Minzner told lawmăkere during this year's legislative session that if they gave him collections he enhance tax collections, he could bring in and local revenue. The Legislature thought that sounded like a good idea and gave Minzer $\$ 2$ million to raise an additional $\$ 10$ million. And lawmakers said if Minzner didn't recover at least the $\$ 2$ milion cost of the program, theyd take it out

A HAZARDOUS MATERIALS team from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency moves
dirt and ore rrom settlement tanks at the Cimarron Mill Superfund site near Carrizozo Crews
were moving the materials so Bureau of Reclamation drillers can put down wells to begin the
clean-up process at the site the last week of August or first week of October. The materials
will be containerized and movedto a hazardous materials dump, probabby ir Texas, EPAofi-
cial said. The mill was designated as a Superfund site because of cyanide contamination in
the shallow groundwater underlying the immediate site. Plans are to pump the water from the
aquifer into the Carrizozo sewer system for treatment. A public meeting is tentatively set
sometime in October.
