

# Absentee Voting Underway for Special Election

A state-wide special election is being held on Tuesday, September 23 to consider two amendments to the New Mexico Constitution that have to do with public education.

Absentee voting for the special election began Tuesday, August 26 on paper ballots at the county

clerk's office in the Lincoln County Courthouse in Carrizozo. Since

Wednesday, Sept. 3, absentee voting at the clerk's office is being done on the new electronic voting machines during regular business hours of 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. The clerk's office also will be open from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Satur-

day, Sept. 20 for absentee in person voting.

Absentee in person voting on the electronic machines at the Ruidoso satellite poll begins at 10 a.m. on Saturday, September 6. The satellite poll will be located in the Ruidoso Senior Center at 501 Junction Road. Hours for the satellite poll will be 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Satur-

days, September 6, September 13 and September 20, and 12 noon to 8 p.m. on Tuesday through Friday until Friday, September 19.

Registered voters who wish to vote absentee by mail may request an application for absentee ballot by calling the Lincoln County Clerk's office at 648-2394 or toll free 1-800-

687-2705. Voters who wish to take this option are encouraged to call for application for absentee ballot as soon as possible.


The special election for two constitutional amendments will be Tuesday, September 23. Polls will be open from 7

## Carrizozo Applies for Airport Grant

Carrizozo trustees gave the green light to apply for a \$450,000 grant for airport improvements.

At an emergency meeting held August 27, trustees Eileen Lovelace, Wes Lindsay and LeeRoy Zamora unanimously approved the Aviation Grant Application Resolution that authorized the mayor to sign the \$450,000 grant application for airport improvements. Trustee Tommy Guevara was absent attending the New Mexico Municipal League annual conference being held in Farmington.

The grant application was due August 29, town clerk Leann Weihbrecht told *THE NEWS*. "We got the application signed by the mayor and mailed before deadline," Weihbrecht said.

Grant money will come from federal and state aviation funds. The town will have to provide a \$5,000 match if it is awarded the grant.

The aviation grant application seeks funding for airport runway upgrades,

runway lights, fencing and other airport improvements at the Carrizozo Municipal Airport.

Weihbrecht said the town is working with an engineer who helped with the grant application. Weihbrecht said she did not know when the grants will be awarded.

## Picacho Bridge Move To Ranch Museum Proceeds

There has been no opposition to the proposal to move the old green bridge at Picacho to the New Mexico Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum in Las Cruces.

With no opposition, Lincoln County will enter into an agreement with the Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum to move the bridge to the museum grounds in Las Cruces at no cost to the county.

Lincoln County Commissioners at their August 19 meeting held a public hearing to explore alternatives to the museum's proposal to move the old once green bridge across the Hondo River at Picacho to the museum grounds near Las Cruces. The hearing to consider all alternatives for the bridge was a requirement of the New Mexico Historic Preservation Division (HPD) and state statute 18-8-7 that governs the preservation of significant prehistoric or historic sites.

There were no objections to the proposed move voiced during the hearing

on August 19, and no objections to the proposed move were received during the 15 day comment period following the county commission hearing.


The Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum paid for the legal advertisement for the public hearing, Stewart said.

Since September 2000, when county commissioners first approved the proposal to move the bridge to the museum, the Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum has been attempting to get funding for the move. Stewart said during his introduction to the public hearing.

On July 16, 2003, Mac Harris, director of the Farm and Ranch Heritage Museum, Stewart, and county commissioner Earl Hobbs met with Kak Slick, a representative of the HPD, to discuss the proposed move, Stewart said. At that time Slick informed them about the state statutes involving preservation of historic sites. As a result, county commissioners held the

a.m. to 7 p.m. at normal polling places.

Voters who are unsure of their polling place can refer to their voter registration cards issued by the Lincoln County Clerk.

Constitutional Amendment 1 proposes to transfer the state department of education to a cabinet department headed by a secretary of public education appointed by the governor and creates an elected public education commission.

Constitutional Amendment 2 proposes to allow limited additional distribution of money from the permanent education trust fund to provide more money for public schools. THE NEWS will feature the League of Women Voters' analysis of the constitutional amendments in its Sept. 11 issue.

Voters who did not vote in the 2002 general election and who do not vote in the special election may have their voter registration moved to an inactive list.



*Sell the Golf Course?*

Many people wonder why the town is proposing this action and they have other questions about whether the water rights will be sold to the new owners, and how many water rights will be transferred, and if the recent annexation of the golf course has anything to do with this previously unannounced decision to sell the golf course.

Inquiries by the public may or may not be answered, but if you want to know why the town is disposing of assets you may want to attend the town council meeting Tuesday at 6 p.m. and ask those questions. Instead of waiting until after the dastardly deed is done, get involved now and ask.

Disclosing to the public in advance would have been far better than to suddenly announce the town will begin the process to sell the golf course. Town officials do NOT own the golf course, the public owns it and the public should have opportunity to be heard before a decision is made.

Even if you do not golf, have never played golf and have no intentions of playing golf, you are probably aware that the golf course has been owned by the town for many years and should continue to be owned by the town. Many people do not swim at the town owned swimming pool but they do realize the swimming pool is a valuable asset. Will the town begin the process to sell the swimming pool next?

Numerous reasons could be given for selling both the golf course and the swimming pool and possibly for selling the recreation center, also, but that doesn't make it right. Is the town in the process of eliminating assets for a hidden reason, or will full explanations be given to the public that officials were elected to represent and should be serving?

Apparently present elected officials don't care that their names will be remembered for selling the golf course, but years ago an elected official proudly stated he did not want to be remembered as being responsible for selling certain antique furniture that had been used in city hall for years. He put the quietus on selling an old antique roll top desk.

Gnawing questions continue to be asked by residents, and we do hope they will ask these questions at the town council meeting and that these questions will be answered.

Evidently someone is aware that the golf course could be a money maker and they are willing to expend the time necessary to bring the golf course back up to top condition.

Neglecting to keep the golf course in good condition may be the reason given by officials to want to sell it, but a better solution would be to retain ownership and work on it.

Different answers may be given Tuesday by officials.

Another question is whether town limits go eight miles east of town. The blue town police car with an officer in uniform was parked there at 2:25 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 26.



**INSIDE THE CAPITOL**

**SANTA FE** -- The campaign for Constitutional Amendments 1 and 2 has begun. In late July, a mailing in support of the education amendments was sent statewide, followed by a TV ad campaign in late August. Articles in opposition to the amendments began in early June and TV ads may have started by the time you read this. The election is September 23.

The campaign for the amendments is being funded by a political action committee called New Mexico Citizens for Accountability and Reform in Education (N.M.C.A.R.E.'s). The PAC's co-chairmen are Gov. Bill Richardson and former Gov. Garrey Carruthers. The treasurer is Larry Willard, president of Wells Fargo banks in New Mexico and a frequently-mentioned Republican gubernatorial candidate last year.

Organizations that have endorsed the amendments include the New Mexico Association of Commerce and Industry, several local chambers of commerce, The New Mexico Retail Association, the Independent Insurance Agents, the New Mexico Business Roundtable, the state-American Association of Retired Persons and the Albuquerque Economic Forum.

Those opposing the amendments include the state Republican Party, the state land commissioner and two Democrat state senators. The state GOP and Land Commissioner pay Lyons, the only statewide elected Republican official, are both raising money to fight the amendments.

Lyons has come in for some criticism because he is soliciting oil and gas companies that he regulates. Sens. Tim Jennings of Roswell and Michael Sanchez of Belen says that although they will vote against the amendments, they will not campaign against them.

The state GOP executive committee vote against the amendment was 21-3, indicating some very strong partisan opposition. Nevertheless, Gov. Richardson has been able to pick off important Republican support, including Sen. Pete Domenici, former Gov. Carruthers, former Congressman Manuel Lujan and former state GOP Chairman Ed Lujan.

The vote of the ACI Board of Directors in support of the amendments was 52-4, indicating strong support from business community leaders. The ACI serves essentially as the state Chamber of Commerce. Richardson has

been active in the wooing of business groups since the beginning of his campaign.

Amendment #1, proposing to create a secretary of education under the governor hasn't created much controversy, except from current elected state Board of Education members. There are some good reasons to vote against it, but Gov. Richardson's enthusiasm about improving education may carry the day among voters willing to give him the opportunity.

Amendment #2 is much more controversial because it deals with money, big money, and money from something called the Permanent School Fund. Opponents say the proposal to increase the annual distribution from the fund from 4.7 percent to 5.8 percent for the next several years constitutes a "raid" on the permanent fund that will slow its growth and possibly even dip into the corpus of the fund. The more hysterical opponents even claim it will "bust" the fund.

Proponents note that the permanent school fund is projected to earn 8.2 percent over the next 20 years. That is enough to provide the additional school money while the fund grows from its current \$6.5 billion to \$14.5 billion. If the additional money isn't take out, the fund would grow to \$16.3 billion.

The 8.2 percent projection is considered conservative since the fund has grown 9.8 percent over the last 14 years. Safeguards also are built in so that if the fund doesn't perform as expected, the distribution will be scaled back. Also, the Legislature, by a three-fifth vote, can stop the additional annual distribution at any time.

Actually, it shouldn't be necessary for us to go through this amending process. We elect legislators to make such decisions and shouldn't have all the extraneous material that appears in our constitution. But it seems lawmakers don't trust themselves. They are the ones who asked us to approve the restrictions to begin with.

## WEST NILE VIRUS INFORMATION and SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

### GENERAL GUIDELINES

The NM Dept. of Health (DOH) is closely monitoring the spread of West Nile Virus throughout a large portion of New Mexico, including Lincoln County. Over the past several weeks West Nile Virus has been linked to four human fatalities in New Mexico, and multiple cases of animal infections, which have resulted in one equine death in Lincoln County.

According to the State Epidemiologist, "In people, West Nile Virus can cause flu-like symptoms such as fever, nausea, headache, and muscle aches. In most cases, people who are infected never become sick or have only very mild symptoms for a few days. However, the virus can, in rare cases, cause encephalitis and death if someone feels they have the flu and are feeling sick, they should see their health care provider. The elderly are at most risk for serious disease from West Nile Virus."

The virus usually spread by way of the mosquito, which serves as a host and carrier. The virus also affects animals (pets, horses, livestock, etc.) and birds (varieties belonging to the Crow family (Ravens, Jays, Crows, etc.) are most susceptible). Individuals should take precautions when handling dead animals.

### GENERAL PRECAUTIONS

- \* Stay indoors at dawn, dusk, and in the early morning.
- \* Wear long-sleeved shirts, long pants, and socks whenever you are outdoors.
- \* Use insect repellent products with no more than 35% DEET for adults and follow the directions on the label for children ages 2-12.
- \* Do not allow water to stagnate in old tires, flowerpots, trash containers, swimming pools, birdbaths, pet bowls, etc.

## Southwest Briefs

Albuquerque will be a mecca for approximately 1,500 cattlemen from over the state and nation Jan. 10, 11 and 12, when the annual state conventions of the State Livestock Growers Association and American National Livestock Association convene here. The New Mexico Cattle and Wool Growers Association will meet on Jan. 10 and the American National on Jan. 11 and 12.

Total property taxes levied in New Mexico for the present fiscal year show a decrease of nearly \$1,200,000 under the 1932 levy, according to figures compiled by the State Taxpayers' Association. Their figures show the levy this year is \$9,629,204. Tax commission records show they levy last year was \$10,818,570. This decrease in the total levy for all purposes, including state, county, city and schools, was made despite a drop of some \$30,000,000 in the total assessed valuation of the state.

Gov. A. W. Hockenull asked people of New Mexico to observe Dec. 10 as "Statewide Holiday Jubilee," with interchange of speakers between towns, decoration of business districts, selection of district winners and a more friendly spirit. With buying and selling and trading in active force those three days, he said, a million dollars could be put into circulation. Discounts on payment of old bills, special sales and other inducements by merchants and traders were suggested by the governor.

Winter sports in the southwest may sound strange to some, but nevertheless, Albuquerqueans are making plans for a ski club and a toboggan slide in the Sandia mountains to the east of here as soon as the next heavy snow falls in the mountains. The Sandia Ski Club has already been organized and is preparing two ski slides and a toboggan slide in the mountains, about twenty-five miles from Albuquerque. Both will be accessible by fine mountain roads.

Charles E. Collins of Kit Carson, Colo., president of the American National Livestock Association, in a statement issued in Albuquerque recently, declared "things in the agriculture are going from bad to worse and agriculture continues to be the sick man of America's economic household, even though beneficial effects of the President's recovery program are being felt in other industries."
