lincoln County went back to the drawing board after objections to the document were received during public hearings.

Recent news of an application to place a sanitary landfill with incineration in Lincoln County prompted the county commissioners to ask that the ordinance be revised and submitted again.

The Lincoln County Planning and Zoning Commission made final revisions and cuts to the proposed ordinance during a special P&Z meeting Nov. 7. Originally 113 pages, it now contains 60 pages with a three-page index.

Objections received were taken into consideration and incorporated. The title, Lincoln County Enforcement Officer was changed to Lincoln County Compliance Officer, agribusiness was added, and other changes were made.

Landfills of any kind were covered by the addition of the wording "any type of waste disposal" in the special use permit section. Special use permits will require the

application being sent to P&Z for a public hearing and recommendation to the county commissioners before action is taken.

The proposed ordinance was approved by the P&Z with members Mack Bell, Ben Hall, Walt Wilson, Betty Shrecengost and Alton Whitaker in favor and member E.J. Fouratt casting the only no vote. P&Z members Sid Goodloe, Modesto Chavez

and Lamoyne Peters were absent from the meeting.

The county commissioners will hold a public hearing for the purpose of adoption of the ordinance at 1 p.m. Nov. 22 in the courthouse in Carrizozo. All parties and interested citizens will have the opportunity to be heard.

Copies of the ordinance may be obtained from the county manager's office.

Forsythe installed as Carrizozo CC president

Dorothy Forsythe was installed as president of the Carrizozo Chamber of Commerce during the breakfast meeting Nov. 8. Board member Danny Burnett conducted the swearing in ceremony.

Forsythe announced appointment of two new committees. Glen Ellison will chair the committee to give recognition to people who have improved their property. Ralph Forsythe and Ruth

Hammond will be on the committee to report on activities of the town council and county commissioners. Forsythe also announced she had named former chamber president Betty Howell as chairman of the board of directors.

Scott Shafer reported the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County will be conducting a telephone labor survey during Nov. 28 and Dec. 3 to determine what kind of labor pool Lincoln County has to offer to new businesses which may plan to locate in the county.

A random sampling of people will be called and asked to answer questions concerning their education and work skills. The identity of the person called will remain anonymous.

EDC/LC needs the survey to obtain certification from the state. Calls will be made in each community in the county. Chamber members endorsed the survey and are asking people to cooperate.

Members discussed the placing of the National Center for the Western Horse and the Farm Ranch Heritage at Fort Stanton. Shafer said that Buddy Bundick, chairman and president of EDC/LC, will draft a letter to State Representative Ben Hall asking that there be no conflict with the existing hospital at Fort Stanton.

Carrizozo Town Council

Cable Franchise transfer approved

There were no objections to the transfer of the cable franchise during a public hearing at the Nov. 8 Carrizozo town council meeting.

The ordinance for the transfer was approved and will replace the previous ordinance.

Scott Cable Communications Inc., DBA Simmons Cable TV, had made an offer to Hoot and Linda Gibson to buy the Cable TV and needed the ordinance approved before the sale could proceed.

In other business, trustees received two bids for the scrap that was for sale. The high bid of \$100 from Phillip Ortiz of Means Motor Supply was accepted. The other bid was for \$51.85 from Henry Means and Ted Brazie.

Trustees agreed to allow the town clerk to pay the utility bills as they are received. The amounts of the utility bills will be included in the monthly expenditures. Trustee Linda Haller stated that she had no objection to the utility bills being paid as received as long as there was no discrepancies.

The town received a letter from Peggy Smith stating that former owner Cecilia Kuhnel had redeemed the Girard Hotel property and is the legal owner. The town has received complaints that the property is in a dangerous condition.

Mayor Bob Hemphill announced that a telephone labor survey would be conducted in Carrizozo Nov. 28 through Dec. 3. The purpose of the survey is to ascertain what kind of labor pool Lincoln County has to offer new businesses which may plan to locate in the county.

The survey is needed by the Economic Development Corporation of Lincoln County in order for EDC/LC to apply for certification from the state. Hemphill said that 50 completed surveys will be

needed and it may take 150 calls to get the needed 50.

Two Carrizozo High School girls will be conducting the survey, making the calls from city hall. People giving information for the survey will remain anonymous. Hemphill has asked for cooperation from all people who will be contacted.

Woody Schlegel spoke to the council about water for Brooks Construction property which is located across the overpass on Highway 380. "I was told if they (Brooks) want water, they should provide water," Schlegel said, and that new businesses should be encouraged.

"No one from the town said Brooks had to provide their own water," Hemphill responded. "We didn't sell the property with no water, don't make us out to look like the bad guys."

After a discussion it was learned that someone had

told Brooks that they had to put in a two-inch water line while only a one-inch line would be needed. The council stated that no one from the town had said a two-inch line would be needed.

Trustees agreed to extend the water line from the meter located near the old Triangle Trailer Court to the edge of the city limits. Brooks will pay to install their own one-inch line from there. The meter for Brooks will be placed at the edge of the city limits. The Environmental Improvement Division (EID) requires that a double check valve be placed on the line.

Schlegel also spoke to the council about a letter the Carrizozo Chamber of Commerce received from a couple in Pasadena, CA about not being able to park their RV under the trees at the golf



A true home-made quilt, made the 'old-fashioned' way in 1872

Al Seay of Carrizozo entered a "Wheel of Fortune" quilt he owns in the Cedarvale quilt show recently. It received first place for being the oldest quilt in the best condition. This quilt, made in 1872 by Al's great-grandmother, is a true home-made quilt.
Malinda S. Seay picked the cotton from the stalks. When she picked the cotton she used baskets she had woven from switches and limbs she had gathered from the woods.
Mrs. Seay then picked the seed from the cotton by

hand and spun the cotton into thread on her spinning wheel. She took this thread and wove it into cloth in her home-made loom. The cloth was white from the loom.
Her next step in making the quilt was to go into the woods to gather leaves, bark and berries from different plants and trees to use to make dyes of different colors. She dyed the white cloth into the shades she chose to make the different pieces. After that she cut her own designs or quilt patterns.
All pieces were sewn by hand, using the solid white material for linings. She carded the cotton into bats for the padding in the quilt, between the lining and the top.

She sewed or laced the lining to the quilting frames made of boards that had been hewed from trees in the woods. These boards were about one inch thick and maybe two, three or four inches wide and about eight feet long.

She put a heavy strong material binding about one or one and one-half inch wide next to the edge of the board to lace the lining to, to hold it tight and in place while she quilted.
She did most of her quilting at night by a little oil light that sat on the quilt. The light was made with an ordinary can with a wick she made from twisting a cloth or string about the size of her finger or maybe one-half inch in diameter. She put cooking oil made from animal fat in the can and saturated the string in the oil, putting one end of the string in the bottom of the can and let the other end extend out the top of the can. She lit this lamp

like a burner and used it to provide light to quilt by.
Daylight hours were spent for outside duties and labor. During pioneer days in 1872 everyone worked long hours and had to use all home-made devices and raw material. They converted this raw material into articles for domestic use.
Mrs. Seay made the quilt for her second son Albert Taylor Seay when he was four years old. The quilt was kept in the family and was given to Albert Taylor Seay's son John Daniel Seay when he married in 1912.
Shortly before John Daniel Seay died in 1968, he gave the quilt to his son Al Seay of Carrizozo. Al has it at the present time and plans to keep it in the family and give it to his son.

Shafer said people need to encourage the state to not eliminate the hospital and to maintain employment there.
He said the school could be enhanced. "It would be exciting for me if they would all work together," Shafer said.
Phyllis Schlegel asked if letters should be sent and if so where. Burnett suggested the board of directors consider a resolution from the chamber be sent asking that the hospital not be closed.

Members discussed the recent ruling by Attorney General Hal Stratton that certified nurse practitioners and physicians associates could not prescribe medications. John Hightower announced the Lincoln County Medical Center board of directors is working on that matter.

YOU ASKED FOR IT

Several weeks ago I featured Pinto Bean Fudge in this column at the request of a Roswell reader. Last week a Ruidoso reader of this newspaper inquired about a recipe for Mock Pumpkin Pie.

Use Pinto beans which have been cooked until tender, with salt but no other seasoning. Puree in a blender 3 cups beans plus 1/4 to 1/2 cup cooking liquid. Scrape

down sides occasionally and puree until smooth.

Mock Pumpkin Pie
2 cups pinto bean puree
3 eggs
1 (18-ounce) can evaporated milk
1 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon ginger
1/4 teaspoon cloves
1 (9-inch) unbaked pie shell

Mix filling ingredients in order given. Pour into pie shell. Bake in preheated 425 degree oven for 15 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350 degrees and continue baking for 45 minutes, or until knife inserted in center of pie filling comes out clean. Cool. Garnish with whipped cream, if desired.

QUILT SHOW A SUCCESS

I'm still hearing good things about the Cedarvale Quilt Show held recently at Cedarvale. (They had their ad in the NEWS.) OPINION


"P.S. Would you please notify me when you plan to distribute more free cheese?"

Inside The Capitol

SANTA FE— Congratulations to yesterday's winning candidates.

First time winners are probably just beginning to savor "the thrill of victory." Last night's celebrations were a bit numbing so the good feelings may be just starting to settle in.

You have probably already begun experiencing some of the "fruits" of your success. Everyone knew you could win. And it's a fact that if everyone voted for you who will tell you that in the next few months, you are unbeatable.

The feeling of "unbeatableness" is another part of the winning euphoria. It begins when people you barely know tell you how hard they worked for you and that if you ever want to run for something "really big" to please count them in for full-time campaign work.

That kind of blarney does wonderful things for the ego. Your fantasies start taking shape. "Today probate judge; tomorrow the world."

By now you have gotten very tired of hearing, "or maybe condolences would be more appropriate." You have suppressed the urge to say, "Listen, fellow. You're insulting my intelligence. I've just spent about a thousand hours and half my life savings on winning this office. I've put the arm on every good friend I have. I've put my family through misery. And you're telling me I'm gonna hate it?"

With all due respect, it is a trite statement but a well-meaning acknowledgment that any elective office is sometimes a tiring and thankless job. No matter what you have been told, your position will require more time and energy than you had ever imagined.

But there are also the benefits. Although people mutter nasty things about elected officials in general, most do exhibit a certain respect for your accomplishment when they meet you face to face.

You'll get lots of phone calls but most will be fairly decent. In fact many will begin by apologizing for calling you at home or at the

office, whichever the case may be.

And as your term draws to a close, you will likely decide it was worth it. The great majority of incumbents stand for re-election if the law allows. You should find it a lot more fun running as an incumbent.

Now for the losers. I have had the privilege of running for public office and have been both a winner and a loser. Although victory is definitely my emotion of preference, defeat was not quite the "feeling of death" as Kitty Dukakis described her husband's loss when he ran for re-election as governor of Massachusetts.

If you ran hard, don't worry too much about being tagged the rest of your life with a loser's image. Many of our state and national leaders, all the way up to president, have lost at least once along the way.

Look at it this way. If Richard Nixon could lose the presidency, tell off the national press and come back to win two terms as president, anything is possible.

Here at home, the invincible Pete Domenici lost a gubernatorial race to Bruce King in 1970. Bill Richardson lost his first run for Congress to Manuel Lujan in 1980. Joe Skeen, against whom the Democrats couldn't even field a candidate this year, lost races for governor to Jerry Apodaca in 1974 and Bruce King in 1978.

Even King, conqueror of the majority of New Mexico's Republican Congressional delegation, lost a primary contest for the Democrat gubernatorial nomination to Fabian Chavez in 1968.

And, even if you don't decide to run for elective office again, there is still some consolation. You've got the qualifications to be a know-it-all political columnist, if you should ever need to stoop that low.

The general public feels like winners today, too. No more political commercials to offend our sensibilities. A lot of political yard signs have disappeared overnight—especially those of the losers.

Some of the winners have already taken down their signs because they were cagey enough not to put a date on them. Those signs will be stored safely for the next campaign.

Many car owners are out today futilely trying to scrape off political bumper stickers. They never warn you those things are made to last forever.

And then there are the winner's bumper stickers that we will see until the next election, especially on the cars of favor seekers and job hunters.

Capitan's championship drive stopped by Tatum






