Jefferson not guilty

Gregory N. Jefferson was found not guilty of the charges of residential burglary following a two-day trial in district court in Carrizozo last week.

A petit jury panel of seven women and five men deliberated slightly more than three hours before coming to a decision.

The alleged incident happened on or about Aug. 28, 1988.

Petit jury to be formed on Feb. 13

District Judge Richard Parsons will empanel a new petit jury at 10 a.m. Feb. 13. The term for the petit jury will be six months.

Any prospective juror who received a notice in the mail may qualify before Feb. 13 by going to the district court office in the Lincoln County Courthouse in Carrizozo weekdays from 8 a.m. to 12 noon or 1 to 5 p.m.

The petit jury hears criminal and civil cases that are to be heard before a jury.

2 arrests on DWI charges

Lincoln County Sheriff James McSwane reported two men were arrested on Jan. 28.

Steve Woods was arrested and charged with careless driving and DWI, 2nd or subsequent offense. Woods is held in jail at this time. Bond has been set at \$1,090, no 10 percent allowed.

Thomas Montoya of Roswell was arrested and charged with DWI, 2nd or subsequent offense, revoked license and reckless driving. The charges stemmed from an alleged hit and run incident on Highway 70 in the Hondo Valley. There were no injuries.

Montoya was released on \$1,700 bond.

Hondo Basin water dispute

Judge denies Mescalero claim to water rights

Retired Supreme Court Justice LaFel Oman of Santa Fe handed down a decision in the Mescalero water suit Jan. 26. He ruled that the Mescalero Tribe is not entitled to 17,931.7 acre-feet of water a year as sought from the Hondo basin.

Oman's decision will provide the tribe with 1,372.4 acre-feet of water annually for existing uses and 950 acre-feet annually for growth. An acre-foot of water is 325,851 gallons, or the amount of water it takes to cover one acre to a depth of one foot.

The decision will not radically affect the existing stream flows or the use of water by non-Indian users along the three valleys or the municipal supplies of the communities in the Hondo Drain System.

The Water Defense Association is "extremely pleased with the decision," according to Hubert Quintana, executive director of the WDA. "Our position all along has been that there is enough water in the stream systems for all entities in the litigation to reasonably share without creating a severe hardship on each other."

Quintana went on to say, "We put our faith in our judicial system, and even though we were not nearly as well financed as the United States and Tribe, we were able to prevail. It's nice to know that the little guy can still win."

The WDA was formed in 1986 to protect the interests of the stream system's non-Indian water rights holders. The association has spent \$500,000 in the case to represent 400 water rights holders, valley irrigators, Lincoln County, Chaves County, and the municipalities of Capitan, Roswell, Ruidoso, and Ruidoso Downs.

The United States represented the Mescalero Tribe in the water suit.

WDA President Phelps Anderson said, "The decision is fair, because it provides adequate water to meet everyone's needs. It allows the United States and the Tribe all of the water they are presently using for municipal, commercial, industrial, recreational, domestic and agricultural purposes plus 950 acre feet of water for future non-agricultural growth needs."

State Representative Ben Hall said he was pleased with the decision and added, "I would hope the Mescalero Tribe will abide by Judge Oman's decision, because from what I understand he put a lot of effort and brought a just decision for all parties involved."

A statement has not been made as to whether an appeal of the case may be filed.

EPA discusses mill site cleanup plans

Ellen Greeney, Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) community relations, and Rosemary Glenn, geologist with Jacobs Engineering Group, were in Carrizozo this week to meet with citizens and answer questions about the Superfund study of the Cimarron Mill site near Carrizozo.

The mill site was added to the Superfund National Priorities List (NPL) because of potentially hazardous waste materials that were found at the site in 1984.

Greeney told about the Superfund Technical Assistance Grant that will be available. One grant of up to \$50,000 may be obtained by a concerned citizen group with the funds to be used for payments to technical advisors and services such as reviewing site-related documents, meeting with the recipient group to explain technical information, providing assistance to the grant recipient in communicating the groups site-related concerns, and disseminating interpretations of technical information to the community.

The funds may not be used to develop new information, take new samples or have new testing of the samples. Greeney said the grant would have to last for the lifetime of the project.

MORE BARRELS ARE FOUND

Two barrels containing a hydraulic oil based substance were discovered in Lincoln County on Highway 54 under a culvert near mile marker 138. Neither of the 55-gallon drums was leaking.

The barrels were removed from the scene and investigation continues into their ownership.

The investigation and feasibility study by EPA will take 18 months to two years. Before the study begins, EPA will hold an Open House in the area to explain where the samples will be taken and why, and to display the protective clothing that will be worn by the workers while taking the samples.

The entire cleanup process could take several years, depending on the results of the tests of the samples that will be taken.

Greeney said the public will be informed and the EPA encourages the residents of the community to become involved with each step of the Superfund process.

Child abuse charges under investigation

The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office has received complaints alleging child abuse in Carrizozo Elementary School.

The matter was investigated and all information submitted to the district attorney's office for further action.

No charges have been filed at this time.

Mrs. Linda King, a single parent and mother of J. King, 13, a 6th grader, told the NEWS yesterday that the Jan. 18 incident involves her son and two other teenagers who were playing a game called "Smear the Queer" on school grounds. She said the game was broken up and Mel Holland, principal of the elementary school, spanked all three with a board that caused bruises and broken skin on all three children. Mrs. King said she notified city police, and that

School Board elections Tuesday for 5 districts

School board elections will be held Feb. 7.

Lincoln County voters will have their choice from 28 candidates for the 10 school board slots open in the five school districts in the county.

Each school district has two board positions to fill, each for a term of four years. Voters will be allowed to cast one vote for each position.

Capitan voters will also have a question on their ballots about the issuance of general obligation bonds, not to exceed \$1,825,000, for the purpose of erecting a middle school and/or remodeling,

making additions to and furnishing school buildings and purchasing or improving school grounds or any combination of these purposes, said bonds to be payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold at such time or times upon such terms and conditions as the board may determine.

The polls in all precincts will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Rabies clinics are set

Rabies vaccination clinics will be held in Lincoln County on Saturday, Feb. 4.

The cost is \$5 per animal. The clinics are sponsored by the Carrizozo Animal Clinic.

State law requires rabies vaccinations for all dogs and cats over three months of age with yearly booster vaccinations.

A rabies outbreak was declared in the Carrizozo area last August when a county resident was attacked and bitten by an unvaccinated cat. A fox exhibiting unusual behavior was captured in the same vicinity 24 hours later. Both animals tested positive for rabies.

All dogs and cats, especially those outside municipalities, are required to have the rabies vaccination.

The clinic will be in Ancho from 11:15 to 11:30 a.m.; Corona from 12:30 to 1:15; at the El Paso Natural Gas Station from 1:30 to 1:45; in Carrizozo from 2:30 to 4 p.m.; and in Nogal from 4:15 to 4:30.

City dog tags will be available in Carrizozo at the clinic.

In case of bad weather, the clinic will be postponed one week.

Corona girl earns chance at \$25,000

Callie Gnatkowski, a 7th grade student at Corona, won the school's geography bee and a chance at a \$25,000 college scholarship.

The school level bee, where students answered oral questions on geography, was the first round in the new National Geography Bee that is being sponsored by National Geographic World, the Society's magazine for children.

The bee was kicked off the week of Jan. 9 in thousands of schools around the United States and in four territories. The school winners, including Callie, will now take a written test; up to 100 of the top scorers in each state will be eligible to compete in their state bee April 7.

The National Geographic Society will fly all first-place winners from the state bees, along with their teacher escorts, to Washington, DC, to participate in the National Geography Bee finals on May 18 and 19. The 1st-place national winner will receive a \$25,000 college scholarship; the 2nd-place winner, a \$15,000 scholarship; and the 3rd-place winner, a \$10,000 scholarship.

The bee featured questions on the broad subject of geography—the study of the earth and its inhabitants. All the questions could be answered with a word or a simple phrase.

Residents urged to protest congressional pay raise

"Write your congressmen and tell them if they're going to vote for a pay raise, then you want a roll call vote," advised Rhonda Johnston, speaking to the January meeting of Federated Republican Women of Lincoln County at the Inn-Credible Restaurant in Alto.

Johnston, who is legislative chairman for FRWLC, recently attended a seminar in Washington, DC. There she heard US Cong. Joe Skeen, US Sen. Pete Domenici, assistant chief of staff for the Republican National Committee Tony Likens, and others.

It was Likens who advised Johnston's group that many members of Congress favored voting for the 50 percent pay raise in committee where individual opinions would be blurred, rather than roll call where it would be a matter of public record who voted for it.

Skeen was quoted on TV recently that he favored a roll call vote and that his constituency agreed. A telephone survey in USA TODAY found that 94 percent of the respondents also favored a roll call vote. "Write to your representatives," advised Johnston. "It's the only way they're going to know how we feel. I have addresses," she

added.

As legislative chairman, Johnston brings items of state and national legislation to FRWLC who then contact appropriate legislators. "Right now, bailing out savings and loans is at the top of the administration's priority list, followed by nuclear waste and tax hikes. Recovery of the oil-producing states is on the bottom of the list. We need to inform Congress how we feel about these issues."

RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION OF REGULAR SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION AND SCHOOL BOND ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Captain Municipal School District No. 28 (herein the "Board" and the "District," respectively), in the County of Lincoln and State of New Mexico, has determined that a Regular School District Election and School Bond Election, (herein, the "Election") be held on February 7, 1989, pursuant to Sections 1-22-1 through 1-22-19 NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that two (2) positions on the Board are to be filled at such Election by submitting to the qualified electors of the District the names of candidates qualified to appear on the ballot for election to the positions to be filled; and

WHEREAS, the persons who desire to fill such positions on the Board shall be required to file declarations of candidacy or declarations of intent to be a write-in candidate, all in accordance with Sections 1-22-1 et seq., NMSA 1978; and

WHEREAS, the Board of the District has determined upon its own initiative to submit to a vote at said Election, the question of the issuance of its general obligation bonds in the maximum amount and for the purpose hereinafter specified, as permitted by Section 22-18-2B NMSA 1978, and the Bond Election Act; and

WHEREAS, neither the bond question herein submitted nor any other bond question has been defeated by the voters of the District at a bond election held within a period of two years from the date of the Election hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CAPTAIN MUNICIPAL SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 28 CONSTITUTING THE GOVERNING BOARD OF SAID DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF LINCOLN AND STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. On the 7th day of February, 1989, there will be held in the Captain Municipal School District No. 28, Lincoln County, New Mexico, a regular school district election for the purpose of submitting names of candidates for the positions to be filled on the Board to the qualified electors of the District and for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the District the question of creating a debt by the issuing of general obligation bonds.

Section 2. There shall be one Voting District for this Election consolidating all of the general election precincts in the District, with the polling place to be as follows: Lincoln County Fair Building, Captain, New Mexico.

In addition, there will be an Absentee Voter District established, as described in Section 10 herein.

Section 3. The polls for said election will be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on the day of the Election.

Section 4. At such Election, the following at-large positions on the Board shall be filled by the qualified electors of the District, to-wit:

Position 1; for a four-year term starting March 1, 1989; and Position 2; for a four-year term starting March 1, 1989.

Section 5. A declaration of candidacy for membership on the Board to be filled at the Election shall be filed with the County Clerk of Lincoln County, the proper filing officer, during the period commencing at 9:00 a.m., December 20, 1988, being the third Tuesday in December, and ending at 5:00 p.m. on the same day, pursuant to Section 1-22-7, NMSA 1978.

Section 6. In making a declaration of candidacy, the candidate shall submit a sworn statement of intent in substantially the form provided in Section 1-22-3, NMSA 1978.

Section 7. A person who desires to be a write-in candidate for membership on the Board at such Election shall file with the County Clerk of Lincoln County a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate before 5:00 p.m. on January 3, 1989, being the thirty-fifth day preceding the date of the election.

Section 8. At such Election, the following question shall be submitted to such qualified, registered electors of the District:

RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION OF REGULAR SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION AND SCHOOL BOND ELECTION

one series or more, in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$1,825,000, for the purpose of erecting a middle school and/or remodeling, making additions to and furnishing school buildings and purchasing or improving school grounds or any combination of these purposes, said bonds to be payable from general (ad valorem) taxes and to be issued and sold at such time or times upon such terms and conditions as the Board may determine.

Section 9. A person is a qualified elector of the District if he or she is a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age on the day of the Election and a resident of the District on the day of the Election. In order to vote, qualified electors of the District must have previously registered with the County Clerk of Lincoln County in accordance with law. Any qualified elector of the District who is not now registered and who wishes to vote at such Election should register during regular office hours prior to 5:00 p.m. on January 10, 1989, being the twenty-eighth day immediately preceding the Election at the office of the County Clerk of Lincoln County, at the County Courthouse in Carrizozo, New Mexico, or at the office of any deputy registration officer appointed by the County Clerk of Lincoln County (which may include the municipal clerks of all municipalities in Lincoln County).

Section 10. Absentee voting will be permitted in the manner authorized by 1-6-1 et seq. NMSA 1978, provided, however, that pursuant to Section 1-22-19 NMSA 1978, qualified electors may also vote absentee in person at the office of the County Clerk of Lincoln County during the regular hours and days of business from 8:00 a.m., January 13, 1989, being the twenty-fifth day preceding the Election, until 5:00 p.m., February 3, 1989, being the Friday immediately prior to the date of the Election.

Section 11. Voting shall be by voting machine, except for absentee voting which shall be by paper ballot. At least one voting machine shall be used at the polling place for each Voting District.
