Stay indoors during the
If you-must go outside, several layers of lightweight clothing will keep you warmer than a single heavy coat. Gloves (or mit loss of body a hat will prevent your mouth to protect your lungs.
Understand the hazards of wind chill, which combines the cooling effect of wind and cold temperatures on exposed skin. As the wind increases, heat is carried away from a perated rate, driving down the body temperature.
Walk carefully on snowy. icy sidewalks.
After the storm, if you shovel snow, be extremely careful. It is physically strenuous work, so talke frequent breaks. Avoid verexertion.
Avoid traveling by car in Have emergency supplies in the trunk.

Keep your car's gas tank full for emergency use and to keep the fuel line from freezing.

Let sompone know your destination. your route, and when you expect to arrive. If your car gets stuck along the way. hepcan bermined route
If you do get atuck:
stay with your car. Do not try top walk to enfety. Tie a brightly colored cloth (preferably red) to the antenna for reacuers to see Start the car and use the heater for about 10 min utes every hour. Keep the exhaut pipe clear so the car. the car
oneave the overhead tigh on when the engine is ran seen. As you stit, keep mov ing your arms and legs 20 keep blood circulating and to stay warm.
